

Briefing Note Mobility and Public Realm SPC.

The new Mobility and Public Realm SPC covers the work of four of the Environment & Transportation Departments divisions:-

Traffic Division: - Traffic management across the city, coordination of mobility projects, Transport advisory Group (TAG), Parking enforcement, Roadworks Control, Traffic signals, pedestrian crossings, junctions, Public Transport priority and city centre projects.

Roads Division: - Road maintenance, Road construction, Bridges and public realm projects.

Waste Management: - Litter

Active Travel Programme Office: - Provision of active travel network.

Some of the Traffic priorities for the year ahead are:-

Continue the implementation of the City Centre Transport Plan with Westland Row changes and Parliament Street planned for implementation in 2025 as well as a number of initiatives around deliveries, loading bays.

Work on the bus connects network redesign with the NTA and especially the provision of various traffic changes required to implement the new routes.

It is expected that two Bus Connects Corridors will move towards construction in 2025 and DCC will be putting additional resources into this project to progress it and help ensure the project's success.

Pedestrian and zebra crossing programs are underway and a major milestone of this project was completing the pedestrian crossings at the Coolock Interchange. School zones and safe routes to school and issues of traffic around schools as well as general road safety are key priorities.

Revision of speed limits, parking bye laws and guidance around enforcement are some of the policies which will be brought to this SPC.
