PRIMARY ROLE OF WASTE REGULATION AND ENFORCEMENT

- To ensure compliance by relevant Industries and Businesses with their responsibilities under the Waste Management Acts (WMA) and relevant waste regulations
- ➤ To tackle, prevent and/or take enforcement action against those involved in serious incidents of illegal disposal of waste
- To plan and report on the National Waste Enforcement Priorities for assessment by the EPA (RMCEI)
- ► To act in accordance with powers granted to authorised Waste Enforcement Officers under the WMA
- ► To deal with complaints from the public and to carry out a series planned and unplanned inspections and actions in accordance with the annual LA framework assessment plan
