Dublin City Council collects hundreds of tonnes of fallen leaves from the city streets each Autumn. Main thoroughfares and arterial routes into the city are cleared on an ongoing basis during this time.

Halloween 2020

In the month of October Dublin City Council staff from Housing Department, Waste Management Services, Central Area Office and private contractors removed bonfire materials from housing complexes, open spaces and derelict sites. The materials included 1,136 pallets, 170 tyres, 28 sofas and 23 beds and mattresses along with flooring and wooden planks.

This year has seen a big reduction in the number of tyres collected. Waste Enforcement inspectors carried out audits on tyre sales outlets and have reported a high compliance rate with Repac requirements.

Gardaí have been seizing materials from youths and bringing them back to the stations for removal by DCC. The assistance of An Garda Síochána in accessing stock piles and providing protection to DCC staff is acknowledged and appreciated.
