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Road Maintenance Services

During January, the Division's direct labour crews repaired/ made safe approximately 460 defects and hazards on the road network. Furthermore, over 40 critical defects and hazards on the road network were repaired/ made safe within 24-hours of them being reported.

The Division is continuing to deliver its Winter Maintenance Programme. There were twelve nights since the start of the year where road surface temperatures were forecast to fall below freezing. The Division's crews gritted approximately 300kms of roads on each of these nights.

Parking Tag and alternative methods of paying for parking

The numbers using the Parking Tag have increased and by week ending 11th February 2024, that week's revenue was €408,918.02. For week ending 11th February 2024, the usage of coin in parking meters was €18,959 and for week ending 11th February 2024 card payments were €138,468.

Permit Parking, Pay & Display

A new Residential Parking Permit scheme will commence in Botanic Avenue (No 108-152) on 26th February 2024. The hours of operation for this scheme will be Monday to Sunday 7.00 to 24.00.

A new Residential Parking Permit scheme will commence in Abercorn Road on 4th March 2024. The hours of operation for this scheme will be Monday to Saturday 7.00 to 19.00.

Waste Services Update.

Dublin Waste to Energy Community Gain Fund

Dublin Waste to Energy Ltd finances the Community Gain Fund and Dublin City Council administers the Fund and operates the Dublin Waste to Energy Community Gain Projects Grant Scheme. The Projects Grant Scheme is run every 18 months and invites, assesses, selects and funds project proposals from local community groups and organisations in the Irishtown, Ringsend and Sandymount catchment The projects that are awarded grant funding enhance the local area, fulfil a genuine need within the community, enrich the available community facilities and services, are socially inclusive and accessible and sustainable and viable in the long-term. Since 2014, circa €14m has been credited by Dublin Waste to Energy Ltd to the Community Gain Fund.

32 grant applications were approved grant funding in respect of the Dublin Waste to Energy Community Gain Projects Grant Scheme 2023 and the total value awarded was €995,027. To date 10 grant recipients have completed their projects and drawn down grant funding to a value of circa €250K. The remaining 22 grant recipients have until the 1st September 2024 to complete their grant aided project

Protection of Water Bodies Office (PWBO)

Dublin City Council is working to deliver a number of projects to ensure that we meet our Water Framework Directive (WFD) obligation of achieving "good" status for all our water bodies by 2027.

Current updates on those projects:
Golden Lane Public Realm Redevelopment Urban Runoff (Action 70):. Preferred tender
identified and contract to be signed.

Rainscapes Nature-Based Solutions Project (River Santry and River Dodder Rainscapes | Dublin City Council). Tender for construction to be issued shortly.

Bathing Waters: Voluntary fortnightly bathing water sampling continues at designated and other monitored waters outside of the Bathing Season. Statutory reporting to the EPA continues as required in accordance with Bathing Water Regulations SI 79 of 2008.

Recommended Minimum Criteria Environmental Inspections: *Water* RMCEI returns are in progress. The final plan incorporating all DCC Returns (including Air, Noise, Water and Waste) will be submitted by the DCC coordinator to the EPA by the 29th February 2024.

Misconnection programme: Domestic and Commercial misconnection inspections are being conducted along the Santry Catchment, to compliment the Santry River Restoration and Greenway Project. Further information on misconnection inspections can be found <u>Here</u>.

Flood Defence Project

Camac River

Consultants have been appointed by DCC to investigate the reduction of flood risk across the DCC and SDCC sections of the River Camac. Further public consultations are planned in April and June 2024 on emerging options both in the DCC and SDCC areas.

Further wintering bird surveys are ongoing in February and March 2024 to identify protected species as well as other bird quantities. A large Site Investigation for both Dublin City Council and South Dublin County Council areas of the Camac catchment commenced in July 2023 and was completed in January 2024.

Poddle Flood Alleviation Scheme

Construction commenced in Tymon Park on 6th February 2024. Construction of flood defences proposed in Ravensdale Park, St.Martin's Drive and Mount Argus are due to commence in 2025-2026. With Public liaison meetings planned in these areas Q1-Q2 2024.

