To the Chairperson and Members of the South East Area Committee

Report of the Executive Manager, Central and South East Areas

City Quay

Tenders have issued for the public realm/greening work for the front of City Quay and hopefully this work can be completed in early summer.

Baggot Street Upper

We are liaising with Reps. of businesses/residents regarding the installation of 11 new public benches in Baggot Street Upper and we are working with City Architects on the final detail. We hope to place an order for the new seating shortly.

Bridge Project

We continue to liaise with An Gardaí Síochana from both sides of the Liffey together with Swan Youth Services and St. Andrew's in relation to diversionary activities for young people.

Cabbage Patch

We are arranging a meeting between Parks and a local school regarding a proposal to create a community garden in the Cabbage Garden.

Sandymount Green

A meeting will be arranged shortly with stakeholders to discuss pedestrianisation beside Sandymount Green during the summer months.

Grand Canal

A meeting was held in January 2020 with Waterways Ireland representatives and Councillors to discuss ongoing management and maintenance of the canals in the city and to agree a new structure for interaction between Waterways Ireland and DCC. The latest meeting was held on 26th July 2023. A Bye Law consultation meeting was held with Councillors on 18th October 2023 and work continues on framing the new Bye Laws. A Meeting with Waterways Ireland and internal departments to review proposals for Wilton Terrace was held on 26th March 2024. Proposed works to the canal bank along Wilton Terrace will be presented to Councillors when finalised.

Portobello Harbour Square

Áit Urbanism + Landscape were appointed as consultant for the project and two initial public consultation workshops were held on 1st and 8th June 2022 at St. Kevin's Community Centre. Concept designs were prepared by consultants based on the outcome of these workshops and these were put on public display at St. Kevin's Community Centre between 3pm and 8pm on Thursday 21st July 2022. Online consultation was open until 19th August 2022 and a large number of submissions were received. Preliminary Appraisal form has been lodged with the Capital Project Support Office (CPSO). Provision has being included in the Parks 2023/24/25 draft Capital Programme. Parks Department presented the latest design to Councillors on 18th May 2023. A further public consultation took place at St. Kevin's Community Centre on 31st May 2023 and subsequently online. The pre-part 8 process which involves agreeing the proposal with internal departments has over run due to some issues

that arose late in the design process. Parks Department will make a presentation and outline revised timelines at the April SEAC meeting.

Rathgar Village Improvement Plan (VIP)

Herzog Park, Rathgar - Final Phase

The final phase of the project includes the re-alignment of the front boundary of the park and the revised car park layout, as set out in the Part 8 permission. A preliminary site meeting was held with Road Construction engineers in April 2022. Surveys of the area were carried out including a drone survey and GPR Survey to assist in the design process. Roads engineering resource is now in place and a meeting was held on site on 5th May 2023 with Roads Engineer, Parks Department and Area Office. Japanese Knotweed was identified in the boundary which will impact on timeline and costs. Outline costings have now been compiled and funding options are currently being assessed, including possible funding from Irish Water for SUDS works. We are awaiting a response from Irish Water regarding funding. Timeline for works will then be prepared and tender prepared in early 2024.

Ringsend Irishtown Local Environment Improvement Plan (LEIP)

Library Square: (Mitchell & Associates) Meetings with internal stakeholders were held during April/May 2022 and work was carried out on finalising the design. A meeting was held with local businesses to agree servicing arrangements for traders on Fitzwilliam Street in November 2022. A public information meeting to present the design to the community was held in December 2022 in Ringsend Irishtown Community Centre which was well received. A Road Safety Audit was carried out in early 2023. Pre-Part 8 drawings were circulated to Technical Departments in April 2023 and all issues were resolved. Planning Department had no objection to proceeding to Part 8 and presentation was made to the November SEAC meeting giving notice of lodgement of Part 8 planning application in November 2023. Part 8 planning application was lodged on Thursday 30th November and was open for submissions/observations until close of business on Thursday 18th January 2024. Twenty submissions were received and the Planning Department drafted its recommendation to approve. A report was made to the March SEAC meeting informing members of our intention to present the proposal to the April 2024 meeting of the City Council for approval.

Choice Based Lettings

We are currently reviewing applications for units in Maxwell Court and Stannaway Court. A two bed unit in Rathmines Avenue will be advertised shortly.

