North Inner City

Litter Hotline/CRM

In the period 1st – 29th February 2024, incidents were reported via Litter Hotline / Citizens HUB for the Central Area.

In addition to the Citizens Hub reported numbers, the Public Domain crew for the North Inner City & Glasnevin / Cabra Area carry out inspections of their assigned routes on a daily basis. They collect any dumped bags / materials found, that is not always reflected on the above figures.

The total tonnage of collected illegally dumped items from our four vehicles was:

- **25.02 tonne** for January 2024. Total Tonnage for 2024: **47.18 tonne**.

The team were given access to two vehicles on 14th February to use until our usual vehicles are returned.

Community Clean-ups

Community Clean up equipment was distributed to **11** Community Groups / individuals between 1st – 29th February. Requests for the removal of bags from community clean ups were handled by Waste Management and Public Domain staff.

PMAC removed graffiti from the following locations:

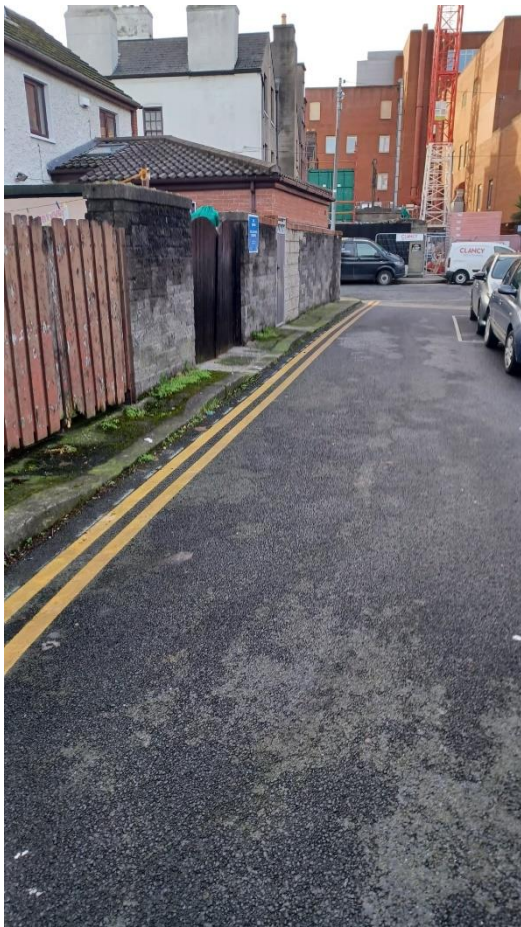

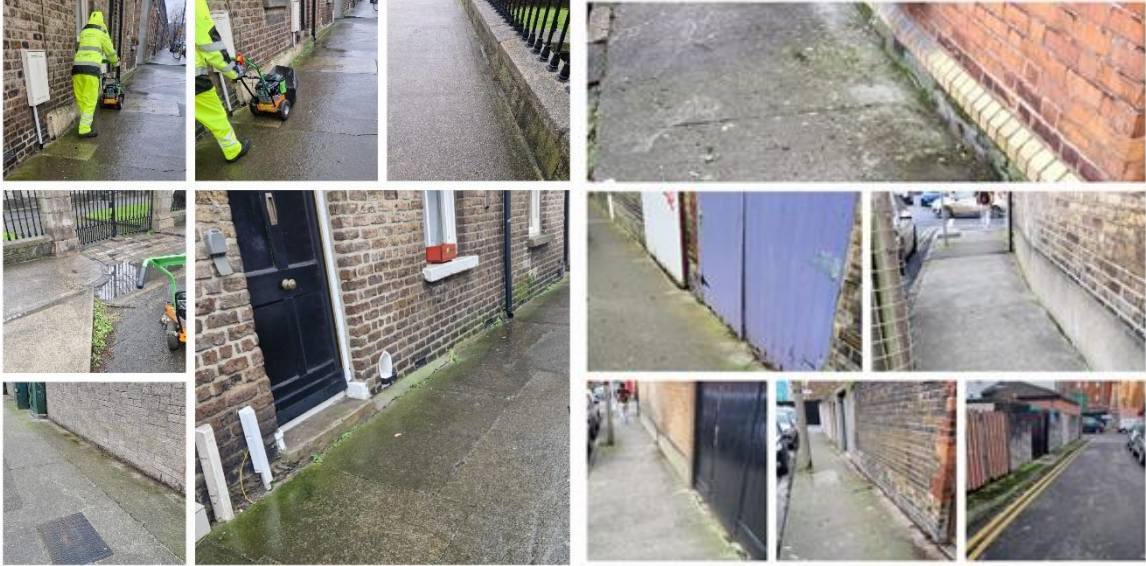