Wad River Flood Alleviation Scheme Phase 2

The Project Team is currently finalising tender documents for two construction contracts, namely:

- a contract the upgrade of the outfall at the Clontarf promenade, this will be advertised by the end of February/early March, with the appointment of a contractor in April/May. The contractor will commence work on site by the end of May/start of June and the construction programme is anticipated to be 8 weeks.
- The second contract is for a surface water sewer under the Howth Road, the will be advertised in March, with the appointment of a contractor in May. The contractor will commence on site in June with an anticipated construction programme of 6-8week

Drainage Planning, Policy & Development Control

The SuDS Working Group has produced a new "Property Level Guide to SuDS". This is intended to give guidance on SuDS implementation for small developments, individual houses. driveways extensions. etc. It provides straightforward advice on meeting SuDS requirements in the City Development Plan. It also assists anyone who may want to install water butts, permeable paving etc. to help protect their own local area from flooding and climate change. A media campaign was carried out before Christmas to highlight the issue of people paving their gardens with impermeable materials.

To ensure sustainable development within the City, the Drainage Planning, Policy and Development Control team has established a framework for auditors of Basement Impact Assessment Reports. There are five consulting engineer companies on the cascading framework and a number of BIA reports are currently under review.

Climate Action Team.

Climate Action Plan

The Local Authority Climate Action Plan for Dublin City Council was adopted and a launch is planned for March 6th alongside a working session to introduce a key implementation project "Towards the Implementation of a Transformative Climate Action Plan in Dublin".

EU Mission for 100 Climate Neutral and Smart Cities/Net Zero Cities:

The Climate Action Team is developing a pilot city application with Cork City Council that will be submitted in March 2024.

The climate action team is working to prepare the city's climate city contract for submission in the Spring Window.

EU Projects

DCC is part of CULTIVATE an EU-funded project to increase public awareness and knowledge of Food Sharing initiatives (FSIs), to understand what drives or hampers their practice, and to foster sustainability, inclusion, and resilience in urban and peri-urban food systems through food sharing. As a hub city, CULTIVATE will develop the Food Sharing Compass, a social innovation support platform for FSIs, policy makers, food supply actors, researchers, and citizens. With its five tools, the Compass helps these stakeholders navigate food sharing landscapes and cultures to understand, develop, replicate, scale out and strengthen food sharing. The aim is to create more sustainable, resilient, and healthy urban and peri-urban food systems. CULTIVATE supports the EU's inclusive climate mitigation and adaptation ambitions.

DCC is part of REGEN an EU Funded project. REGEN will pave innovative pathways for the decarbonisation of European neighbourhoods The project will address urgent and cities. socioeconomic, climate and built environment challenges by designing a multifaceted Toolbox leveraging cutting-edge digital technologies and life cycle sustainability assessments. Engagement of citizens and influencing behavioural change is key to this project. Ringsend and Poolbeg is the area of focus for this project and it is anticipated that the project will support the DZ and DDHP.

DCC has received funding to participate in Minority Report an EU Funded project. Minority

Report will explore adaptation pathways through the application of digital twin technology, in the Ringsend/Poolbeg area of the city.

Dublin Metropolitan Climate Action Regional Office (CARO)

The Dublin CARO and Codema – Dublin's Energy Agency and SMART Dublin assisted and supported the four Dublin local authorities in the making of Climate Action Plans, in terms of alignment with the national Climate Action Plan 2023 and related sectoral climate obligations and ambitions. The new Plans were prepared in accordance with Guidelines for Local Authority Climate Action Plans, which were launched by Minister Eamon Ryan TD in March 2023. The Dublin CARO chaired monthly meetings with all four Dublin Climate Action Teams, Codema and Smart Dublin, to oversee and share progress on Climate Action Plan preparation.

All 4 of the Dublin Local Authory Climate Action Plans were adopted by respective Councils on 12th February.

At present, Dublin CARO along and other CARO counterparts are at the initial stages of compiling an actions spreadsheet based on commonalities.

