

QUESTIONS LODGED PURSUANT TO STANDING ORDER NO.18 FOR REPLY AT THE MONTHLY MEETING OF DUBLIN CITY COUNCIL TO BE HELD ON MONDAY 6th JANUARY 2025

Q.01 COUNCILLOR JOHN STEPHENS

To ask the Chief Executive what the policy of leaf collection and removal in areas is where residents do not take responsibility for this. In Cabra/Glasnevin/Drumcondra and North Inner-City Areas.

Q.2 COUNCILLOR JOHN LYONS

To ask the Chief Executive for a report on the housing file (**details supplied**) and for her interest in securing one of the new homes to be delivered at Oscar Traynor Woods to be noted and considered.

Q.3 COUNCILLOR JOHN LYONS

To ask the Chief Executive for an urgent maintenance inspection of (**details supplied**), it has serious ventilation and mould issues which are even more concerning due to the recent arrival of a baby boy. The front door also needs replacing.

Q.4 COUNCILLOR DERMOT LACEY

To ask the Chief Executive how much Dublin City Council paid in Local Property Tax in the years 2020-2024 inclusive?

Q.5 COUNCILLOR CHRISTY BURKE

To ask the Chief Executive when the traffic team will be in place to address the ongoing serious traffic issues at (**details supplied**).

Q.6 COUNCILLOR CHRISTY BURKE

To ask the Chief Executive if a date as to when the small section of double yellow lines be placed alongside (**details supplied**).

Q.7 COUNCILLOR CHRISTY BURKE

To ask the Chief Executive if Dublin City Council would address the defective front hall door lock at (**details supplied**).

Q.8 COUNCILLOR CHRISTY BURKE

To ask the Chief Executive given the amount of cars and vans parked on pathways in Marino on any given day of the week be addressed.

Q.9 COUNCILLOR RAY CUNNINGHAM

To ask the Chief Executive about the possibility of putting Mulberry Cottages in Chapelizod up for auction. The cottages are derelict and were acquired by the council several years ago under a compulsory purchase order. However, since then the council has not been able to restore them to use. Other properties in the village have been restored by private owners. Can Mulberry Cottages be sold, to help address the problem of dereliction and vacancy in Chapelizod Village?

Q.10 COUNCILLOR RAY CUNNINGHAM

To ask the Chief Executive to provide a list of council-owned properties in Dublin 12 that are currently vacant and not designated for housing.

Q.11 COUNCILLOR AMMAR ALI

To ask the Chief Executive for a report regarding an update on completion and opening of Donore Community Centre, why is there further delays in its opening? This community facility is vital for the residents of Dublin 8, and we need it to be fully

restored and back in use as soon as possible. I urge DCC to please prioritise the reopening of this important resource for our community.

Q.12 COUNCILLOR AMAR ALI

To ask the Chief Executive for a report on the Old Inchicore Library, any updates on its restoration and future plans for its use that can benefit our local community.

Q.13 COUNCILLOR ANTHONY CONNAGHAM

To ask the Chief Executive to arrange for the inspection and repair to the footpath at (**details supplied**) There have been several incidents at this location. Recently an elderly man broke his hip.

Q.14 COUNCILLOR ANTHONY CONNAGHAM

To ask the Chief Executive to arrange for the entrance to Johnstown Park via Ballygall Road East to be made more accessible similar to the entrance at Glasanaon Road.

Q.15 COUNCILLOR ANTHONY CONNAGHAN

To ask the Chief Executive to arrange for an inspection of the tree and footpath at (**Details supplied**) where the resident reports issues with the pavement there.

Q.16 COUNCILLOR ANTHONY CONNAGHAN

To ask the Chief Executive to arrange for the footpaths on Valley Park Road to be inspected with a view to resurfacing as there are several trip hazards along here. The part between 28 and 40 is particularly bad.

Q.17 COUNCILLOR ALISON FIELD

To ask the Chief Executive about the parking at the intersection at Middle Third and the Orchard in Killester, there are cars constantly parked on the yellow lines. It is very dangerous with cars trying to leave Orchard Ave.

Q.18 COUNCILLOR ALISON FIELD

To ask the Chief Executive for extra bins to be placed around the take-away shops on Harmonstown Road, especially outside the chip shop takeaway, as the laneway is very littered.

