

MINUTES OF THE CLIMATE ACTION, ENVIRONMENT AND ENERGY STRATEGIC POLICY COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON 6th SEPTEMBER 2023

1. Dublin City Council Draft Climate Action Plan 2024 - 2029

Member raised the following questions in relation to the report that was circulated

- Commended the report because it is easily accessible and concise (CM)
- Any indication when we might start to see some EV charging infrastructure (CM)
- 20 Mw of energy generated in the City. Does this factor in what households are able to achieve or is it what we can generate via DCC infrastructure **(CM)**
- We have to get bags off the streets (CM)
- There is no target given on waste reduction (CM)
- When will the pilot of the underground waste collection system tale place (CM)
- Many of the actions are being delivered in silos, is there an overarching strategy to break this. **(CM)**
- There was over topping in Clontarf recently but the flood defence measures are not in place, there needs to be more urgency (DC)
- Planning permission should not be granted without some form of micro power generating (DC)
- Welcome the plan and we should get it out to consultation as soon as possible (NOM)
- Flood defences must be at the highest level in the plan, should be front and centre in the Resilient City piece(NOM)
- Can the Community Climate Action Officer's role be explained (AG)
- How will the emissions from incineration, waste water and producing water be captured (RM)
- How does the plan mesh/ nest or act subservient to the Devt Plan (and Planning policy in particular)? (SS)
- What is the timeline for public consultation & what is the nature of the proposed awareness-raising campaign - traditionally media, social media, and spokespeople? (JL)
- Will there be a target to increase tree canopy (TC)
- Has any consideration been given to leafletting transport hops (CS)
- What will be the role of the SPC in the roll out of the plan (CB)
- Can the DZs be moved into separate appendix
- Difference between DZs and resilient inner city
- Can members their networks to get the plan out to the public (CB)

Tony Flynn & Sabrina Dekker responded

- The Capital Programme has been reviewed and agreed with Finance a new flag will identify when a project is a climate related project and the level of finance being invested by DCC
- The 4 DLA's are almost ready to issue the tender for stage 2 of the EV charging strategy which will result in 250 charging points being installed.
- The bag bin scheme is working well and we hope to announce the first bag free city soon which can be replicated throughout the city
- The Senior Management Team are removing barriers to combat projects operating in silos
- We are endeavouring to speed au the delivery of projects
- We will make the flood defence element stronger
- We will circulate the structure of the Climate Action Office
- The Community Climate Action Officer will support local communities with climate action initiatives they may have. He will also manage the Climate Action Grant fund
- The Community Climate Action Officer will present to the next meeting of the SPC
- Incineration does not have a fossil fuel footprint
- Irish Water will be reporting on water emissions
- Public consultation will run from 15th September 2023 2nd November, there will be a number of public engagement events, e.g. Eat the Streets and a joint event will be held in the Mansion House with other Dublin Local Authorities.
- We will hold local events in libraries.
- We'll be pushing the plan out on social media and national press
- We intend to increase the tree canopy, it is difficult to quantify
- We will be advertising as much as possible.
- Periodic progress reports will issue to the SPC
- The resilient inner city is in place where as the DZs are in their infancy
- We are looking at how the DZs are highlighted in the plan