Draft Dublin City Centre Transport Plan 2023


The current Dublin City Development Plan (2022-2028) objective SMT05 requires a update of the 2016 City Centre Transport Study. "To review the City Centre Transport Plan 2016 in collaboration with the NTA in the lifetime of the plan, setting out a clear strategy to prioritise active travel modes and public transport use, whilst ensuring the integration of high quality public realm."

Consulattion on the plan has finished and over 3,500 response were received. A full report on the consultation and the final plan was presented to the Transportation SPC on the 7^{th} of February

2024. It is intended to bring the Plan to the full council meeting in April.

The Active Travel Programme Office (AcTPrO) – Walk-Wheel-Cycle Network

The multi-disciplinary team within the Active Travel Programme Office (AcTPrO) continues to work on the design and delivery of a number of projects as part of the overall network, which when fully completed, will result in 95% of people being within 400 metres of the high quality network within Dublin City.



A more extensive quarterly report on the activities of AcTPrO, was submitted to the Lord Mayor and Elected Members for the January Monthly Council Meeting, report no. 18/2024. The next comprehensive quarterly report for the programme will be issued for the April Full Council Meeting.

The updates below contain some recent highlights of ongoing activity for the Active Travel Programme.

The Clontarf to City Centre (C2CC) project will deliver 8km of walking facilities, 6km of cycling facilities, and 5.4km of bus lanes, from Alfie Byrne Road/Clontarf Road Junction to Amiens Street/Talbot Street Junction and a section of the Tolka Valley Greenway from Annesley Bridge to Alfie Byrne Road/East Wall Road Junction. Construction commenced in Q1 2022 and will continue until Q2 2024.

There is currently a total of 2.45km of new inbound cycle-track and footway which is open

and in use (between Clontarf Promenade and Amiens Street / Buckingham Street junction).



From Talbot Street to Buckingham Street Lower, works are progressing well on the CIE retaining wall and railings. The concrete retaining wall has been entirely constructed and the mixed rubble stone wall is almost complete. Refurbishment of the original railing continues off site and shall be installed later in the Scheme once all works have been substantially completed in the area. Works are also progressing on the outbound side adjacent to Buckingham Street / Amiens Street Junction. At the Buckingham Street / Foley Street junction paving and landscaping works are now complete. Works have commenced on the junction of Talbot Street and Amiens Street with traffic ducting, watermain, tree pits, kerbing, public lighting, drainage, cycle-track and footway construction underway and progressing well.

All of the 6no. bus stops to be constructed on the inbound side are complete and in use, 2no. of the outbound stops are complete and in use. Construction of the remaining bus stops on the Scheme continue (12no. bus stops in total).

The latest C2CC Consultative Forum which includes local Councillors and representatives from local residents and businesses was held on Friday 15th December in Carleton Hall in Marino. The Project Team remain committed to engaging with the local residents and business owners along the route to discuss issues as they may arise, the meeting is scheduled to take place in March.

Engagement continues with utility providers to address conflict issues through Fairview Village.

On a day-to-day basis the Contractor crews typically remain at 35no. which is equivalent to approximately 100 Operatives with total staff, including supervision approaching 150no. The crucial traffic diversion from 'Edges corner' into the city that has enabled the Contractor to

progress works on multiple work fronts over nearly the full length of the scheme remains in place and is pivotal to the ability of the Scheme to be constructed.

Weekend and night works have recommenced with full depth road construction carried out at Marino Mart and Malahide road Junction. Separate night works are also underway to complete drainage works on Clontarf Road. Regular notifications of these works shall continue to be sent out via DCC's social media accounts, the DCC Alerts system which is open to the public and to the C2CC Consultative Forum which includes local Councillors, and representatives from residents and businesses.

Significant planned ESB works are required from Marino Mart through the Malahide Road Junction to the substation at that junction. This work is needed to complete kerbing, public lighting and drainage works in the area. Estimates for potential delay in this area are 16 weeks. Every effort is being made by the project team, the contractor and the ESB to reduce this delay as much as possible.

