Housing Matters North Inner City



Spencer Place CBL Competition

The Allocation of apartments at Spencer Place is almost completed. Tenant training was carried out in the Central Area Office and Building Management House Rules were distributed and explained at the same time. At the viewing sessions DCC Housing Staff explained the workings of the various systems in operation in the building.

As there are only 6 parking spaces available at the complex we intend to organize a draw in order to allocate them.

Railway Court, Railway Street

The Choice Based Lettings Competition for the new development on Railway Street commenced on Friday 12th January and closes on the 2nd February. Allocations of the complex is to be undertaken by our colleagues in Housing as this development is to be manged by Circle Housing. The Central Area Housing Office has been assisting local residents with the application process and staff have assisted in the completion of 196 applications to date. The CAO housing staff are dealing with numerous e-mails and phone calls in relation to the properties as well many callers coming into the office. The Development consists of 47 units, (10 x 3 Bed, 27 x 2 Bed, and 10 x 1 Bed Units)

A number of new CBL Competitions are in place including 4 Senior Citizen Complexes. These units are under the remit of the Central Area Office.

CCTV Upgrade:

City Councillors will be notified of the date for the session as soon as it is fixed and all are invited to attend.

Matt Talbot Court

The decanting of Matt Talbot Court continues with application forms for some of the CBL competitions such as Railway Court being distributed among remaining residents by the PEO. We continue to engage with the residents and answer any questions they may have.

Water Issues

There have been issues with the water supply at a number of our complexes in recent weeks caused by the bursting of mains within the Central Area. The Housing Office has been coordinating with Uisce Éireann and the DCC Water Works section and Housing Maintenance Division to provide prompt resolutions to the problems.

Housing Matters North West Inner City

Dominick Hall and Lower Dominick Street

Works to erect hoarding around Dominick Street West is ongoing and is due for completion in February 2024.

Regular discussions are being held with residents in the area regarding any issues that arise.

The date of the launch is yet to be confirmed.

Upper Dominick Street

Estate Management continues to hold meetings with concerned residents.

Constitution Hill

The soft strip survey which commenced in October is now complete. The site will be fully secured next week.

The last two remaining tenants have now agreed to move to the middle block.

Kevin Barry House

On-going discussions take place between Estate Management and Residents regarding the upkeep of the complex and addressing other issues as they arise.

New security doors are currently in the process of being installed.

Hardwicke Street

The new security doors have now been installed in all eleven blocks. Locks will be fitted once all the tenants have received their keys.

The new bin chambers are now in operation.

The Painting Programme is ongoing.

Saint Michans House

Ongoing meetings continue to be held with residents. Works are ongoing in the complex in relation to the pest control issue.

Blackhall Queen Street Complex

Painting of gates/railings at the front of the complex ie Queen Street, Blackhall Street is completed. A number of cars and vans have been removed from the complex.

Wolfe Tone Close

On-going meetings are taking place with residents and estate management concerning the general upkeep of the complex. Works on the entrance gate are completed.

Sheridan Place / Court

Excavation work is ongoing on the site of the former Amharclan Centre at the rear of the complex. Ongoing discussions between Estate Management and Residents as issues arise.

New security doors have been installed in both blocks and keys have been issued to the residents.

New gate operating system to be installed in the carpark in early 2024.

Chancery House

Ongoing discussion with residents addressing issues in the complex.

This was followed by an award ceremony for 12 inspirational community women who received a certificate scroll inspired by local artist Adelle Hickey 'Hearts of Ireland' and a bunch of flowers from local florist. There was a ticketed concert held in St Columba's Church with performances from Mary Coughlan and band along with Maria Doyle Kennedy and Kieran Kennedy Band.
