- There have been 218 detections for the Sale/Supply of Drugs as opposed to 184 for the same period last year, representing an increase of 18%
- There have been 61 arrests for Driving whilst intoxicated in 2016 in comparison to 75 for the same period last year an decrease of 19%
- 1 Fatal Road Traffic Accidents is recorded in 2016, in comparison to 0 for the same period last year an increase of 100%
- 1279 Public Order Incidents are recorded in 2016 as opposed to 1684 in 2015, showing a decrease of 24%
- 203 Incidents of Drunkenness are recorded in 2016 as opposed to 169 in 2015, an increase of 20%
- 90 Incidents of Assault causing Harm are recorded in 2016, as opposed to 113 in 2015, a decrease of 20%
- 100 incidents of Minor Assault are recorded in 2016 as opposed to 116 in the same period last year showing a decrease of 14%
