- Mentors available to facilitate, set up and promote SECs

Why are we doing this?






The Bill contains a National Climate Objective which commits the country to "... pursue and achieve, by no later than the end of the year 2050" carbon neutral status

The SEC Journey





SEAI Programme



- A funding and Support Programme
- 3 stages:
 - Learn
 - Plan
 - Do
- The mentor will guide SEC through stages
- Can apply for funding to prepare EMP (€10-25k)

How it Works (3 Stages)

Once you have joined the network, your Sustainable Energy Community will be provided with a dedicated local mentor to guide you through the three stages of the programme, 'Learn', 'Plan' and 'Do'.



You begin to implement energy projects in your community.


Typical measures that have been carried out to date by SECs in the Dublin and Mid-East region include LED lighting upgrades, solar photovoltaic (PV) panels, heat pumps, heating controls and insulation, and energy retrofits of individual houses.

You will receive 2 days of support from your local mentor to support you through this stage.

DCC Role



- CoDEMA Regional Coordinator
- DCC is facilitating SECs to overcome barriers
 - Cash Flow
 - Administration
 - Procurement
- DCC procures Experts for SEC Energy Master Plan
- DCC pays experts, recoups from SEAI
- Can apply for funding to prepare Plan (€10-25k)

Implementation Grants

Grants from SEAI help cover the cost of work including:

Grants Available

Non- Residential	Not-for-profit / community	30% up to* 50% (may be available subject to State aid rules and SEAI approval in advance)
	Private and public sector	Up to 30%
	EV charging points	Up to 30%