Q.19 COUNCILLOR ALISON FIELD

To ask the Chief Executive to finish off replacing the rest of the broken paths in Ennafort, Raheny in next year's budget.

Q.20 COUNCILLOR ALISON FIELD

To ask the Chief Executive to replace the broken paths in the Harmonstown/ Artane area. The residents have been waiting years for this, I hope they are included in next year's Budget.

Q.21 COUNCILLOR SUPRIYA SINGH

To ask the Chief Executive to liaise with Traffic Department to urgently address the hazardous traffic situation at Briarfield Villas, Greendale Road, facing Coláiste Dhúlaigh - Kilbarrack Campus and St. Michael's House Special Needs School, by implementing double yellow lines and no parking signage? Given that over 70 vehicles, including taxis and cars, arrive daily to drop off and pick up children attending Abacas Special School, the congestion caused by cars parked on both sides of the road creates a dangerous and obstructive environment for families and residents. Will the Chief Executive commit to prioritising this issue and taking immediate action to ensure the safety of all road users in this area?

Q.22 COUNCILLOR SUPRIYA SINGH

To ask the Chief Executive to provide a comprehensive update on the status of the proposed community centre in the Belmayne area. Additionally, given the significant population growth and the new developments underway in the Balgriffin/Clongriffin area, can the Chief Executive outline the plans for amenities in the Donaghmede area, including community centres, sports facilities, and other necessary infrastructure.

Q.23 COUNCILLOR SUPRIYA SINGH

To ask the Chief Executive to provide an update on the vacant commercial units in Clongriffin? Reportedly, despite an agreement between Dublin City Council and the National Valuations Office to value these empty units for proper rate charges, many of the ground-floor retail units have remained vacant for over a decade. What is causing the delay in implementing the proper rates, and what steps are being taken to address this issue, particularly given the area's lack of basic amenities.

Q.24 COUNCILLOR SUPRIYASINGH

To ask the Chief Executive to clarify the reasons for the delay in taking in charge Marsfield Avenue road? Residents have raised ongoing concerns about the hazardous conditions, particularly during the morning rush when drivers speed to drop off passengers at the station, and again in the evening when people are picked up. This constant traffic flow creates a dangerous environment for both pedestrians and residents. Given the repeated safety concerns from the community, what specific steps are being taken to address this issue? It is becoming increasingly frustrating for residents, as waiting for basic improvements due to delays in the Taking in Charge process is no longer acceptable.

Q.25 COUNCILLOR JOHN LYONS

To ask the Chief Executive for a detailed report on the repair works required and the timeline involved in re-opening the Coolock Swimming Pool at North side Shopping Centre, a key community asset, albeit with ongoing reduced hours for the general public, so it vital that we ensure it is re-opened as soon as possible.

Q.26 COUNCILLOR JOHN LYONS

To ask the Chief Executive for a report on the allocation of **(details supplied)**, a pensioner with poor health: he was not afforded a viewing of the property before accepting it, the apartment was completely unfurnished when he moved in and the floors were in poor condition. He had to spend a significant amount of money making his new home habitable and he is now seeking some financial assistance to be retrospectively provided to him.

Q.27 COUNCILLOR JOHN STEPHENS

To ask the Chief Executive is there any progress on the implementation of a Yellow Box on the Navan Road at the entrance to St. Vincent's?

Q.28 COUNCILLOR JOHN STEPHENS

To ask the Chief Executive could the Environmental Study on the Martin Savage Park be carried out with immediate effect as this is causing a major delay to the Martin Savage Project

Q.29 COUNCILLOR JOHN STEPHENS

To ask the Chief Executive to improve the poor lighting from Broombridge to the Pelletstown.

Q.30 COUNCILLOR JOHN STEPHENS

To ask the Chief Executive could a Traffic Calming Measure be implemented on Ashington Rise as residents are very concerned about the speed at which motorists are travelling along this stretch of road?

Q.31 COUNCILLOR GAVIN PEPPER

To ask the Chief Executive with regards to question 17 on the 2nd of December, as unfortunately the Chief Executive does not appear to have the powers required to break the vicious circle vis the Environmental Health Officers involvement in this matter and that as I will need to take further advice in this matter, am I to presume that this matter will be expedited, given the duration of confusion, when I revert on foot of receipt of said advice?

