**Crime Prevention

Information**

The Drug Related Intimidation work mentioned at the last JPC has been continuing and has been active across the K District. A number of people have been arrested in relation to this type of activity and are presently before the courts.

The Halloween campaign which was a multi-agency approach undertaken with DCC resulted in huge improvements over previous years. The active engagement with community stakeholders, advance visits to schools, working closely with contractors and the planned events themselves worked well and will be built upon for future years.

Anti-Social behaviour continues to be targeted and locations where this is taking place identified. In one area, constructive discussions have taken place between AGS and management Companies. A raft of measures have been undertaken in order to tackle this behaviour.

A large operation took place with the public transport providers which saw Gardaí using all forms of public transport to tackle criminality and anti-social behaviour. AGS worked with Irish Rail enforcement staff in order to provide support when dealing with fare evaders. A number of drug searches took place and arrests were made in relation to Warrants and Public Order Offences.

The annual Christmas Dinner for the Retired Active Persons group returned for the first year since COVID. This was organised by Garda Ciara McGrath, Cabra Community Policing, and catered for 65 older people. The event was supported by Dublin City Council and was a huge success.

Cabra once again is host to a foreign dignitary and a large scale Security Operation has been implemented for the Phoenix Park. This provides an opportunity to re-engage with stakeholders and local residents.