A Public Information Leaflet giving an update on the progress of the project was circulated to the local residents and businesses in the area in late January and early February. The updated leaflet along with regular updates on the project is accessible on the Dublin City Council webpages. The address is www.c2cc.ie

The **East Coast Trail Phase 1** (Alfie Byrne Road/East Wall Road Section). This project will provide segregated cycling facilities and improved pedestrian facilities along a 1km route that extends from the entrance to the Eastpoint Business Park on Alfie Byrne Road, along Alfie Byrne Road and East Wall Road as far as East Road.

Work is progressing for the provision of the new crossing to link the scheme to Fairview Park. Works at the Church road junction are nearing completion. Most of the upgrades to the underground services and footways are now complete. A three week period of night-time work on resurfacing commenced on 19th February. Thereafter the linear cycle way segregation kerb will be installed followed by red surfacing to the cycle areas.

Works will be complete by late Q2 of this year.

The Royal Canal Greenway Phase 3 will provide 2.1 km of cycling and walking facilities along the Royal Canal, from Newcomen Bridge (North Strand Road) to Cross Guns Bridge (Phibsborough Road). Construction commenced on site in February 2023 and is expected to continue until Q2 2025.

Cross Guns Bridge to Binns Bridge – Roadworks at Cross Guns Bridge junction are ongoing. Works on the inbound (east) side were completed on 7th February, including road crossing works that took place at night on 6th & 7th February. The outbound bus lane is currently occupied by the contractor to facilitate road works on the west side of the junction. These works are due for completion on 28th March 2024. Some traffic delays are anticipated.

New kerbing and ducting installations are ongoing along the new cycle track / footpath between Cross Guns Bridge and Binns Bridge. These works also include gully installation works and reinforced earth embankments with proprietary earth-reinforcing systems adjacent to the new footpath / cycle track / canal locks / Irish Rail retaining wall. Footpath and cycle track surfacing works are scheduled to take place in April 2024.

Binns Bridge to Bloody Sunday Bridge -

The detailed design for the Binns Bridge east side ramp is being finalised by the project consulting engineer, O'Connor Sutton Cronin (OCSC). Works on this ramp are scheduled to commence later in Q1 2024. Gas Networks Ireland are scheduled to relocate their existing regulating valve at Binns Bridge in Q2 2024, to facilitate the new ramp structure.

Russell Street / Jones Road was reopened to vehicular traffic on 8th February after road crossing works were completed. Lane closures will remain in place for up to an additional six weeks to complete all outstanding works on the east and west side footpaths. Temporary traffic signals are currently in place.

Bloody Sunday Bridge to Clarke's Bridge -

The contractor is extending new services from Russell Street road crossing to the east side ramp structure – electricity, gas, public lighting, fibre & CCTV.

<u>Clarke's Bridge to Newcomen Bridge</u> – Road crossing works on Summerhill Parade will commence when the C2CC diversionary route, of which Summerhill Parade forms a part, is lifted.

The contractor is preparing a method statement and risk assessment to expose and raise the current level of the extant 315mm diameter medium pressure gas main in the towpath adjacent to Clarke's Bridge.

Works between Clarke's Bridge and Charleville Mall are currently on hold and awaiting a detailed design to remediate the canal quay wall that has been deemed unstable.

The South Grand Canal Cycle Safety Improvements scheme involves the upgrade of existing signalised junctions from Leeson Street Junction to Suir Road junction by 'tightening' wide junctions to improve safety for pedestrians

and cyclists, and will also provide signalised pedestrian crossings.

A completion plan is now in place to allow the project to be closed out. There are two main categories of works remaining – the resurfacing of the junctions and the completion of footpath works. These have now be split into two separate works packages to be completed under existing council Frameworks.

The resurfacing will be carried out under the Multi-Party Framework Agreement for Bituminous Pavement Contract 2020-2024. The footpath works will be completed under the Multi-Party Framework Agreement for Carrying out Roadwork Contracts 2021-25.

