# Area Housing Report October 2023 Cabra / Glasnevin / NWIC

#### Project Office Annamoe Terrace

With a view to re-opening the projects office and providing a public counter service a number of issues have been identified:

- Staff Resources Assistant Staff Officer started 5/09/23
- Critical Vacancy Request Forms submitted for General Operative Vacancy and Liaison Officer
- Adequate locking mechanisms for all offices works commenced
- Secure interview room with protective screen and two door access works commenced

Civic Maintenance have reviewed the scope of the works and will quote for same: I would also look to upgrade the front of the office in due course.

- Painting and upgrade of the front of building Quotes received Start date to be confirmed
- Planter for front of building Request submitted to Public Domain Officer to source

A full review of the CCTV coverage across the area has commenced: On -going TEC Security to provide a report on the following -

- Number of cameras and locations across the area
- Review of what can be accessed from the Project Office
- Processes and time-frames for requesting footage
- Costings for upgrades / additional monitors / comms room

# Senior Citizen Complexes

A review of the senior citizen complexes is on-going to identify areas for improvement, CCTV, communal areas, lighting and general upgrades, quotes for these works are in progress.

# Dominick Court,

CCTV has been installed with a live feed back to the projects office:

Entrance gates - Quotes have approved for installation of fob access for the vehicular and pedestrian gates and will be implemented in the coming weeks. – works on-going

Lighting - the complex has been listed for lighting upgrading works. This upgrading will exchange the current street lighting to LED lighting.

# St Peter's Court

- All shrubbery and green spaces to be cleaned and cut back completed
- Stairs To be power washed Caretakers supervisor has confirmed this work will be carried out in the coming weeks

• Community Room – to be cleaned, upgraded and brought back in to use – on-going A request for some benches to be installed will be considered following the cleaning and upgrading works.

# **Botanic Avenue Flats**

- External works to garden area rear of senior citizens
- 48m of new footpaths
- Shutter of areas
- Re-pointing of two paving areas

Quotes received and approved, works to commence approx. November 20<sup>th</sup>.

#### Carnlough Road

Large overgrown area at the rear of DCC tenancy, numerous complaints regarding vermin. Works have commence to clear the site and are scheduled for completion on 17<sup>th</sup> November.

#### Canon Burke

This complex is on the Housing Maintenance list for the "Enhanced Works Programme" – start date to be confirmed. The area housing staff will engage with all residents in advance of works commencing. A written request was submitted to Housing Allocations to relocate all remaining seven residents to alternative accommodation on a permanent basis to facilitate the programme of works.

#### St Marys Place North/ Dorset Street Flats

St Marys Place has now been fully de-tenanted and it is projected that the remaining two blocks in Dorset Street will be fully vacated by Q3 2023. The Housing Office has secured all vacated dwellings. Housing Maintenance is currently undertaking an extensive scheme which involves decommissioning and clearing out all units and blocking access to de-tenanted landings. Palisade fencing of the site commenced on August 30<sup>th</sup> 2023, following completion of these works the CCTV cameras will be realigned for maximum coverage of the site. The Housing Delivery / Project Manager for this development is Eileen Martin – eileen.martin@dublincity.ie

Despite extensive engagement and offers of alternative accommodation with an offer of a letter of comfort to return once the site has been re-developed two tenants remain in situ. The Area Housing Manager will be meeting with them on Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> of November to progress the de-tenanting programme.

# O'Devaney Gardens

The works on the access road from North Circular Road to Montpellier Avenue has been concluded, by Barta, and access, from the North Circular Road, to the Montpellier Avenue and Montpellier Close has been reopened. Barta has now moved the road alinement works to the southern end of the complex and walking access to Thor Place will be maintained. This walkway will be opened from 7.30 to 4.45 Monday to Friday to facility school access and addition lighting will be put in place to assist patrons. This traffic restrictions forms part of the emergency road closure (that commenced from 5<sup>th</sup> June for at least six months to allow these

works to take place). The temporary residents-only parking facility remains in place nevertheless public parking for those residents is available on the reopened road. We have been advised that the project timeline is on schedule, for the mixed tenure build, consisting of 1047 units.