Q.32 COUNCILLOR GAVIN PEPPER

To ask the Chief Executive is there any plans to establish DCC sponsored boxing clubs, these are especially necessary for young people, one specifically needed in the Whitehall area where there is strong community support for the establishment of same.

Q.33 COUNCILLOR GAYLE RALPH

To ask the Chief Executive to resolve the issue of flooding at **(details supplied)**

Q.35 COUNCILLOR RAY MCADAM

To ask the Chief Executive to ensure that two properties along **(Details supplied)** owned by the Council that are in a state of total disrepair, what action is planned by the Housing Department to clean them up, remove all dumped material and ensure they are in a condition to be allocated to those on our housing list; and if he will make a statement on the matter.

Q.36 COUNCILLOR DERMOT LACEY

To ask the Chief Executive if he has had any approaches from any of the Parties likely to form the next Government to ascertain the needs of Dublin City as they prepare a Programme for Government.

Q.37 COUNCILLOR DERMOT LACEY

To ask the Chief Executive if he will initiate a serious programme to cull the excessive and growing problem of rats in the City.

Q.38 COUNCILLOR DAITHI DOOLAN

To ask the Chief Executive for an update on the construction of new dressing rooms in Brickfield Park, Drimnagh.

Q.39 COUNCILLOR DAITHI DOOLAN

To ask the Chief Executive to organise for work to be carried out on the gardens at **(details supplied)**.

Q.40 COUNCILLOR DAITHI DOOLAN

To ask the Chief Executive can he confirm if Dublin is meeting its recycling target for 2025 and can he also confirm how much waste has been generated, collected, recycled, land filled and incinerated for the years 2014-2024.

Q.41 COUNCILLOR RORY HOGAN

To ask the Chief Executive if there is a formal process for compensation to property owners for damage caused to garden walls and other privately owned structures by the growth of council-owned tree roots on footpaths.

Q.42 COUNCILLOR RORY HOGAN

To ask the Chief Executive whether an impact assessment was conducted on the provision of late-night public transport services (Luas, DART, and Bus) over the Christmas period. If so, would the Executive consider sharing this data with Councillors? The availability of late-night public transport during weekends and festive periods significantly enhances the accessibility of the night-time economy for both consumers and employees in the sector. Expanding such services to more periods throughout the year would help reduce financial burdens and carbon emissions within the sector. Data from this impact assessment would be invaluable in supporting the advocacy and progression of policies to extend late-night public transport services.

Q.43 COUNCILLOR RORY HOGAN

To ask the Chief Executive if Dublin City Council currently provides fire alarms free of charge to residents. If not, would he consider introducing a scheme to provide fire alarms to households free of charge, to enhance fire safety in the community?

Q.44 COUNCILLOR RORY HOGAN

To ask the Chief Executive if consideration has been given to the possibility of providing free parking to all people over the age of 70 not in possession of the disability blue badges; and if he can outline his views on such considerations.

Q.45 COUNCILLOR MANNIX FLYNN

To ask the Chief Executive to issue a full report regarding the monies received from the NTA over the past number of years for active travel projects and other such initiatives. This report to include, a full breakdown of all costs and allocations of monies, full rationale for all budgets. Who initiates these programs of works? Is it the NTA or Dublin City Council Planning department, Traffic department? How much monies have been allocated to staff wages and salaries? Who is in charge of the overall budget? Who has sign off on the budget and financial controls? Is there any report on these budgets? Have the city counsellors been informed or have they any say on what programs of work are initiated? How are budgets and monies negotiated from the NTA? Who initiates these negotiations? At a recent meeting of the South East area the NTA refused to supply me with this information even though they have given out the monies to Dublin City Council. Can the City Council supply me with this information in the interest of transparency and openness and accountability? There are very serious sums of public money here. In the meantime, I have yet to see any transparency around these monies and any of our documentation or accounts perhaps I am missing something.

