Halloween Materials collection

The Council has carried out dozens of stockpiling raids on the run-up to Halloween. It's all part of its drive to promote a safe Halloween that all the community can enjoy. Central area alone collected 400 tyres and 150 wood pallets on the run-up to Halloween.

Public Domain unit organised Inspections of tyre garages in Central area. Both Litter Wardens and the Gardai visited 12 tyre garages in the vicinity to carry out inspections.

Central Area has also taken another proactive approach to bonfire material detection and we have deployed a drone to monitor derelict and vacant sites in the vicinity.