CCTV

Following on from a meeting on 23rd January, a further meeting took place with An Garda Siochana on 15th February. Their position changed somewhat between the meetings. At the first meeting they advised that they believed we could seek authorisation from the Commissioner for the entire area rather than specified parts of the area. Our Data Protection section were not in agreement with that assessment. At the most recent meeting they suggested that we now apply for authorisation for specified areas, on the basis that it would allow us to seek more funding through the Dept. of Justice Community CCTV Scheme. Additionally they had previously advised that all applications for authorisation should be under the Garda Síochána (Recording Devices Act) which was signed into law on 5th December but has not yet commenced. They have now advised we apply under the current legislation, (Section 35 Garda Act), as they are unable to provide any update as to when the new legislation will commence. It was agreed that we should prioritise the installation of CCTV in the Benbulbin Road area so we will commence the process. It was further agreed that this scheme should, ideally, include CCTV at Lissadel Road, which is in the South Central Area. Following a meeting with the Area Manager for Ballyfermot and an onsite meeting with a CCTV

contractor it has now been agreed that a camera will be placed in the front garden area of Lissadel Court as part of the Benbulben Road scheme. As this scheme will straddle both SEA and SC area's it will need to be supported by both the SE and SC JPC's. At the SEA JPC meeting on 20th March the matter was discussed and supported by the JPC. The next SE JPC meeting will take place on 29th April and the CCTV Scheme will be included as an agenda item.

Former Fr. Lar Redmond Hall, Keeper Road, Drimnagh

This community hall has been vacant for many years and Housing Development are proposing to redevelop the site for Housing. The site will be developed by Respond Housing and the proposal is to build Older Persons Units on the site. Information days took place in Dolphin's Barn Library on Wednesday 25th and Thursday 26th January. The main comments related to the proposed height of the developments and this was repeated at the presentation that was made to the Area Committee on 13th March. Following a redesign in response to points raised at the Area Committee Meeting and at the Community Consultation event Responds Architects have completed a further redesign. The main changes are as follows:

- A reduction of the overall building height from 7 to 6 storeys.
- Increase in height to the rear block from 4 to 5 storeys with the top floor set back.
- Reduction in car parking spaces provided from 5 to 3.
- Relocation of the communal room from third floor to upper ground floor, with dedicated entry from Keeper Road.
- Unit numbers have reduced from 22 to 20, due to the reduction in height, with unit areas remaining at approximately just over 50m2.

A planning application was lodged on 16th June with the last day for observations being 20th July. This application was deemed invalid. A new application was submitted on 14th July with the last day for observations being 17th August. This application was also deemed invalid as one of the three required Public Notices on the site was missing when the planning inspector visited the site. A third application was submitted on 25th August and the final date for observations to be submitted is 28th September. A decision was returned by the Planning Department on 18th October. They are seeking further information in relation to 7 issues of concern. Among these issues are the height, density and scale of the project, location of the community room and drainage for the site. Following this decision Respond Housing believe a full re design will be required and are reviewing the project from both a design and financial perspective.

Ravensdale Close/Clonmacnoise Grove

Following a meeting in January 2023 with Housing Development and FOLD AHB to review feasibility studies for the redevelopment of Ravensdale Close and Clonmacnoise Grove Senior Citizens complexes it was agreed that both projects were viable. Outline designs were presented to Area Councillors on 16th November. There was a generally positive response with some concerns raised re overlooking due to the proposed height of the Clonmacnoise design. FOLD's Architects completed a revision of Clonmacnoise design in January. Arrangements are also to be made for further consultation with residents of Ravensdale Close. A meeting was held between Area and FOLD on 29th February where FOLD to presented an update on the projects. A further meeting will be arranged with Councillors and FOLD intend to hold an Open Day for residents shortly after Easter.

Tenancy Warnings/Applications for Possession Order

We currently have 6 active Tenancy Warnings with a further one awaiting approval. Four Manager's Order approving applications for Possession Orders have been approved. A hearing in one of these cases took place in January. It was agreed that an adjournment would be sought in this case as there has been a marked improvement in the tenant's behaviour.

