Recommended	Recommended – as per the Dublin City Development Plan Chapter 8 (SMTO23) "It is an objective of Dublin City Council: To progressively eliminate all 'free' on-street parking, both within the canals and in adjacent areas where there is evidence of 'all day' commuter parking, through the imposition of appropriate parking controls, including resident permit parking, pay and display parking, or by the provision of new cycle parking, public realm or greening." Recommended	Recommended – following an assessment of the area, given the narrow footway on the south side of Bonham Street at the south-western entrance to Bridgefoot Street Park, it is recommended to rescind Pay & Display parking at this location with the aim of providing public realm improvements. It was also identified that Pay & Display parking is currently available in front of an access gate to the new building on the west side of Bonham Street. Dublin City Council does not provide repeater speed limit signage as a traffic calming measure and as such, no changes are recommended at this time. Not Recommended	Not recommended – following an inspection, it was found that 7 no. speed ramps, 6 no. slow road markings and a raised table have already been provided on Martin's Row. These ramps are spaced appropriately so as to prevent harsh braking and subsequent heavy acceleration. No additional slow road markings are recommended as they would likely detract from the effectiveness of those already in place. As such, no changes are recommended at this time.	Internal	12/01/2024	1

Under Road Traffic (Traffic and Parking) Regulations 1997 section 36:2:d "A vehicle shall not be parked - on a section of roadway with less than 3 traffic lanes and where traffic sign number RRM 001 [continuous white line] has been provided;" In future, instances of illegal or obstructive parking should be referred to Dublin Street Parking Services, DSPS (email info@dspd.ie or tel. no. 01 602 2500) or an Garda Síochána for enforcement. Not Recommended	Not recommended – following an on-site assessment it was found that the planter box at the junction of Mark's Alley West and Francis Street does not obstruct visibility enough to warrant its removal. Parking restrictions have been provided on the north-side of Mark's Alley West. Parking enforcement will be notified of this specific site. In future, instances of illegal or obstructive parking should be referred to Dublin Street Parking Services, DSPS (email info@dspd.ie or tel. no. 01 602 2500) or an Garda Síochána for enforcement. 15	11167293	Yellow Box	MOERAN ROAD (SC)	Dublin 12	request a yellow box at the junction of Moeran Road and Cromwellsfort Road.	Not Recommended	Not recommended - It is not recommended to install a yellow box at the junction of Moeran Road and Cromwellsfort Road as there is already a large yellow box in the vicinity on the junction of Cherry Grove and Cromwellsfort Road. An additional yellow box at this location would exacerbate dangerous driver behaviours on Cromwellsfort Road such as speeding across the yellow box to make the green light at the signalised crossing just east of the junction with Moeran Road. Furthermore, the Traffic Signs Manual Chapter 7.9.3 regarding suitable locations for yellow boxes states: “Where a succession of locations gives rise to blocking a series of yellow boxes may be considered provided at least 20 metres storage can be maintained between successive boxes.” This criteria cannot be met at this location. Not Recommended	Not recommended - It is not current Dublin City Council policy to provide parking restrictions where restrictions are already covered under legislation. Under Road Traffic (Traffic and Parking) Regulations 1997 section 36:2:c “A vehicle shall not be parked - within 5 metres of a road junction.” Instances of illegal or obstructive parking should be referred to Dublin Street Parking Services, DSPS (email info@dpsps.ie or tel. no. 01 602 2500) or an Garda Síochána for enforcement.
