Crime Prevention Matters and Other Information	Garda Clinic Edenmore. Office provided by Dermot McHugh owner of the centre. Project put in place by Gda Eoin Beatty. This is not an official Clinic; this is costing nothing as the members open it on days they are working. It has no set opening hours; opening hours will depend on the hours Eoin Beatty is working. The 10/1/17 was the first day it was open between 12-3pm. Great response. Very positive from everyone. The advantage of such a facility is that elderly people can call to the Clinic to meet the Gardai. People can also talk to the Gardai in private and it s also a great way for the Public to get to know their Local community Garda. During the opening hours of the Clinic the members seized <u>cannabis from a youth, They detected illegal dumping, and</u> <u>one account trespass.</u>				
	A bicycle registration scheme has been put in place for the Coolock Sub District. This is so far a local project. It involves advertising and inviting members of the public to the Garda Station on arranged days where details of their bicycles are recorded and entered on to an excel sheet. The purpose of this project is to identify stolen bicycles reported to the Gardai and have them returned to their owners. It is hoped that in the future all members will have access to this information through Pulse and more bicycles will be returned to their owners.
