

MINUTES OF THE CLIMATE ACTION, ENERGY AND ENVIRONMENT STRATEGIC POLICY COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON 26th OCTOBER 2020

1 Climate Change Action Plan 2020

Members welcomed the report and in particular expressed gratitude for the work of the Climate Action Subcommittee and Officials

Members raised the following question / observations in relation to the report that was circulated

- The Dublin Agreement does not appear to be referenced in the report (JC)
- Has 70% of the housing stock been retrofitted in terms of energy efficiency (JC)
- Should the recent Covid Mobility measures (cycle lanes, street Pedestrianisation etc.) be included in the report (MF)
- The issue of adequate recycling facilities in Council Flat Complexes remains unresolved (MF)
- We are ahead of the curve with our plan as mitigation measures are included in the plan (CB)
- Grateful for the work on the Subcommittee (CB)
- Can a glossary of terms be included in the plan (RM)
- This process predates the Dublin Agreement and in fact this SPC (NOM)
- The Dublin Agreement was adopted by the City Council (JC)
- The report is a bit light in terms of engagement (RM)

Céline Reilly responded

- A report in relation to the Climate element of the Dublin Agreement will issue to a future meeting of the Climate Action Subcommittee.
- The Council's Climate Team has only recently been established and it is intended that the engagement element of the plan will be developed and expanded over the coming months.
- We intend to increase the recycling facilities in Council Flat Complexes
- The retrofitting has taken place in 70% of the Council Houses.

2 Litter Management Plan 2020 -2022

Members raised the following questions / observations in relation to the reports that were circulated

- The development and adoption of the plan has been delayed due to Covid 19 and extended public consultations, the Committee should endorse the plan and support its implementation (NOM)
- How is the size of the openings on public litter bins determined (NOM)
- Will there be public compostable bins (CB)
- What is the position on the shared bins scheme (CB)
- Are additional Litter Wardens , Litter Bins required (CB)
- What additional measures can be introduced to tackle illegal dumping (CB)
- Did Covid-19 and the associated restrictions impact on the level of submissions as part of the Public Consultation (CB)
- The proliferation of Mask / PPE is a problem, are measures being introduced to address this (RM)
- What is the position in relation to Community Composting (RM)
- Acknowledge the efforts of Waste Management Staff to keep the streets clean (MF)
- Bring Centres need to be managed better to eradicate the incidences of illegal dumping (MF)
- There appears to be an increase in drug misuse paraphernalia(MF)
- Council Flat Complexes do not have adequate recycling facilities (MF)
- There should be a litter management portal on the Council's website which would centralise complaints, illegal dumping reports, street grading, street cleaning schedules, statistics etc.(TC)
- Litter bin supply should be increased in residential areas (TC)
- Are there any details on the provision of underground recycling / waste facilities (TC)
- Is there scope for areas not covered by the IBAL reports to be surveyed (TC)
- Can Community Clean up statistics be reported (TC)
- Is there a formalised criteria for litter bin provision, if so can it be forwarded to the Committee (MP)
- Support the idea of a Litter Portal on the Council's website (MP)
- Are bins going to be continued to be removed from residential areas (MW)
- How many bins are planned for the South West Inner City (MW)
- Litter is careless and bad behaviour whereas illegal dumping is more deliberate (JC)
- The North Inner City is consistently at / near the top of the IBAL survey (JC)
- Can there be a more intensive approach to combatting Litter / Illegal Dumping in the North Inner City (JC)
- Are we still engaging with Community Clean ups during Covid restrictions (JC)
- It is worth restating the problem of litter and illegal dumping in the North Inner City (JH)
- Should a task force be established to focus on the North inner City (JH)
- Don't accept that litter bins are not required in residential areas (JH)
- The Kayaking Group undertake litter removal from the Liffey, can anything be done to support this (JH)
- Are we locked into a long contract for the provision of solar compactor bins (JH)
- There is a problem with overflowing bins in the East Wall area.(JH)

Simon Brock responded

- A balance has to be struck in relation to the size of the litter bin openings, large enough to accept general litter but small enough to discourage household waste being deposited
- Suggestions in relation to the design of bins are welcomed
- The aim is to have the right amount of litter bins in the right locations
- A trial of on street compostable bins is anticipated in order to ascertain the quality of the material deposited
- Primary problem with coffee cups is that they are not readily recyclable in Ireland
- How Community Bins service will operate has to be designed and we are working with the Council's BETA Project Team on this.
- The supply of litter bins will be increased
- Individuals are not sure how to dispose of Masks / PPE, my waste.ie should be consulted
- As soon as further details on Community Composting is available it will be forwarded to Members
- Textile recycling is being reviewed, there has been an increase in demand at Bring Centre & CA sites
- Crews continuously clean up drug related litter
- Underground bins would be costly and it is not clear if the industry is in a position to service such units.
- The provision of a Litter Management portal will be included in the Communications element of the plan.
- The installation of Litter Bins in residential areas are considered but is not deemed best use of resources.
- If a residential area has an absolute requirement for a litter bin one will be installed
- The IBAL report is one element of Litter surveys. The Council carry out surveys which feed into the National Litter Pollution Monitoring System
- We report on Community Clean ups in the Litter Management Plan updates.
- A document on Litter Bin Criteria issued to the SPC previously and will be forwarded to Members
- Bins are removed from residential areas (for misuse) as a last resort and we endeavour to relocate a bin to a location as near as practicable to the original siting.
- The Landlord issue in relation to litter / illegal dumping is being examined.
- A Subcommittee of the Central Area Committee has been established to examine the litter issue and Waste Management Services will support any recommendations made
- Issue of overflowing bins in east Wall will be resolved.
- We are examining a proposal from the Dublin Nautical Trust in relation to litter in the Liffey.
- The contract for the supply of solar compactor bins is of fixed duration
