Management to follow up on creating a "hang out space" with more wi-fi spots for teenagers.

Action: The Manager stated he would request Smart Cities to look at this and perhaps run a pilot project in one location in each of the 5 areas.

Issues regarding the removal of bins in parks and dog fowling were raised. The Manager informed members that some of the bins have and will be replaced.

Members were informed the Luke Kelly statues will be unveiled on 30^{th} January 2019 by the President of Ireland. The first statue will be unveiled at 2.00 p.m. on South King Street. The second statue will be unveiled at 3.30 - 4.00 p.m. on Guild Street. There will be refreshments in the Laurence O'Toole Community Centre afterwards and a concert will take place later that evening in Liberty Hall.

Gerry Kerr commented that he did not feel some management initiatives were adequately communicated and requested that more resources be put into Smart Cities / digital communications across the various areas.

Gerry also informed members that for St. Patrick's Day Festival there will be 270 wheelchair accessible spots. Members were also informed that a new mobile toilet / changing area "changing places" for people with various disabilities will be installed in major locations around the city.

The Chair commended Gerry Kerr on his input to this Committee in particularly raising awareness on disability issues.
