




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


National Paediatric Hospital Project

- Main NCH at St James's Hospital campus (SJH), (160,000m2 approx)
 - 473 beds (380 In-patient & 93 day care). Single rooms with ensuite and family area
 - Advanced diagnostics, intervention and theatre facilities
 - Play areas, external gardens and courtyards
 - Therapy area with hydro pool & gym
 - Third Level Education Centre & Hospital School
 - 1,000 space car park (35,000m²)
 - Existing building to be demolished 20,000m²
- Children's Research & Innovation Centre at SJH (3,000m² approx)
- 53 bed family accommodation unit adjacent to the hospital at SJH (4,400m² approx)
- Contractors holding compound for material deliveries at Davitt Roads (0.8ha site)
- Children's Hospital Satellite Centres at Tallaght & Connolly Hospitals (4,500m2 & 5,000m2 approx)










DUBLIN CITY COUNCIL'S 2016-2022 DRAFT CITY PLAN





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
