Greening Stoneybatter Strategy

Over a period of eight months, Parks, Biodiversity and Landscape Services, working with facilitator Dave Dunn, public-realm designers Urban Agency and ecologist Mary Tubridy have run a codesign process to work with local residents to collectively develop a vision and strategy for a greener Stoneybatter.

This report sets out the conclusion of this collaboration, which has generated a great deal of discussion (250+ participants) and 41 firm ideas from local residents and community groups, as well as key projects identified by the design team.

Rather than piecemeal projects, the strategy aims to set a framework for the planning, design and implementation of green infrastructure interventions as an integrated network of parks, open spaces, tree-lined streets and other nature-based solutions to deliver on UN sustainability goals and climate-action objectives.

As many of the projects illustrated in this report involve interventions on streets and carriageways, they will each have to be subjected to a more technical design process, which will involve the skills and experience of the Environment and Transport Department of Dublin City Council.
