Trauma informed care or Trauma and violence informed care

- A framework for relating to and helping people who have experienced negative consequences after exposure to dangerous experiences.
- A framework for human service delivery that is based on knowledge and understanding of how trauma affects people's lives.



Examples of Trauma Informed care

Being aware of personal triggers by:

- Actively avoiding re-traumatising interactions experiences
- Taking note of body language
- Promoting holistic, person-centred, culturally aware and strength based care



Trauma Informed Care – A new approach
