Early Bonfire Materials:

Recently a significant stash of 75 tyres was discovered at a lock-up in Ballybough House during routine inspections. The Project Estate Officer arranged to have them removed and have the site secured.

Courtney Place:

CAO Housing Staff have been working with the area Housing Maintenance Team to develop a plan of action to address the recent rodent Infestation at Courtney Place.

- Sewer channels at the front of the building have all been sealed.
- Down pipes have been extended from the building and sealed.
- A redundant TV distribution pillar has been re-concreted to prevent rodents nesting.
- The open joint at the Railway Embankment has been sealed.
- All ground-floor units are been sealed.

Drones:

Recently an aerial survey of 18 complexes was undertaken by the Housing Office in order to produce high definition "photo-maps" of the inner precinct of each complex. The project was undertaken with ongoing precinct improvement plans in mind in order to provide a basis for meaningful engagement with residents as each project comes on-stream.

All flights were carried out in compliance with European Union Regulation 2019/947 as administered in Ireland by the Irish Aviation Authority, and with permissions from all relevant Authorities within the flight areas.

Spencer Dock:

Following consultation with the residents we are arranging to have the public areas of the 5 blocks at Spencer Dock deep cleaned.

Water Issues:

During a recent issue with the water supply to Liberty House and O'Brien Hall the Housing Team arranged for an emergency delivery of bottled water and housing staff assisted in the distribution around the complexes. They also arranged free passes to the Sean McDermott Street Swimming Poole so that tenants of both complexes could use the facilities if required.

Dominic Hall and Lower Dominick Street

Works to erect hoarding around Dominic Street Lower are now complete. Regular discussions are being held with residents in the area regarding any issues that arise. The date of the launch is yet to be confirmed.

Upper Dominick Street

Estate Management continues to hold meetings with concerned residents.

Constitution Hill

The redevelopment of Constitution Hill achieved Part 8 planning permission at the April 2023 Council meeting.

The project proposal is for a mixture of deep retrofit, amalgamation and infill of the three existing housing blocks and for the provision of new housing blocks on the site. The project will be completed in two phases.

Phase 1 - involves the amalgamation and redevelopment of the northern housing block (block nearest to Broadstone depot) and a new apartment block on the northern end of the site. A multi-use childcare space will be provided as part of Phase 1.

Phase 2- will provide for the redevelopment of the two other housing blocks, along with a new apartment block to the south of the site and a row of mews houses along the boundary wall at the rear of the site. The new scheme will provide 100% social housing, with a mix of one, two and three bedroom homes.

There is ongoing consultation with the residents to update them on the progress of the project.

A soft strip survey of Block 1 has completed onsite. The results of these works will provide relevant information required for the tendering process. The next step is to submit the Stage 3 application to the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage for approval to go to tender to appoint a contractor to Phase 1

Kevin Barry House

New security doors have now been installed and keys will be issued to residents in the coming weeks. Locks will then be installed and activated. Ongoing discussions take place between

Estate Management and residents regarding the upkeep of the complex and any other issues as they arise.

Hardwicke Street

The fitting of communal doors in blocks have been completed. New Vehicular gates are being installed at present. Painting programme is ongoing

Meetings with residents committee continue on a regular basis to discuss issues in the complex.

Saint Michans House

Ongoing meetings continue to be held with residents. Works are ongoing in the complex in relation to the pest control issue.

Blackhall Queen Street Complex

Painting of gates/railings at the front of the complex ie Queen Street, Blackhall Street is completed. A number of cars and vans have been removed from the complex.

Wolfe Tone Close

Upgrade works on the pedestrian gates are to commence shortly. Ongoing meetings take place with residents and estate management concerning the general upkeep of the complex.

Sheridan Place / Court

Ongoing discussions with estate management and residents as issues arise. New security doors are now complete. New gate operating system has been installed in the carpark and is fully activated.

Chancery House

Ongoing discussions with residents addressing issues in the complex.