Q.46 COUNCILLOR MANNIX FLYNN

To ask the Chief Executive in light of the recent scandalous revelations regarding governance at the Fr. Peter McVerry Trust issue a full public statement regarding Dublin City Council and Dublin Regional Homeless Executives own investigations and what they have uncovered. Further, with the possibility of the Fr. Peter McVerry Trust going the way of other such charitable organisations who have been found to be in gross breach of governance, what contingency plans has Dublin City Council in place in the event of the Fr Peter McVerry Trust having to wind down its operations as a company and transfer its assets because of its gross breach of trust?

Q.47 COUNCILLOR MANNIX FLYNN

To ask the Chief Executive to reissue all reports given to me regarding **(details supplied)**. Can the CEO resupply me with the answers to all the questions I asked in the past number of years regarding these properties at Buckingham Street. Also, can the CEO issue a report as to what progress has been made regarding the future use

of these properties? Also, are all the legal claims due diligence and governance completed regarding these properties and their ownership? Including rights of way and trespass. Has **(details supplied)** been given any financial redress or compensation from DCC regarding the takeover by DCC of these properties?

Q.48 COUNCILLOR MANNIX FLYNN

To ask the Chief Executive to give a full breakdown of the entire fleet of vehicles used by Dublin City Council? This breakdown to include age of vehicles, road worthiness of vehicles, full record of breakdown of vehicles. This report also to include, the Dublin fire brigade and ambulance fleet and EV vehicles.

Q.49 COUNCILLOR PADDY MONAHAN

To ask the Chief Executive where there is a parking protected cycle lane, to install a physical barrier (e.g. bollards or a raised ramp) on the outside of the buffer zone between the cycle lane and the parking spots. Examples of places where this is required are Fitzwilliam Street and Griffith Avenue but this applies to all parking protected cycle lanes. The purpose of the buffer zone is so that doors opening from parked cars do not dangerously encroach on the cycle lane. However, due to the fact that there is no physical impediment stopping them from doing so, drivers more often than not park their car partially or wholly in the buffer zone, rendering it ineffective and useless.

Q.50 COUNCILLOR PADDY MONAHAN

To ask the Chief Executive to remove the flashing yellow light for cars from pedestrian crossings. This light should remain red for this period. The flashing yellow light for cars at pedestrian crossings encourages drivers to proceed and puts pedestrians at risk. It is anti-active travel and creates anxiety and risk for pedestrians. If the flashing yellow light for cars at pedestrian crossings is not to be removed can the Chief Executive please explain the purpose of this light and why it should be retained?

Q.51 COUNCILLOR PADDY MONAHAN

To ask the Chief Executive to have visible countdown timers installed at pedestrian crossings for pedestrians awaiting the green man. With respect to previous statements on this issue, if there are exceptional cases where this is not feasible so be it but such timers should be installed as widely as possible throughout Dublin.

Q.52 COUNCILLOR PADDY MONAHAN

To ask the Chief Executive to install zebra crossings at intersections to indicate that a pedestrian continuing to walk straight has priority over a car turning. Without such visible markings drivers will continue to wrongly assume priority and cause pedestrians to wait for a break in traffic at which point they may attempt to cross - always at risk of another turning car.

To ask the Chief Executive about parking plans **(details Supplied)**

Q.54 COUNCILLOR GAYLE RALPH

To ask the Chief Executive about litter problems **(details supplied)**

Q.55 COUNCILLOR FIONA CONNELLY

To ask the Chief Executive is there a way to support residents installing driveways without damaging trees? There are a few residents that have been in touch with refused planning permission for driveways. The permission has been declined because of street trees that are close but not blocking the entrance. Is there a way to facilitate both the off-street parking and maintaining the trees?

Q.56 COUNCILLOR FIONA CONNELLY

To ask the Chief Executive when are the communication boards being installed in Eamonn Ceannt Park, Brickfield Park and Pearse Park? These boards are vital for children and families who need them and will make a huge difference. D12 Autism Support Group are doing fantastic work in the community to support families and these communication boards are very important.

Q.57 COUNCILLOR FELJIN JOSE

To ask the Chief Executive to outline how the Council is supporting residents on terraced streets to charge electric vehicles locally at affordable rates

Q.58 COUNCILLOR FELJIN JOSE

To ask the Chief Executive for an update on the interim road safety measures proposed for the Ashtown Gate junction.