The adjourned case is now due for mention June. The second case was due to be heard on the 26th February but was also adjourned following the submission of further information. This case is due for mention in May. We are awaiting Court dates for the remaining 2 cases

Dublin City Sport & Wellbeing Partnership Report

Linking in with National Events & Initiatives

The primary goal of DCSWP is to provide opportunities for everyone to get involved in sport & physical activity regardless of age, gender or ability. DCSWP continues to align the planning and delivery of programmes with national and international events in 2024. This strategic approach helps maximise promotion of the service, adds momentum to local programmes and initiatives and ultimately increases reach across communities in Dublin City.

Primary School's Cross Country Race Series 2024

In partnership with Athletics Ireland the primary school cross country race series for 2024 will take place in local DCC parks across the city from March - May. The series is due to be advertised on DCSWP communication platforms. Schools across the city will be invited to partake in this following events:

National Active Schools Week 2024

Active schools week takes place from 29th April - 3rd May. Local DCSWP Sport Officers support schools that have signed up to the week in the delivery of multi-sport initiatives.

National Bike Week 2024

Bike Week 2024 takes place from 11th - 19th May. DCSWP Sport Officers in the area deliver cycling programmes targeted at various age groups and abilities. Bike safety programmes are also rolled out in local schools. The Sundrive Velodrome in the SEA will host activities throughout the week. Details to be confirmed.

Women's Mini Marathon 2024

12 week lead-in programmes have commenced to support participants in the lead-up to the Women's Mini Marathon 2024 which takes place on the June Bank Holiday. Local Sport Officers help train groups in the community in a safe and supportive environment as the event approaches.

Pembroke & South East Inner City Wards Community Development

Spring is in the air!

We have been liaising closely with our Tidy Towns groups and assisting them with renewing and installing planter boxes and supporting their events and annual strategy. The main focus of our groups is to increase the numbers of volunteers. Community Development are encouraging this through a programme of evening talks, nature walks and visibility strategies.

D6 for All - Welcome evening

D6 for ALL is a community support group that was established last summer to welcome Charleston Road new residents. Since then we have additional direct provision accommodations in the Pembroke Area; Rathmines Road (three houses), Beechwood Rd and Wynnefield Road, as well as St. Mary's D4, (other new accommodations have opened in Rathgar, Kimmage/Rathmines Area).

On the 12th March the D6 for All group held another welcome evening the Rathmines Parish Hall to welcome the new residents to Rathmines. Some men are well established, moving from Celbridge to Rathmines and already and have their work permits or jobs, while others have just arrived from tents in Dundrum. This was a very positive evening where local representatives, DCC Community Team, South City Partnership, local residents, sports clubs all welcoming our new D6 residents and reaching out with support, care and respect.



Roses 'Care in our Community' Project



Over St. Valentine's and Easter, 800 potted rose are being distributed to all residents of our sheltered housing complexes as well as other older and vulnerable people in the community. This is done in in partnership with our Housing Liaison Officers, local community centres and area groups, to demonstrate that the local community and neighbours are on hand to care.

A similar project for St. Patrick's Week took place in partnership with St. Andrew's *Talk About Youth* Project with 155 with tri-colour roses distributed as part of an intergenerational project in the Pearse Street Area.

Friends of Green Spaces & Ringsend and Herbert Park Allotments

We are currently engaged with 48 *Friends of Green Spaces* groups. Together were are planning our Summer Bedding programme. All planting requirements have been discussed and orders have been placed for a May delivery. These will be planted by our Friends of Green Spaces members across the South East Area to add colour and vibrancy to our streetscapes and complexes.





The allotment renewal period has now closed, with all 13 plots in Herbert Park and 36 plots in Ringsend Park renewed. We are co-ordinating with our allotments holders to engage in a Spring clean-up, providing mulch for weed control and planning a revised composting system. We are preparing an annual schedule of events for the allotments and bringing back Allotment Talks and a Summer Party, which has not occurred

Sandymount Culture Programme

With strong support from our Community Team, Sandymount Community Centre continues to present the Sandymount Culture Programme on the first Friday evening of every month, offering theatre, poetry, music and much more. To date this year, the Centre has played host to the Emilie Conway Jazz Trio, *Women of World War 2 Stories* from Smashing Times Theatre Company, and the one act play, *Beezie*, which featured star of *The Banshee of Inisherin*, Sheila Flitton.

Easter Programme

A fun packed Easter programme for young and old has been planned throughout the South East Area, with events ranging from Easter Parties to Easter Egg Hunts to Tea Dances!
