### Environment and Transportation

### Control of Stationless On-Street Bicycle Hire Bye-Laws

Bleeperbike operations are continuing to operate successfully. BleeperBikes licence has been renewed for a further 3 years. An information session was held on 9<sup>th</sup> April for potential applicants for the second operator's licence. An invitation for applicants was posted on the Dublin City Council website on 12<sup>th</sup> April and the closing date for applications is 12 noon, Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> May.

### Pay & Display Machine replacement programme

120 existing Pay and Display Ticket machines are being replaced with multifunction Pay and Display ticket machines under the machine lease contract. In addition to accepting coin payment these will also facilitate card terminal and contactless payments for parking.

### Parking Tag and alternative methods of paying for parking

The average number of transactions per week is now in excess of 117,000 representing 50% of weekly Pay and Display revenue. There are 185,000 active accounts, an increase of 8,000 since last month. The Council will shortly issue a Request for Tender for provision of the Parking Tag service for all Dublin Local authorities, Meath County Council and Kildare County Council.

### Dublin City Council Parking Control Bye Laws 2019

The Draft Bye Laws public consultation has closed and the report recommendations have been accepted by the SPC. The Bye-Laws will now go before Full Council on the 13<sup>th</sup> of May for adoption.

### Car Clubs

Two Car Clubs remain operational on-street and have availed of 155 Car Club Permits and applications received for a further 50 permits. There are currently 19 dedicated car club only bays in the City. Discussion is ongoing with both operators who are seeking additional permits in order to expand their services and the number of vehicles located on-street, including additional EV vehicles.

#### Electric Vehicle Parking/Charging

There are currently 35 dedicated EV only bays located on-street and further sites are being reviewed for suitability. The Council is currently working on a project on trialling an on-street EV charge point which is expected to be launched in Q2 2019.

#### Road Maintenance Services

The Roads Maintenance Services is in the process of holding Tender competitions to appoint contractors to deliver the Annual Works Programme for 2019. Road resurfacing and reconstruction works have commenced and are ongoing across the city. Footpath renewal and repair contracts are scheduled to commence in June. The works programme is on target to be delivers by year end.

### Licensing Unit

### Casual Trading

There are approximately 260 Causal Traders Licenced in designated pitches in DCC. Event trading licences are issued for events at the Aviva Stadium, Croke Park, 3 Arena, St. Patrick's Festival and other events taking place throughout the year in the City. There were a number of rugby and soccer matches in the Aviva Stadium in April. Up to 50 traders traded at each of these events. The four Assistant Inspectors attended the area around the Aviva to enforce the Casual Trading Bye-Laws.

### Street Performance

131 yearly Street Performance permits have been issued so far in 2019, with 38 visitor permits. The most popular areas for Street performers are Grafton Street and Henry Street. The permits are issued in accordance with the Street Performers Bye-laws 2016. The Assistant Inspectors are on Grafton Street/Henry Street and other areas daily and have issued 23 warning notices to date in 2019 for breeches of the Street Performers Bye-Laws.

### Dublin Waste to Energy Community Gain Projects Grant Scheme

The Dublin Waste to Energy Community Gain Projects Grant Scheme 2019 is now closed for applications. 48 applications have been received and will be assessed by the committee. €1.5 million will be available for disbursement to eligible projects within the Irishtown, Ringsend and Sandymount catchment area.

### Dublin City Neighbourhoods and Pride of Place Competitions 2019

Preparations are underway for the local City Neighbourhoods and the all-island IPB Pride of Place competitions. Entry forms for the Dublin City Neighbourhoods will be distributed in the coming weeks and groups will be nominated for the all-island IPB Pride of Place Competition.

# Dublin City Clean-up Day – 27<sup>th</sup> April 2019

The biggest Dublin Community Clean-up event ever, took place on the 27<sup>th</sup> April 2019. 180 groups of volunteers from the 4 Local Authorities, together with an Taisce's National Spring Clean, Canal Clean-up groups, Clean Coasts and Dodder Action Group registered with an Taisce. 110 of groups that registered were volunteers from the Dublin City Council area. Waste Management Services provided equipment such as bags, gloves, Hi-Viz, brushes and hoes. Over 1,000 bags of litter, leaves and detritus were collected by the volunteers.

### Herzog Park Bring Centre Realignment

The refurbishment of the bring centre site is ongoing. The bring centre will re-open with a limited capacity in mid-May.

### Draft Climate Change Action Plan

The Draft Climate Change Action Plan was formerly launched by the Lord Mayor in the Mansion House on the 16<sup>th</sup> February. The public consultation phase ran until the 25<sup>th</sup> March. It was agreed by the SPC to recommend to the City Council that the DCC Climate Change Action Plan 2019 – 2024 be adopted.

### Velo-city 2019

Dublin City Council will host the Velo-city 2019 international cycling conference in the Convention Centre, Dublin from the 25th to the 28th June 2019. The Velo-city conference is the European Cyclists' Federation (ECF) annual global cycling summit and is the world's largest conference in the area of cycling, cycling infrastructure, bicycle innovations, bicycle safety, and the social and cultural changes driven by cycling on a global scale.

The conference, <u>'Cycling for the Ages'</u>, will explore visions for the cycling city of the future and how we get there from the cycling city of today; how can we support and design to ensure measures taken are inclusive for all ages, abilities and nationalities. With just over 3 months to go, we are getting ready to welcome over 1500 delegates to Dublin for 4 days of thought-provoking plenaries, programme sessions, exhibitions and networking.

### Planning & Property Development

### 1. NEW POLICY/STRATEGIC

The Planning and Property Development Department is continuing work with the Housing Department on a number of housing initiatives, including MUHDS (Major Urban Housing Developments Sites) and the Housing Land Initiative. On the 17<sup>th</sup> October a joint Planning SPC and Housing SPC Workshop was held in the Mansion House. The Poolbeg SDZ Planning Scheme has been approved by An Board Pleanála and will provide a New Urban Neighbourhood of some 3,500 houses. The Ballymun LAP has been approved by the City Council and will significantly contribute to the continued regeneration of the city. The LAP Work Programme has been reviewed and prioritised. Work has commenced on the Cherry Orchard LAP and the implementation of the Clongriffin-Belmayne LAP. The Regulations relating to the Planning & Development (Housing) and Residential Tenancies Act 2016 came into effect in 2017 in relation to applications for 100 or more residential units and 200 or more student bed spaces, (which now go to An Bord Pleanála direct) and Part 8 applications (which must be passed by the City Council within 6 weeks of receipt of the Chief Executive's Report). The new National Planning Framework 2040 provides for 265,000 extra population and associated infrastructure in the Dublin Area. The DHPLG has published new Guidelines for Planning Authorities in March 2018. "Sustainable Urban Housing" Design standards for new apartments. On the 13<sup>th</sup> September, Government established a new Land Development Agency, to expedite state lands for development and drive strategic land assembly. The draft Regional Spatial and Economic Strategy was on display until the 23<sup>rd</sup> January 2019 and is scheduled for consideration by the Regional Assembly in May 2019. A presentation on the draft RSES was given to elected representatives on the 27<sup>th</sup> November 2018 in the Axis Centre Ballymun. In December 2018 the DHPLG published Guidelines on Urban Development and Building Heights. The City Council has embarked on a major review of Z6 industrial land banks, following a presentation to the Planning SPC and the City Council in March