Q.59 COUNCILLOR FELJIN JOSE

To ask the Chief Executive for the number of bicycle parking stands installed in the city in 2022, 2023, 2024 and how many are planned for installation in 2025

Q.60 COUNCILLOR FELJIN JOSE

To ask the Chief Executive for the update on the rollout of Bike Bunkers in the city.

Q.61 COUNCILLOR LESLIE KANE

To ask the Chief Executive can a report be done to show how many claims have been put in through DCC insurance from contractors called out to carry repairs on DCC tenant's homes?

Q.62 COUNCILLOR LESLIE KANE

To ask the Chief Executive can a statue of Sinead o Connor be put up in the city?

Q.63 COUNCILLOR LESLIE KANE

To ask the Chief Executive what is the current protocol regarding DCC tenants who are paying rent on their property, but not actually living in the property and leaving it vacant.

Q.64 COUNCILLOR NIAL RING

To ask the Chief Executive to outline the role and responsibilities of the Vacant Homes Officer and in particular his/her role in identifying, assessing and reporting of long-term vacant residential properties. Could the Chief Executive also outline the criteria and decision making process whereby a property can be deemed long-term vacant home.

To ask the Chief Executive to explain how anybody with no access to the Internet was informed of the pre-design public consultation for the College Green/Dame Street public realm project recently announced. Also, could the Chief Executive also explain how non-internet users could make submissions? Finally, to ask the Chief Executive if those involved in this project have been made aware of the fact that a significant number of members of the public do not have access to the internet and to take necessary steps to ensure their inclusion in the process

Q.66 COUNCILLOR NIAL RING

To ask the Chief Executive to detail what Planning Permission/requirements were necessary in order to allow the opening of the Medically Supervised Injection facility at Merchant's Quay Ireland's Riverbank Centre. In particular, can the Chief Executive

detail any and all conditions in the Permission designed to protect residents, retailers and schoolchildren in the surrounding streets from any drug/user related exposure.

Q.67 COUNCILLOR NIAL RING

To ask the Chief Executive for an update regarding the feasibility study for Housing at the Community Training Centre on St. Laurence Place East as well as details of the funding application with DHLGH. Also, to ask the Chief Executive to detail the other uses being considered for this building which was alluded to in the Housing Delivery Report (Adaptive Reuse).

Q.68 COUNCILLOR VINCENT JACKSON

To ask the Chief Executive can Dublin City Council please let me know what if anything we can do to help house the following person (**details supplied**)

Q.69 COUNCILLOR VINCENT JACKSON

To ask the Chief Executive to please look at (**details supplied**)

Q.70 COUNCILLOR VINCENT JACKSON

To ask the Chief Executive that Dublin City Council supports the continuation of community services at the Our Lady Hall Mourne Road Drimnagh Dublin 12. I have met the committee who do a wonderful job voluntary but they are finding it possible to meet insurance, utility and various running costs. This group needs to be helped to enable the full opportunities this the only fully community building has available to the local community. The centre needs various upgrades but they have nowhere to turn to get bathrooms, kitchens upgraded.

Q.71 COUNCILLOR VINCENT JACKSON

To ask the Chief Executive to look at the repainting of all public lampposts in the Ballyfermot area and indeed Drimnagh, Inchicore, Bluebell and Walkinstown. DCC and ESB have not re-painted the lamp standards in over 30 years and they are looking worst for wear. I have asked this question previously and was asked to identify specific lamp standards however all in our ownership and indeed the ESB need attention.

Q.72 COUNCILLOR EDEL MORAN

To ask the Chief Executive for an update on the proposed Development on the Former Chivers Factory site on Coolock Drive, Donnybrook, Dublin 17. Local residents have reported recent activity on the site and have requested the update.

Q.73 COUNCILLOR EDEL MORAN

To ask the Chief Executive to have the requested pavement repairs completed outside (**details supplied**). There is a hole in the footpath caused by Heavy Machinery during adaptation works which was covered with Plywood temporarily last May but the remedial works have not been carried out, the resident is wheelchair bound and cannot access or egress from the residence unaided as a result.

Q.74 COUNCILLOR EDEL MORAN

To ask the Chief Executive to have the "Dishing" of the Footpaths in the Ayrfield Estate inspected with a view to reducing the Gap between the pavement and the road surface , in particular outside (**details supplied**) and on the adjacent corner .
The resident here is wheelchair bound and finds the distance from the bottom of the "Dish " to the road surface too big to safely use unaided for access and egress while trying to go out of the estate to the Shops or the Churchyard access for the local Bus Route.

