#### Ref 5252/22:

Permission is for development at this site at Parkview, Ballymun, Dublin 11, bounded by Parkview Road and Poppintree Park to the North, Cedarwood Green to the east, Cedarwood Road and Oakwood Close to the south and residential development (house no.'s 60 to 69) on Parkview Road to the west. The development will consist of (1) single storey creche (gross floor area 518sqm) with car set down area for 4no. cars, off street car parking spaces and 8no. bicycle parking spaces on the western section of the development.

(2) 32no. two storey, terraced, affordable residential units in 4no. blocks (2no. 2 bed houses and 30no. 3 bed houses), 32no. curtilage car parking spaces and 37no. on street parking spaces with 10no. bicycle parking spaces all on Parkview Road.

(3) 2no. single storey 4 bed sheltered housing with 6no. ancillary parking spaces, 2no. 9seater bus parking bays including the extension of Parkview Road to the east of the development and a pedestrian and bicycle linkage between Parkview Road and Cedarwood Green.

(4) all ancillary site works including hard and soft landscaping and individual refuse storage areas, all on land totalling 1.2912 hectares.

We have made changes to the operation of the traffic signals at the junction of Ballymun Road / Santry Avenue / Balbutcher Lane. Please note that these signals have 5 phases of movement so there is limited scope to give additional time to any one phase. Currently Santry Avenue receives 16 - 26 % of the available cycle time, and Balbutcher Lane receives 14 - 24 %. Bus priority measures are also in operation at this junction which affects the allocation of green time to the various approaches. The aim is to reduce delays for buses getting through the junction and at this particular junction there are bus routes on different approaches. We will continue to monitor the operation of the traffic signals and make further changes if required and there is scope to do so.



The use of CCTV is currently unavailable to the City Council for monitoring of the bottle banks and other areas around Dublin. The Code of Practice for the operation CCTV cameras for the purposes of Prevention, Detection and Prosecution of litter offences has been agreed by the relevant Departments and agencies. The offices of WERLA will now arrange to prepare a suite of documents to assist Local Authorities in preparing DPIA's and CCTV schemes. An Oversight Body must be set up and all of the above will ensure that Dublin City Council will have undertaken a "privacy by design and default" process prior to the deployment of CCTV.

Dublin City Council will then proceed to tender for a contractor to provide the service. It is envisaged that all of the above will take some time.

The Litter Wardens have been visiting the bottle bank on the Seamus Ennis Road regularly and removing a sample of the dumping for investigation to try and find out who is responsible. Until CCTV becomes available, the wardens will continue to visit the bank on a regular basis.

Clune Road is short in length, with 3 No. raised tables located in each junction on the road, to encourage drivers to reduce their speeds. As per the traffic management guidelines it is poor design to have traffic calming features that are spaced too close as it encourages harsh braking and consequent heavy acceleration in between.

In addition Clune Road has 30km/h Slow Zone signage indicating the lower speed limit and the area is a Home Zone/Slow Zone. This warns drivers they are driving in a residential area and to expect children. These 30km/h Slow Zone signs are clearly marked on Clune Road at the entrances from Jamestown Road and Ballygall Road West respectively.

On street parking act as traffic calming, reducing available carriageway width, reducing the speed. The trees lining Clune Road creates an enclosed environment which further enhances traffic calming. Therefore, additional traffic calming is not recommended on Clune Road.

# <u>Reply</u>

Our Environmental Liaison Officer in the North Central Area Office commenced an initiative in 2023 called 'Shore to Sea'. The project aims to install suitable signage adjacent to surface water gullies along the road side that may highlight to the public that the gully (shore) connects,

or outfalls, to a river or other waterbody directly. The signage would be similar to the 'Drains to Bay' symbol provided. Our Protection of Water Bodies Office is supporting this initiative.

The trial will endeavour to better understand how effective such signage may be as well as the associated cost of installations and ongoing maintenance requirements that includes understanding the durability of any such signage.

Raising awareness that many gullies directly connect to a waterbody is the aim of the Shore to Sea project, specifically aimed at informing the public of that infrastructure pathway and preventing potential polluting matter from being intentionally and/or unintentionally disposed of in surface water gullies, which we are aware happens from time to time.

Furthermore, we are keenly aware of the need to raise awareness amongst the public of the critical role of gullies have in addressing and reducing flood risk. Should the public notice gullies covered by debris or any inappropriate disposal of effluent into a gully, it is important they relay such information or any maintenance requirements to our gully management team in the Environmental Department (cgsurfacewater@dublincity.ie).

The Shore to Sea project is nearing implementation stage and our North Central Area Office will be initiating a complimentary social media campaign to promote awareness and understanding.


