

**Motions to the Area Managers
Central Area Committee Meeting
11th February 2025**

Motion 1 from COUNCILLOR CHRISTY BURKE Submitted: 22/01/2025

That this Central Area Committee seek a report as to the defects on the entry gates and car park gates, at Dominick House complex and request, that once and for all, these be replaced without delay Also, that all fire alarms in the complex be checked by the fire chiefs and fire dept. to ensure they are in working order and that the lifts be cleaned on a day to day basis This complex is open one year now and the issues have been ongoing for same

Motion 2 from COUNCILLOR JANICE BOYLAN Submitted: 23/01/2025

That this area committee calls on management to have all the ongoing issues resolved in Dominick Hall. Residents have reported ongoing issues with sewerage, broken gates in the front of the building and at the car park, as well as car break-ins, due to the car park gates being broken for over four months. We are calling for all necessary action to be taken immediately.

Motion 3 from COUNCILLOR SEAMAS MCGRATTAN Submitted: 27/01/2025

This Area Committee supports the local campaign to locate a family resource centre in the Cabra area and calls on the new government to include Cabra in the next round of funding

Motion 4 from COUNCILLOR GAYLE RALPH Submitted: 28/01/2025

That this local area committee approves in principle the creation of an all weather astro pitch at the back of Albert College Park to support the growing community sports needs of Glasnevin FC and other local groups. Glasnevin FC currently serves over 300 players and 60 coaches. This pitch would address frequent match cancellations due to weather disruptions and provide a year round facility for football and other sports. The introduction of this all-weather facility and suitable changing rooms would encourage increased participation, particularly among children and young adults and contribute to the retention of female players. Furthermore, that this local area committee supports the development of Coolen House, adjacent to the Tram Café which is currently underutilised and could be used as a clubhouse for Glasnevin FC. This space could serve as a facility for club members and the broader community, accommodating age friendly activities, social functions and club administration.

Motion 5 from COUNCILLOR DANIEL ENNIS Submitted: 28/01/2025

I call on this central area committee to meet with a collection of residents and business owners from Stoneybatter to address the constant illegal dumping we are seeing. Further on, to identify black spots where this is happening around the area, explore deterrents and to support solutions to what is an awful scourge on the community

I call on this Central Area Committee to address the issues and explore deterrents, to open drug dealing and antisocial behaviour in almost every flat complex as well as on every street around the North Inner City

Motion 7 from COUNCILLOR CIERAN PERRY Submitted: 29/01/2025

Motion in the name of Councillors Cieran Perry & Nial Ring

This committee requests a multi-agency approach to the ongoing safety, trading and anti-social issues being experienced on Moore Street.

There are concerns about the proliferation of same shop usage, illegal subdivision, illegal change of use, illegal signage, illegal trading and most worryingly, breaches of health, safety and fire regulations and legislation.

We ask that the Fire Safety division of Dublin Fire Brigade, Building Control and Planning Enforcement urgently carry out a full investigation of all premises on Moore Street with a view to identifying any breaches of regulations and legislation pertaining to health and safety, fire safety, trading and anti-social behaviour.

We also ask that the Office of Revenue Commissioners and An Garda Síochána are included as part of the multi-agency approach.

This unique historic street has been allowed to deteriorate and to become a free for all in terms of retail offerings, both legal and illegal, as well as a focus for anti-social behaviour. We cannot allow the street to remain in its current condition while we await the outcome of the An Bord Pleanála decision and a possible Judicial Review of the Hammersons proposals or confirmation on whether Hammersons will proceed with the development if granted planning permission.
