

### **Proposed New Bin Stores for Oliver Bond**

Dublin City Council are proposing to install new bin stores in the Oliver Bond Complex and has identified five locations in the complex. These locations are detailed on the accompanying aerial photo including which blocks will be serviced by each bin store. Also attached is photo of proposed design.

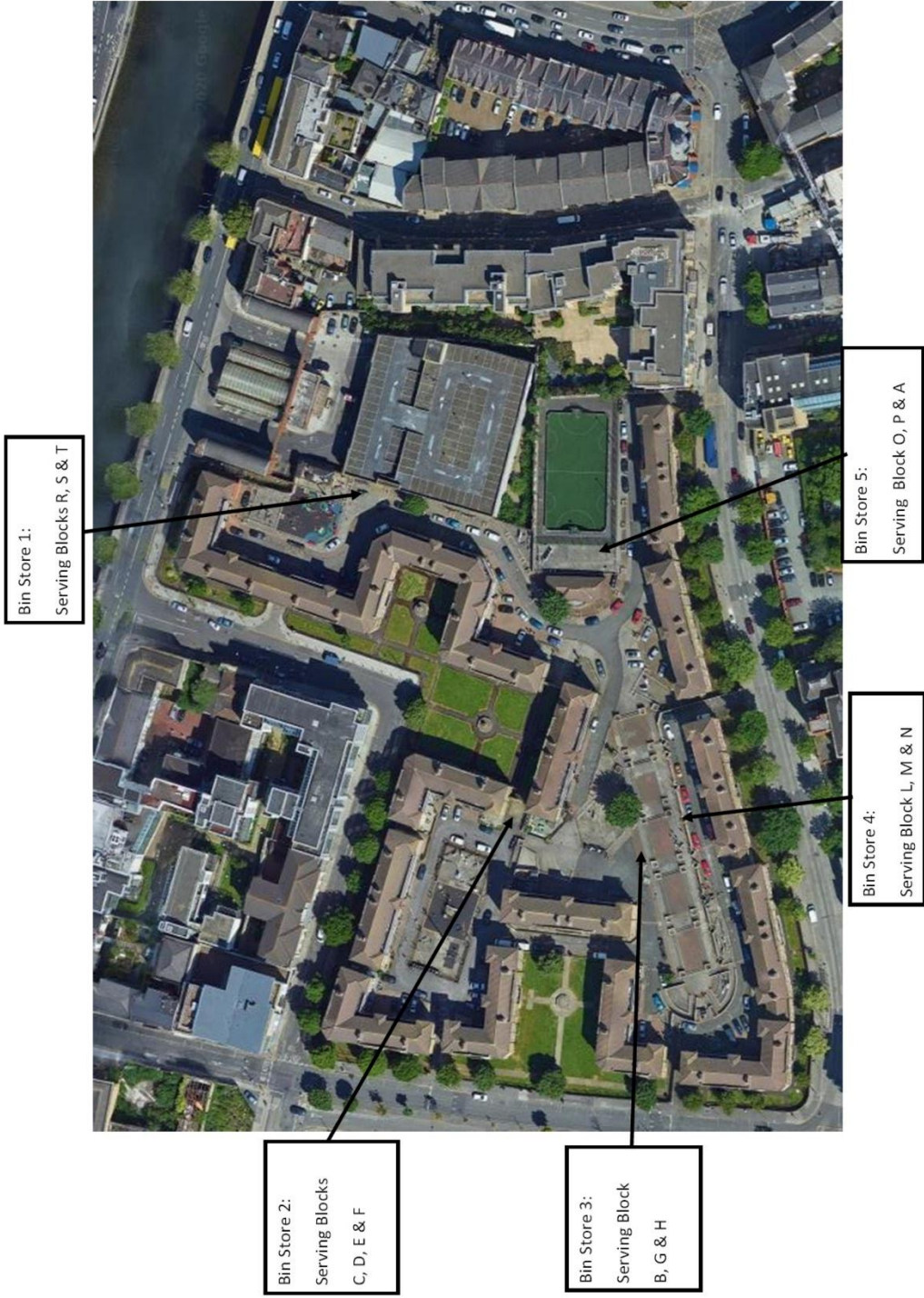
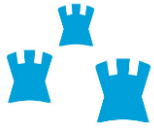
In March 2019, Dublin City Council introduced a waste recycling program which will see the introduction of Green (mixed dry recyclables), and Brown (food waste) bins to all DCC owned complexes. Residents will be provided with a reusable recycle bag, a 7Ltr food cabbie and a roll of compostable bags. This program will be integrated into the planning of these bin stores.

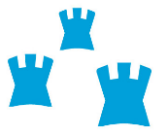
These secure bin stores will be crucial in the efforts to reduce fly tipping in the area by moving the bin locations away from the entrances and will improve access to the complex for emergency & work vehicles. Dublin City Council has been working with the tenants to improve proper disposal of rubbish by tenants and would envisage an improvement to the area by the installation of the bin stores and the cooperation of tenants. The bin store area will be monitored by CCTV to help dissuade fly tipping and improper disposal of rubbish.

Consultation will be beginning shortly with the Oliver Bond Residents Committee and Robert Emmet Community Development Project will be instrumental to the communication process.