Tenders have been received and contractors will be appointed in the coming weeks to complete any high priority works remaining.

The Georges Quay to Aston Quay phase of the Interim Liffey Cycle Route will provide improved walking & cycling facilities for 0.8km along the southern Quays between Georges Quay and Aston Quay. The following works are proposed:

- A new two-way cycle track from George's Quay to Burgh Quay located on the river side of the quays
- A new one-way cycle track on Aston Quay located on the river side of the quay
- Closure of left turn slip from Burgh Quay to D'Olier Street (left turn vehicle movement retained)
- New traffic islands and associated traffic signals
- Road resurfacing of George's Quay, Burgh Quay and Aston Quay
- Other associated works (ducting, road markings, drainage etc.)


The NTA have granted approval for the project to proceed to Construction Stage. A Contractor, Cairns Construction has been appointed. The works are scheduled to commence at the end of February 2024 and continue until Q2 2025.

The Kilmainham to Thomas Street scheme will provide 2.6km walking & cycling improvements from Kilmainham Gaol to Thomas Street from the South Circular Road Kilmainham Lane junction to the Thomas Court Thomas Street

junction. The project is being delivered in phases:

• Suir Road to Thomas St (Rapid Build Scheme)

Citius The Contractor Ltd commenced installation of first Phase of the scheme (along James Walk, Marrowbone Lane, Forbes Lane and Rialto Bridge) on 8th August, 2023. All civil works, bollards and line markings are completed along Marrowbone Lane, Forbes Lane and James's Walk, except for works on James's Walk from Rialto Street to the South Circular Road Junction / Rialto Bridge. Works at Rialto Bridge will be completed in Q1 2024. Installation of the coloured surfacing is programmed for March 2024, when the temperatures allow its installation.

The Dodder Greenway (Herbert Park to Donnybrook Road)



Project has delivered 480m of walking and cycling facilities, including flood protection measures, along the Dodder River between the entrance to Herbert Park at Eglington Terrace and Anglesey Bridge.

Construction started in Q4 2022 and was officially on the 8th of February by Councillor Dermot Lacey, representing the Lord Mayor of

Dublin, along with the Minister for Transport Eamon Ryan.

The Greenway fencing is to be extended along Eglinton Terrace. This is expected to be delivered during the second quarter of 2024.

Cleaning and Snagging on the Greenway are 99.5% complete.

There are currently two Active Travel projects which are at non statutory public consultation and are live on the Consultation Hub.

The **Milltown Road - Dodder Walk to Dundrum Road** Active Travel scheme went to public consultation on the 8th of February and this will run until the 15th of March 2024.

This route would facilitate continuity of a cycle route along the Dodder in advance of the Permanent **Dodder Greenway**.

The **Finglas Village Improvement Scheme** went to public consultation on 12th of February and this will run until 15th March 2024. This is a transformational scheme for Finglas Village to address inadequate pedestrian and cycling facilities within Finglas Village while significantly improving the public realm.

Smart D8 Pilot Updates



Smart D8 ran its third open call for pilots to address health and wellbeing

challenges in March 2023 and received a record number of 60 applications from private and public organisations. Four projects were selected to pilot.

Brace focuses on the development of a physiotherapy app, connecting patients with their physiotherapy plans. As of December 2023, Brace has engaged 118 Monthly Active Users, with a Stickiness Ratio of 8% — demonstrating adherence to users' rehabilitation programmes.

A total of 1,110 Individual user actions have been generated, including Exercise Set Completed, Plan Created, Check-In, Diary, and Goals.