To ask the Chief Executive to examine the possibility of installing double yellow lines at (**Details supplied**)

Q.76 COUNCILLOR KEITH CONNOLLY

To ask the Chief Executive to arrange for the repair of the badly damaged and sunken roadway at (**details supplied**)

Q.77 COUNCILLOR KEITH CONNOLLY

To ask the Chief Executive to provide an update on the implementation of the E spine and F spine of the bus connects programme.

Q.78 COUNCILLOR KEITH CONNOLLY

To ask the Chief Executive to provide an update on the all-weather project for (**details supplied**)

Q.79 COUNCILLOR DECLAN FLANAGAN

To ask the Chief Executive for all litter to be removed from the Oscar Traynor road including piles of leaves near Cadburys factory.

Q.80 COUNCILLOR DECLAN FLANAGAN

To ask the Chief Executive can he make contact with (**details supplied**) who has been approved on exceptional social grounds and is in urgent need of housing? (**Details supplied**) had a meeting with Gillian Corcoran previously and is waiting a long time.

Q.81 COUNCILLOR DECLAN FLANAGAN

To ask the Chief Executive to advise if there are any plans to upgrade any libraries in the City next year. What libraries have been upgraded in the last 3 years?

Q.82 COUNCILLOR DECLAN FLANAGAN

To ask the Chief Executive can he advise how many waste management personnel are working in the various local offices throughout the city. Can a breakdown be provided of same please?

Q.83 COUNCILLOR KOURTNEY KENNY

To ask the Chief Executive to please arrange for maintenance to fix and replace if necessary the door of (**details supplied**) as the tenant is extremely unwell. The tenant also has no hot water in their taps which may mean their boiler is due to be replaced or serviced.

Q.84 COUNCILLOR KOURTNEY KENNY

To ask the Chief Executive to please arrange for maintenance to replace (**details supplied**) hall door.

Q.85 COUNCILLOR KOURTNEY KENNY

To ask the Chief Executive carry out a survey on Pine Road, Sean Moore Road, Ringsend, Dublin 4? The lights at Pine Road need to be assessed as it is getting significantly harder for the residents to be able to leave their estate with the influx of traffic.

Q.86 COUNCILLOR KOURTNEY KENNY

To ask the Chief Executive to arrange for the relevant members of Dublin City Council, to survey and revisit City Quay National School application for a safe school zone? Since their initial application in 2019 there has been 4 hotels built, this has led to more dangerous driving and the road essentially being used as a rat run for taxi's.

Q.87 COUNCILLOR DEIRDRE HENEY

To ask the Chief Executive to please refer to road at location as per (**details supplied**) and say if he can repair same.

Q.88 COUNCILLOR DEIRDRE HENEY

To ask the Chief Executive to please refer to road at location (**details supplied**) and say if he will carry out the necessary repairs/resurfacing as requested by local resident.

Q.89 COUNCILLOR DEIDRE HENEY

To ask the Chief Executive to please investigate (**details supplied**).

Q.90 COUNCILLOR DEIRDRE HENEY

To ask the Chief Executive to please refer to junction at location (**details supplied**) and say if he can at this stage, introduce a right turn filter as set out in (**details supplied**) and can he also say, why my previous requests to install a right turn filter at this location were not actioned.

Q.91 COUNCILLOR CAT O'DRISCOLL

To ask the Chief Executive to review the road layout at the entrance to Grace Park Wood, Drumcondra. When entering the estate by car from the south the removal of the filter lane is causing issues and there is an additional issue at low light as reflectors on recently installed bollards bounce light, impacting line of sight and potentially hiding oncoming cyclists.

