These members proactively tackle anti-social behaviour across the Mountjoy District.</p> <p>The Community Response Team has 4 Gardai. They are tasked with tackling hotspot areas as they arise. This response method allows for an area to be targeted, and when persons are identified and issues decrease, community engagement takes place, such as working with local groups.</p>

		<p>Operation Saul- Public Transport</p> <p>High Visibility Proactive Patrolling and Days of Action alongside LUAS & Irish Rail inspectors</p>		<p>The Divisional Community Policing Office continues to forward any emails regarding issues in the area so Gardaí can address same.</p> <p>Particular attention is focused on the Cabra Luas stop and its surroundings (Mount Bernard Park) targeting anti-social behaviour with both high visibility and plain clothes patrols carried out. Gardai continue to carry out joint patrols with Gardaí from the Bridewell and Cabra stations along with Transdev staff on the Luas line & stops from Broombridge to Dominick Street.</p> <p>Days of action also carried out on Dublin Bus and with Irish Rail inspectors at Drumcondra station. 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		<p>Operation Irene- Targeting anti-social behaviour in our public spaces.</p>	<p>Operation Irene is a summertime initiative where the warmer weather, longer evenings and school holidays can bring an increase of public order offences and anti-social behaviour, having a substantial impact on the quality of life of residents. A number of hotspots are targeted throughout the district mainly outdoor public spaces. High visibility proactive patrolling is focused on areas such as Shandon Park, the Royal Canal Bank, Blessington Basin, Mount Bernard Park etc.</p> <p>Youths gathering at Lock 6 on the Royal Canal in June generated a large number of complaints. As part of Operation Irene a plan was put in place to target the area, engage with the youths and to liaise with the residents in the area. The instances of anti-social behaviour were greatly reduced with some positive feedback from other canal users.</p>
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				Operation Irene is on-going throughout the summer months, June, July & August.

In Q2 2022 there was an increase of personnel in this unit, which is having a positive impact with more members available to target drug dealing across the Division. A number of search operations were put in place and a significant amount of drugs were seized from addresses in the Cabra areas. A number of individuals were arrested and prosecutions are pending. These are intelligence led operations including referrals from vigilant members of the community

				<p>Locally the Community Response Team (CRT) target issues in the area as they become aware of same. Community Engagement members are often provided with information by residents and this is passed to CRT for action. CRT liaise with the Divisional Drugs Unit for targeted operations. For example, the issues with throw overs into the Prison from the Canal at Phibsboro. This is targeted by the team with plain clothes patrols and working closely with the Prison Authorities. The team continue to target known hotspots, such as the Basin area, and individuals.</p>

The LEAR program aims to identify individuals who are coming to the attention of Gardai and are suffering with addiction issues. The program aims to work with Gardai to help identify individuals who may be suitable and they provide the supports to help addiction and other needs</p>
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				<p>such as housing or accessing different services. Through agreement LEAR and Gardai can work together in assessing the progress of the individual.</p> <p>Gardaí attended the clean-up day and family fun day organised by the Iona District Residents Association area in June. The Community Support Vehicle was on hand along with the An Garda Síochána mounted unit. Gardai provided crime prevention advice and carried out bike marking for the local residents. The Community Support vehicle is also regularly deployed to busy areas, such as Phibsboro, Cabra shops etc. for members of the community to engage with Gardai. Gardaí will assist if any matters are brought to their attention and manpower is available.</p>

Call backs are performed within 7 days to the victim to ensure they are ok and provide advice regarding orders and support services etc. The 1st Quarter of this year saw the introduction of a Risk Evaluation Tool (RET) used by Gardai when speaking with the victims of Domestic Violence. In the U district, these incidents are reviewed each morning at the PAF</p>

				<p>meetings and actions assigned. These incidents are also risk assessed by members in the station under the Domestic Abuse Coordinator (DAC) system.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <p>• Burglaries Burglaries are reviewed at the morning PAF meetings. Burglary scenes are examined by local forensic teams, the area will be canvassed for CCTV and statements will be taken. Investigations are monitored by the supervisor of the Garda investigating.</p> <p>• Victim support The Division has a Crime Victim Support office which updates victims with details of their case. Members of Community Policing are also forwarded call backs to victims of crime. This allows members to offer advice or provide contact information to their stakeholders. There are separate call back</p>
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				<p>procedures for victims of Domestic Abuse.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Case management of offenders SAOR is in operation in the U District and consolidates the management of adult and youth offenders through the introduction of a strategic approach to offender recidivism. AGS holistically manage the court cases, charges, bail conditions, interagency liaison and inform AGS how it is being managed. This has proved successful in the U District to date. • Blue Bike Initiative The blue bike initiative is a brightly coloured bike with Garda signage warning would be thieves that that the area is being monitored by Gardai. The blue bike will be placed in hotspot areas to deter bike theft and other anti-social behaviour.

DCC Clampers/NTA will also assist as they have in the past.</p>
