#### NORTH EAST INNER CITY PROGRAMME OFFICE REPORT

### 2021 Funding

A further round of funding proposals totaling €440,906 was approved by the NEIC Programme Implementation Board at its meeting held on 28<sup>th</sup> April 2021. This latest round of approvals brings the total amount to €4.72M of the overall €6.5M allocated by the Government to the North East Inner City Initiative for 2021. All 2021 projects approved to date are listed under the relevant Sub-Group heading on the attached table **Appendix 1**. The table will be updated on an ongoing basis as further funding proposals are approved. The projects approved at the April Board Meeting are as follows:

(Note: those marked with \* are approved under the 'Emerging Needs' €250K heading)

### Sub-Group 1 - Enhanced Policing

### Training Bursary - Understanding and Responding to Domestic Abuse - €5,600

Level 8 Course being run by Dundalk IT <u>Certificate in the Fundamentals of Understanding and Responding to Domestic Abuse</u>. Attendance by 4 Community Representatives and 4 members of An Garda Siochána assigned to the Domestic Abuse Co-Ordinator Programme (Store St.). This accredited programme is the first of its kind to be offered in Ireland and aims to support learners in the development of an appropriate level of knowledge, skill and understanding to enable them to appropriately recognise and respond to domestic abuse.

### **Sub-Group 2 – Maximising Educational, Training & Employment Opportunities**

# ICRG (Inner City Renewal Group / Eastside & Docklands Local Employment Service) Bursary 2021 - €10,000

Practical supports to reduce barriers and to enable low-income young people to access education and training programmes e.g. assistance with costs of workwear, IT equipment. It is envisaged that 30-40 young people will benefit with an average grant of €200-€500 per person.

### **Sub-Group 3 – Family Wellbeing**

# The Oasis Centre, St. Laurence Place East – Expanded Programme of Counselling and Mental Health Supports - €12,000\*

Additional funding for The Oasis Centre to provide an expanded programme of supports in response to increased demand for services as a result of Covid 19. These include mindfulness, bereavement support and 'Living with Covid – the aftermath' workshops.

## **Sub-Group 4 – Enhanced Community Wellbeing and the Physical Environment**

# Intercultural Development Co-Ordinator – Extension of Post for a further year (Salary Contribution and Programme Costs) - €60,800

The first Intercultural Development Co-Ordinator was appointed by Dublin City Council in June 2020. The post was co-funded by NEIC and Department of Justice. Considerable progress has been made by the Co-ordinator in Year 1 in advancing the objectives of the Government's Migrant Integration Strategy at local level. Approval was granted to fund the post for a further year (co-fund with Department of Children, Equality, Diversity, Inclusion & Youth) together with programme funding to advance key projects in the coming year i.e. Intercultural Ambassador Programme and the Roma Cultural Mediation Programme.

# **Sub-Group 6 – Alignment of Services**

### **HSE Multi-Disciplinary Team Extension for a further year - €405,777**

The Multidisciplinary Team (MDT) was set up in October 2020. This team, comprising of an enhanced NEPS service and HSE Speech & Language Therapy, Occupational Therapy and and Psychology, provide a 3 tiered model of holistic support to all children (1,800 pupils) in the 10 Primary schools in the North East Inner City (NEIC). The approved funding will provide for retention of the MDT for a further year from 01/09/2021 to 31/08/2022.

#### Neic Community Grant Scheme 2021 - €100,000

The <u>NEIC Community Grant Scheme 2021</u> is now open for applications. This year's theme is 'Emerging from Covid 19'. A total of €100,000 is available for distribution to community and voluntary organisations to support projects and activities that qualify under the terms of the Scheme. The Scheme <u>Guidelines</u> and <u>Application Form</u> are available to download from <u>www.neic.ie</u> It is anticipated that assessment of the grant applications will take place in June for final approval by the NEIC Board at the June meeting (30<sup>th</sup> June). Payment of grants to successful applicants will follow in the first weeks of July.
