Reply

The necessary internal consultations are ongoing and discussions will be held with the Sports Section in the coming weeks with regard to the management of the proposed facility. Consultations with the local clubs can be scheduled over the coming months in this regard also. The Part 8 planning process will be published in Q1 2025 which also provides for statutory consultations.

The potential timeframes for the tendering process is somewhat unclear at this time as recent changes to the procurement requirements have caused backlogs in the tendering and procurement pipeline. It is envisaged that as procurement units become more familiar with new procedures the process will be more streamlined next year when it comes to tendering this project.

It is not possible to give a meaningful estimation of timelines for construction at this time as such matters are very much dependent on contractor's schedules, supply chains and many other factors. Such detail is normally sought from contractors as part of the tender requirements as an award criteria and contributes to the tender assessment. But it is hoped that the tender can be published and a contractor appointed in 2025.

To ask the Director of Services for a list of the flood defence works done in the last 15 years in Maryfield Crescent Artane, Dublin 5.

Reply

Maryfield Crescent experienced significant flooding in the heavy rainfall of the 24th of October 2011. Following this extreme weather event a review of the drainage network at Maryfield Crescent was undertaken. The primary source of flooding came from a surcharge of the Naniken River, which crosses Maryfield Crescent as a 1050mm culvert. Since 2011 the following works have been undertaken by Dublin City Council:

- Two chambers were built on the existing Surface Water sewers to install non-return valves such that a surcharge of the Naniken will not flow back through the sewerage network.
- Four new gullies outside of number 39A, local low point, to aid with road drainage.
- A new double gully at number 46.
- 2 new gullies connected to the foul sewer main at number 26. These gullies have non-return valves installed.

Maryfield Crescent has been monitored since introducing the above interventions, most notably after substantial rainfall events. There have been no further incidents of flooding at Maryfield Crescent similar to the 2011 event. These interventions have been assessed to have successfully addressed the known contributing factors to 2011 flood incident which occurred.

Reply

A School Zone was installed at Drumcondra National School as part of the Safe Routes to School programme, funded by the National Transport Authority. School Zones are built infrastructural upgrades that are designed to give priority to students at the school gate by freeing up footpaths and reducing vehicle drop-offs, pick-ups and idling. The aim is to increase safety at the front of school and prioritise active travel (walking, cycling, wheeling and scooting) to and from school.

The School Zone works installed at Drumcondra National School included pencil bollards to prevent parking on the footpath in the vicinity of the school, colourful road markings and flashing ambers signs to draw drivers' attention to the school and encourage them to reduce their speed and a signalised pedestrian crossing installed outside the Irene Social and Sports Club on Gracepark Road.

A request has been sent to the Traffic Advisory Group for a timed turning ban from Grace Park Road onto Church Avenue to improve safety and to ease traffic congestion.

To ask the Manager for information on the sequence /programming/prioritising of the recently introduced Traffic lights on the Coolock Interchange roundabout, there have been many enquiries as to their operation of these lights by local motorists and pedestrians.

Reply

Pedestrian crossing signals were recently switched on at the M50 J2 roundabout on Oscar Traynor Rd / Coolock Lane.

Traffic signal controlled pedestrian crossings have been provided on all exits from and all approaches to the roundabout enhancing safety for the many pedestrians who traverse this roundabout daily.

The pedestrian crossings are on demand only so are only activated when demand from a pedestrian exists.

The traffic signal movements are controlled by Dublin City Council's SCATS traffic management system which allocates vehicle green time subject to demand from vehicles on various approaches.

The traffic signal and pedestrian crossing movements and sequences have been designed to optimise journey times through the roundabout whilst ensuring that vehicles, in general, can exit the roundabout once they have entered. This ensures that the roundabout itself does not become congested potentially blocking other vehicles from entry.

The current sequence was designed following weeks of careful evaluation of traffic movements using data extracted from vehicle detectors whilst the lamps remained switched off.

The operation of this key intersection is being closely monitored and the operation is being continually amended to ensure optimal operation.

In order for the vehicles that are parking in the bay to exit out onto the road, the vehicles need to reverse over the footpath.

Reversing without due diligence and being vigilant for pedestrians, and also reversing out onto a major road, is illegal, in accordance with the Road Traffic (Traffic & Parking) Regulations, 1997 Article 12 (1), (2) & (3). Therefore, this is a matter of enforcement for An Garda Síochána.

The Transport Advisory Group engineer will raise this issue with An Garda Síochána at the next TAG meeting.