# St Finbars Court

Townlink, the appointed contractor, commenced works in May and it is estimated that the project will take 18 months to complete. Enabling and excavation works are progressing. Consultation is ongoing with both DCC and Townlink. # Bannow Road Site

It has been decided that an AHB will develop both social housing and cost rental on the site. More information will be available and consultation will be arranged by mid-2023. Project Estate Officer requested an update 30/8/23 from the Housing Delivery manager, awaiting response

#### Infirmary Road

The Infirmary Road development will consists of 38 units in total located in two blocks, with a mix of 1, 2 and 3 bed apartments and duplexes in both blocks. The development has received Part 8 approval to include the demolition of two buildings on site, which excludes the Married Quarters as there is a preservation order in place for this building. It is expected that work will commence onsite by the end of Q3 2023 subject to completion of tender process and final budget approval from Department of Housing, Planning and Local Government. The project will have an estimated 18 month construction programme and consultation will be taking place with local residents over the coming months.

# **Dunard Court**

The Contractor has begun works in removing the *Washing Walls* in the complex and other ground works. This work has been commissioned to remove the hide areas that have been used for anti-social behaviour in the past. The works should be completed before the end of the month.

#### **Community Development:**

#### Halloween:

Community development staff supported and financially assisted a number of Large and smaller local Halloween Events including:

#### Dunard & Kilalla 31<sup>st</sup> October 2023

Both spaces were transformed into mini Halloween Fairs filled with children's entertainment, family friendly activities, face painting, immersive themed décor and walkabout entertainers. Movie screenings were held at both accompanied by popcorn and cotton candy stalls providing treats. Both were attended in large numbers with many families from the locale and further afield.

A Pumpkin Patch provided a space for family seasonal photos with an opportunity to decorate one and take it home.

Local community representatives acting as stewards volunteered on the day in both areas providing goodie bags and fancy dress prizes. They also encouraged attendees to join the groups we're working with to get involved with future projects and initiatives. The events garnered great interest in community development and active citizenship. The events were very successful and the feedback has been extremely positive from residents and the wider community.







Garda engagement and support was very visible and much appreciated on the day.

# Montpelier Gardens & O'Devaney Gardens Residents 31<sup>st</sup> October

A family friendly event was funded and supported for the residents of Montpelier and O'Devaney Gardens. A DJ, food and fancy dress entertained a large crowd that attended.





### Halloween Baby Party Cabra Library 27th October 2023

A Halloween themed event was held in Cabra Library for new parents and babies 0 – 2yrs. New parents, who are often socially excluded, with young children were encouraged to come along and meet other families with young children to connect and support each other. Structured play, toys, music and food was provided. The event was oversubscribed and very positive with many parents connecting with community for the first time. The event was hosted through the Cabra Family Support Network of which The Community Development Team are active members.



#### Halloween Zombie Run 31<sup>st</sup> October 2023

Aimed at children up to 12 years and their families, a Halloween Zombie run took place at Cabra Parkside Sports Centre. Face Painting, Spooky Photo Booth and goody bags were enjoyed by a large number of children that attended on the day. Three races were held dividing the age groups with everyone taking part receiving a medal. In collaboration with the DCC Sports Officer and DCC Community Staff and supported by Cabra For Youth as members of the Cabra Family Support Network, the event was very well attended and enjoyed by a large number of families and children who dressed in fancy dress for the occasion.



### Halloween Disco 31<sup>st</sup> October 2023

Two Halloween themed Discos were held in Cabra Parkside Centre. One aimed at younger children 10-13 with fancy dress, prizes and food. This was very well attended by local families and also families from the local Direct Provision centre.

A later Disco was held for young adults aged 14 –17 also in an attempt to divert this cohort from anti-social activity and create a safe space for this age group to go on Halloween evening. It was well supported with teenagers popping in and out through the evening. We provided pizzas and treats to encourage social interaction and a welcome space.

#### **Cabra for Youth**

A number of events, trips and movie evenings were supported and funded as a diversionary approach to anti-social behaviour and to engage local youth and link then into the relevant services.



# Naomh Fionnbarra Youth Project

We supported and funded several trips, events and engagements prior to Halloween for local young people in an effort to dissuade this grouping from engaging in anti-social activity and encourage them to connect to the service going forward.





#### Annamoe Youth Group

A Halloween party was supported in their base in Prussia Street on the 25<sup>th</sup> October and a trip away for the children they engage with.

An evaluation and debrief will take place to discuss outcomes and a plan for next year based on that review.

I would like to acknowledge the support and collaboration of the Child and Family Support Network of which we are member with 60 other local organisations, groups and agencies in planning advice and support this Halloween. A stakeholder engagement is planned with the latter for next year to discuss Halloween and other collaborations for community events and engagements going forward.
