**With reference to a Naming and Numbering proposal for a development
at the corner of Infirmery Road and Montpelier Hill, Dublin 7 (Ref 3210/19).**

Development information

This is a Dublin City Council development located at the corner of Infirmery Road and Montpelier Hill, Dublin 7 that will consist of 38 Social Housing Support dwellings (site location map attached).

Address Proposal

The developer has requested that the development be addressed “[numbers 1 to 38] Red House Square / Cearnóg Tí Dheirg” Montpelier Hill, Dublin 7.

Name Methodology

The name “Red House” is the informal name given to the free-standing building located to the northwest corner of this housing development site which was designed as office accommodation for Ordnance Stores staff in 1882. The buildings were converted, in 1905, for the use of the Royal Army Medical Corps and married soldier’s quarters.

A detailed Military Archive site plan, from 1921/1928, refers to the Marriage Quarters’ building as the “Red House”. Of all the historic buildings that was on this site, the “Red House” is a lone survivor and has become a protected structure.

Heritage Officer Report

The City Councils’ Heritage Officer has considered the proposed name and gives a recommendation that the name is appropriate.

Recommendation

The address “Red House Square / Cearnóg Tí Dheirg” Montpelier Hill, Dublin 7 [individual housing dwellings numbers 1 to 38] is considered suitable and is recommended for adoption.
