- a. DCC's Register of Public Arts is being updated by an Assistant Arts Officer and will include cataloguing of the Public Art Collection on the TMS system. This is an internationally recognised computer based catalogue and can enable online access to data (e.g. similar to Hugh Lane collection details). It is hoped that in addition to the raw data such as, name of artist, title, date, material, location, etc. there will be short biographical texts on the artists and about the artworks including public sculptures and statues. Meanwhile, Dublin City Council has facilitated Fáilte Ireland and Sing London with a project to 'animate' statues in the city where though mobile phone technology listeners can hear texts written by well know writers voiced by actors. (10 statues in this project.) Children's colouring book project proposed for O'Connell Street statues.
