		A business Directory is currently being compiled which involves Community Gardaí calling into each business in their SAP area, introducing themselves and collating information that will assist Gardaí in conducting their duties.

		• Halloween		Community Gardaí are arranging meetings with each BWS by end of Q4 in advance of the Christmas period. Halloween —Operation Tombola — In the lead up to Halloween, Gardaí liaise with other stakeholders and Dublin City Council to ensure the safe running of events. Stockpiling of bonfire material is reported and removed, and Gardaí will be present with DCC at all community events in the Bridewell District on Halloween night. This ensured the smooth running of events. In advance of Halloween, Gardaí are visiting schools and giving safety talks to children around the dangers of fireworks and bonfires.