MoveAhead is an interactive programme developed to engage with primary school children. It encourages daily activity to support children's health and wellbeing. They have now engaged with over 500 children and families in the Dublin 8 Area. This outreach includes participation from four primary schools, each with 100 children, and five after-school programs, each with 25 participating children. Due to the success of the afterschool program, MoveAhead has introduced an additional 3-week module focusing on health and well-being strands. Website: https://moveahead.io

Menopause and the City focuses on bringing information on the topic of Menopause together in an online one-stop-shop as well as delivering community workshops within the D8 area. Workshops are scheduled for March 5th at St Patrick's Mental Health Services and Cherry Orchard/Ballyfermot Community Centre. For more details: https://informd.ie/

Sleep Apnea Identifier project aims to support people with Sleep Apnea by gathering patient information in advance of visiting the hospital. This aims to streamline the outpatient process. Pilot activities are still ongoing in the OSA Identifier pilot by St. James' Hospital, following app development and patient enrollment. 72 patients are reported as being now enrolled in the programme. The first video clinic was scheduled on Monday 22nd January.

We are commencing the consultation on the draft digital transformation strategy, commencing with presentations to Area Committees during March and April. A video and short survey is being developed for the PPN.

Currently two services are being designed with the assistance of a service designer – the Council's business travel system and phase 2 of the Disabled Persons Organisations Consultation and Participation Process.

- A street washing app has been development for Waste Management where crews can upload images of before and after. An app for street grading is currently being explored
- Downtime analysis app for fleet management is now live
- The ethics register is live for Staff and Councillors
- Work is nearing completion on the new internal phonebook and it is anticipated that this will go live in Q1

Staff Awards 2024

The Staff Awards Scheme 2024 was launched on 19th February with additional categories based on the feedback from the inaugural awards in 2023. It is anticipated the award ceremony will be in May.

Website Governance

Work is ongoing with the Law Department to finalise procedures for governance, privacy and accessibility standards to ensure our websites are compliant with legislation, regulations and are accessible for all citizens.

Citizen Hub

A number of new services are available from February:





Annual Service Delivery Plan: Stakeholder engagement for all departments has been completed and all of the metrics have now been documented. Overarching documents for CRES and Planning are currently being created, alongside an estimated Rol for automation.

Open Data: 163 datasets are published on Dublinked with ongoing publication of weekly Pitch Playability and monthly cycle and pedestrian counts. New publication of Culture Dataset - Heritage Sites, Historic Monuments and Government Buildings DCC.

The Data & Analytics Unit has also engaged/supported projects in Tourism, HR, Communications, Climate, Housing, Planning, Active Travel and Learning & Development.

The data team have been asked to advise Limerick City and County Council on their process as they are planning to undertake similar work in 2024 and have also engaged with DLR to discuss this work and share our learnings with respect to the initial planning for a centralised data platform.

North City Operations Depot Project

The North City Operations Depot became operational immediately after completion of construction (substantial completion) in June 2023. The project is now in the 12-month Handover Stage. DCC NCOD Project Team continue to work with the Contractor and Design Team on snags and minor work. Work is also on-going on the contract accounts.

Customer Services

- 13,690 calls were answered between 18th January 2024 and 14th February 2024, with 41.28 % of those calls answered in less than 30 seconds.
- 3,257 emails were sent out by Customer Services between 18th January 2024 and 14th February 2024 from the generic customer services email account.
- 1,933 emails were sent out by Customer Services between 18th January 2024 and

Customer Experience continues to raise awareness of the JAM Card initiative and a proposal is currently with Senior Management to expedite the roll out of the training, using structures currently in situ, for example the HR Reps and the E-Learning Platform. It is likely that local JAM Card Champions will be trained to deliver the training within their own

departments. A further three public libraries are now fully trained. The requirement of 70% of staff trained is expected to be realised during 2024 and early 2025.

• Mystery Shopper

A Mystery Shopper Programme will be rolled out at the end of the 1st quarter of 2024. A mystery shopper is a technique commonly used in business and the feedback from this programme will allow us measure the quality of Customer Services and to collect information about service delivery.





Sarah Purser: Irish Activist, Collector Artist

June – October 2024

Sarah Purser (1848 – 1943) was a hugely influential figure in Irish artistic circles, both as an artist and as an organiser. This Exhibition, drawn largely from the HLG collection, will present her life and work from three different perspectives: artist, collector and activist. Purser was born in 1848 in Dún Laoghaire and studied in Switzerland, Dublin, and Paris before establishing herself as a leading portraitist in the city.