Q.92 COUNCILLOR CAT O'DRISCOLL

To ask the Chief Executive to provide a progress report on the implementation of the 5% Cultural/Community Space in large developments since its introduction. How many planning applications met the criteria, is the toolkit being used and are there examples of community or cultural groups engaged in design stages

Q.93 COUNCILLOR CONOR REDDY

To ask the Chief Executive to outline any protocols that exist to rename public parks and roads when there are public calls for renaming and to ask for specific comment on the petition to rename Herzog Park, "Hind Rajab Park", a petition that has over 2700 signatures at time of submission of this question. Herzog Park honours Chaim Herzog, who joined the Haganah paramilitary in 1935, a force that was active in the ethnic cleansing of Palestine before and during the 1948 Nakba - this included massacres at Deir Yassin, Tantura, Lydda and Ramle. Chaim went on to become a Major-General in the Occupation Forces and the President of "israel" from 1983-93.

Q.94 COUNCILLOR CONOR REDDY

To ask the Chief Executive to provide details on the number of residential units owned and leased by Dublin City Council in the apartment complexes at Santry Cross (The Maieston, The Hampton, Turnpike, Linnbhla) and to provide a detailed update on maintenance at the complex, including an account of communication with the management company and other stakeholders.

Q.95 COUNCILLOR CONOR REDDY

To ask the Chief Executive to provide a detailed note on the Council's approach to ethical procurement and investment with specific reference to investment and procurement from companies who trade in or with "israel". This account should specifically address calls for compliance with the Boycott, Divestment and Sanctions (BDS) campaign and previous motions passed by Councillors to limit trade and investment with "israel", the "defense industry" and other unethical partners

Q.96 COUNCILLOR CONOR REDDY

To ask the Chief Executive arranges for CCTV and other measures (chute on bins, outreach) to be introduced at the clothes bank on Shangan Road where clothes are routinely pulled out of the clothes bank and illegal dumping follows. Waste Management refused to remove the bins despite unanimous support of local councillors. While councillors await further discussion with Waste Management, preventative measures could provide some improvement for local residents.

Q.97 COUNCILLOR DANIEL ENNIS

To ask the Chief Executive if he would consider the proposal by community members in North Wall to paint, repair and upgrade the Sheriff Street Lifting Bridge on Upper Sheriff Street, Dublin 1. It's a terrible eyesore and is not in line with the recent enhancements and improvements to the public realm in that area, and in particular - the renovations to the Royal Canal Walkaway

Q.98 COUNCILLOR DANIEL ENNIS

To ask the Chief Executive is there is any plans for the Cottage on the Royal Canal, on Charleville Mall at Newcomen Bridge and would he consider supporting an initiative involving Adventure & Water Sports - Kayaking and Mountain Biking, using the existing Cottage and surrounding area as a base for such activities.

Q.99 COUNCILLOR DANIEL ENNIS

To ask the Chief Executive he could investigate the reports that residents of Sean O'Casey Avenue, Summerhill have made in relation to the instillation of the wooden windows and council's persistence on their installation. Residents have complained about their unsuitability and in particular, their ability to retain heat

Q.100 COUNCILLOR DANIEL ENNIS

To ask the Chief Executive if lighting and electricity points could be installed in Liberty Park, Dublin 1 as a matter of urgency. Emergency services, when called upon to provide assistance, were in fact, fatally hampered by the lack of adequate lighting.

Q.101 COUNCILLOR RACHEAL BATTEN

To ask the Chief Executive for details in relation to large projects were we have worked with other Council's for the delivery of services in the past 12 months?

Q.102 COUNCILLOR RACHEAL BATTEN

To ask the Chief Executive if and when DCC has used the public procurement framework of approved bodies to make works more efficient.

Q.103 COUNCILLOR RACHEAL BATTEN

To ask the Chief Executive to outline what if any action is been taken to ensure posts are not acting for long periods of time.

Q.104 COUNCILLOR RAY MCADAM

To ask the Chief Executive to provide a list of all allocations awarded to organisations located within (**Details Attached**) under the Community Recognition Fund; and if he will make a statement on the matter.

Q.105 COUNCILLOR RAY MCADAM

To ask the Chief Executive to outline the actions that have been undertaken to date with regards the potential to CPO (**Details Attached**); what steps need to be taken, including through to An Bord Pleanala for these lands to be CPO'ed and if the Housing Department could examine their potential for public housing; and if he will make a statement on the matter.

Q.106 COUNCILLOR RAY MCADAM

To ask the Chief Executive to confirm that Dublin City Council will seek to CPO the lands at (**Details Attached**); and if he will make a statement on the matter.
