
HOPE Recovery Run



Mountjoy Basketball Trojans 3x3

Mountjoy Park was host to the 3rd annual 3x3 basketball tournament in September. The day saw teams enter from all over the country including Kerry, Cork, and Belfast. Over 250 players entered the competition which offered boys and girls teams from u/12 all the way up to senior level. A state of the art basketball court is transported into Mountjoy Square for the day. The event is run in partnership with the NEIC and Basketball Ireland



L.I.F.E. Sport & Rec Course

L.I.F.E. (Learning In Football Environments) is a QQI Level 4 + 5 Sport and Recreation course hosted by the National College of Ireland. L.I.F.E is delivered by staff from North Wall Community Development Project. We have now entered a valuable partnership with the NEIC. L.I.F.E is a Local Training Initiative (LTI) and focused on community based education.

Both courses consist of 8 different QQI modules which offer different insights into the sports industry and work environment. External qualifications are delivered throughout the year including FAI badges, RLSS Lifeguarding and ITEC gym instruction.

Our QQI Level 5 course provides access to valuable CAO points, if learners achieve the overall major award end of term. Our course is powered by Bohemian F.C. with learners gaining a valuable insight into their professional sporting environment throughout the year. Bohs provide multiple guest speakers throughout the year, as well as providing valuable work experience. Our learners also get access to the Bohs training and match days environments.



Intro to Weightlifting

NEIC/DCC introduced weightlifting to the summer change for life programme, and is still on going. This took place in the school gym that has not been used at all in the North East Inner City. It has been sussesful with people been cosisting in going to the classess as well as taking up the sport of weightlifting and been aware of the benefits it has.


Circuit Training

ExWell Medical






Outdoor Summer Fitness Classes

Change for life Programme Summer 2023

The NEIC summer Change for life has finished up after a successful run in July / August 2023. The programme offers over 20 taster activities either free or very low charge to the local NEIC population. This year we have added Walking Football, Handball, weightlifting, and outdoor fitness classes, to the usual favourites



Women on the Move

This programme was designed to interact with a group of women from the Saol Project (SAOL is an integrated programme of education, rehabilitation, advocacy and childcare). The SAOL Project's on-going commitment to the women, children and community members of the North Inner City continues to develop, responding to the changing needs of the women who participate in their project. The woman on the move is helping woman in this particular group to be more active. Some of the woman in this group would not leave their home or interact with other people apart from the time that they are in the Saol programme.

We started the programme with going for walks and using the facilities in the area, like the calisthenics equipment in Mountjoy square and then the Basketball court. The following weeks we went done to the Local gym in Sheriff Street, St. Laurence O'Toole. This is where we really started to build up excitement, they loved it. The NEIC decided to support the group with a one month membership, so they could have a safe place to go to and find an activity that was very beneficial to their health. The Girls in the programme are really enjoying been in the gym and are starting to feel very comfortable. They are even starting to go to the gym by themselves in their own time.

D1 Academy

The D1 academy is a collaboration with The FAI, NEIC and DCC for kids in the NEIC, to play social football without the pressures of been in a team or not been able to play at a leave or standard. Kids will develop in sports at defined stages though out there life's and may not be physical or mentally ready to play at the leave of their particular sport at this present moment. The D1 Academy is to support the kid's development and build their confidence in playing sport, make friends and learn new skills.






Ballybough Youth Service Charity Cycling

Ballybough Youth Service is a place where young people can come in and relax. They work with young people from the age 10 - 24 that live around the area. The cycling programme was put together to support a group of young adults in the service who was plaining a charity cycle, for mental health for men. With months of hard work and dedication they completed the cycle and raised over €1200 in aid of mens mental health.



St Laurence O'Toole Bowls

St Laurence O'Toole Bowls has started a response to a request in the area. We have supplied the equipment and are looking forward to see it develop. The Sheriff Street area is largely populated with older adults, women and men. There is a real need to support this group to be active for many reasons, mental health, and physical health, slow down the ageing processes and to prevent the need for medical treatment.



