2. South Central Matters

a) Update on Building Community Resilience – Peter Dorman

Update since last meeting on the work that has been carried out on the five different strands -

- Supporting the four LPF's and the JPC
- Restorative Practice
- Responding to the street based drug trade.
- Focused on organisers/leaders of crime in the area.
- Focused on connecting with policy.
- b) Presentation by Justin O'Brien "Minors and Anti-Social Behaviour in Inchicore".

The following points of interest were discussed and comment given by the members present

- An integrated approach to tackling the issue of Minors engaged in anti social behaviour is essential.
- Similar piece of work carried out in Drimnagh after Halloween in 2019.
- It was suggested to pilot a coordinated approach between Drimnagh, Inchicore and Bluebell, as which was recognised in previous meetings, anti-social behaviour tends to be fluid and it tends to move between neighbouring communities the response to it also needs to be fluid.
- A coordinated approach between the youth groups within the entire area needs to be established.
- Value of education needs to be highlighted to minors in the area.
- There is an opportunity to use some of the existing structures such as strand 3 of Building Community resilience to deal with the issue.
- Drimnagh report to be launched in the next few weeks.

Action: To establish a sub group to tackle causes and consequences for under age anti-social behaviour in Inchicore, Drimnagh and Bluebell.

The group should focus on 3 things.

- 1. Identify the challenges and quantify the problem.
- 2. Identify the relevant services in the respective areas.

3. Outline how these services could operate with a more integrated, coordinated approach in order tackle the causes and consequences for underage anti-social behaviour.

To ensure the membership is a cross section of the JPC the working group should include a rep from each sector. We should aim for a rep from youth services, LDTF, DCC, Gardaí and the community.

Report back to next JPC.

3. Garda Matters

Garda reports from: -DMR South Division for Crumlin District & Terenure Sub-District DMR South Central Division for Kevin Street and Kilmainham Stations DMR West Division for Ballyfermot Garda Station **Order: Reports noted.**

The following issues were raised and a response was given by members of An Garda Síochána present at the meeting: -

- Both burglaries and robberies are down by a significant percentage.
- Domestic violence continues to be a growing issue of concern.
- Increase in drug related crime is this in line with other areas in Dublin? What is specifically being done to tackle this issue?
- Public order offences have increased.
- Theft of bicycles need to be addressed –
- Local retail workers need support from AGS in the enforcement of government mandates of mask wearing.
- Staffing levels of AGS
- Increase in car theft.
- Issue around scramblers and quad bikes in the area what can be put in place now to ensure that an increase in use does not happen around Christmas as it did last year.
- The use of electric scooters by children in the Dublin 12 area.
- The use of Drones in relation to supplying drugs to the prisons in the area.