ACRGCC After Care Recovery Group Cycling Club

With the success of the cycling programme in May, the ACRG group have decided to start a cycling club of their very own. We have been running cycling programmes for the last few months in the inner city and we are at a stage now that we have fifteen people from the aftercare recovery group looking to form a cycling club in the North east inner city. There are people who were previous members to the ACRG that are interested in joining the club when it is formed. This is a great achievement by the group as they will be seen as role models to the community in the North east inner city.





Ozanam House Handball

Summer Camp

The summer programme for Ozanam house started on 3rd July and runs until Friday 11th August. The children that will be catering for are aged between 6 and 11 and they will be split into 2 groups for handball summer camp. This would mean group one would have approx 20 children from 11.30 to 12.30 (aged 6 - 8yrs) and group 2 would have approx 20 children from 1.30pm to 2.30pm (aged 8 to 11yrs). Ozanam House maintain an adult to child ratio of roughly 1:4 and these adults will be there to support the Ozanam House Summer Camp.



Sheriff YC Football Club Yoga Retreat

Martina is a yoga instructor currently offering yoga and meditation to some of the teams of Sheriff YC and to adults in Dublin North East inner city


The NEIC/DCC funded to take 10 of her adult participants on a yoga mindfulness day with Royal Canal Boat Trips

NEIC Community Arts Report to Central Area Committee July – September 2023

The NEIC Community Arts Programme has continued to deliver a range of initiatives this Summer to support the meaningful development of the Arts across the many different communities of the NEIC.

1. Working with local Community Housing

Magic in the Mansions



In July and August of this year the Mary's Mansions Summer Programme took place. Children's Theatre Maker Darren Yorke and Visual Artist Duffy Mooney Shepherd, created a mystery for participating local children by calling to their doors each week and playing with the children on their doorstep, as members of the *Creature Features Detective Agency* they invited the children to help them solve the mystery of the strange creatures that had been spotted around the Mary's Mansions.

Each week, as the children designed and developed their creatures, their stories grew and soon we had fifteen very strange mysteries to solve created by twenty five very clever storytellers aged between four and twelve.





In Autumn 2023 the Community Arts Programme is working with Focus Ireland to deliver a second Community Arts Programme to residents in direct provision accommodation.

2. Development of NEIC Community Arts Strategic Plan:

The Community Arts Programme continued to develop its strategic plan for 2024 - 2027 this Summer. The Process will engage in a final round of consultations with key stakeholders this Autumn. It is hoped to launch the strategic plan in January 2024.

3. Early Years Partnership Programme

The Early Years Residency in partnership with the Hugh Lane continues with Ozanam House this Summer. Parents, Children and Early Childhood Educators, participated in workshops, both in their Early Years Setting and in the Hugh Lane Gallery. The programme has now resumed for the Autumn term.

We are also in the process of developing an Early Years Partnership Programme with the National Concert Hall and Fighting words this Autumn that will involve an additional two NEIC Early Years Settings.



During the Summer we also continued to develop our other Early Years Cultural Partnerships, which includes:

- A three month Early Years Music Residency with St. Louises pre-school in partnership with the NCH.
- A storytelling programme of work with St. Bridids pre-school in partnership with Fighting Words.
- First steps A storytelling programme delivered to two local pre-schools in • partnership with The Gate Theatre.
- Seasons and Stories a drama and storytelling programme exploring the seasons and focusing on the 9 developmental schema. This will be delivered to two settings.
- The Lullaby Project An Intercultural music and storytelling programme for parents • and toddlers with Hill Street FRC.

4. NEIC Community Arts Grant

The Community Arts Grant was advertised in June and received a broad range of applications from schools and groups within the NEIC. Groups were notified in early July as to the outcome of their application.

Grants ranged from €500 - €5000. The following groups were successful in their application.
