There are major traffic safety concerns in the East Wall, North Strand and Ballybough areas due to the impending construction of the CCCC and subsequent road closures and traffic diversions.

Furthermore, at the advance traffic planning stage and throughout the construction phase of the above project, DCC will, in the interests of safety, and by whatever means

necessary proactively ensure North Strand and East Wall will not be used for any traffic diversions and preventative measures to eliminate rat running will be put in place prior to construction work/lane closures.

DCC will at an early stage report to the local area committee on how it intends to achieve the above mentioned traffic management.

Exit and entrance roads in the East Wall, North Strand and Ballybough Areas: West Road, Church Road, Forth Road, East Road, Leinster Avenue, Northbrook Avenue, Annesley Place, Poplar Row, Spring Garden Street, Bayview Avenue, Charleville Avenue, Clonmore Road, Clonliffe Avenue, Foster Terrace, Sackville Avenue.

Dublin City Council has air quality monitoring stations in the North Inner City at the following locations:

- 1. Custom House Quay monitoring PM10 and PM2.5
- 2. Dublin Port, Tolka Quay Rd. monitoring PM10, PM2.5, NO2 and SO2
- 3. Amiens St. monitoring PM10 and PM2.5
- 4. Park House, North Circular Rd. monitoring PM10 and PM2.5

The results of this monitoring for all air quality stations in Dublin can be viewed in real time at https://dublincityairandnoise.ie/

In terms of a summary of their most recent findings, the charts below indicate the results from 1 June to 1 July 2021. By way of reference the EU annual limit values for the pollutants in question are:

PM10 – 40 microgrammes per cubic metre (ug/m³)

PM2.5 - 20 microgrammes per cubic metre (ug/m³)

NO2 - 40 microgrammes per cubic metre (ug/m³)


SO2 - not applicable – however 125 μg/m3, not to be exceeded more than 3 times a calendar year

This recent data indicates that air quality in the area is within EU legal limit values.

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








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Air Quality Levels at TU Dublin - Park House

The section of the Royal Canal between Cross Guns Bridge and Broombridge is included in The Royal Canal Greenway Phase 4 Project, which runs between Ashtown and Phibsborough (section shown in blue on the map below).



Fig. 1: Royal Canal Greenway Cycle Scheme Projects: Phases 2,3 and 4

In order to provide sufficient width along some sections of the route it is now proposed to widen the canal towpath into the canal along three sections (total approx. 1km of alteration to the canal bank). One of these sections lies between Cross Guns Bridge and Broombridge - between the 6th lock and Coke Oven Cottages. The changes proposed require an amending Part 8 application. The image below shows the three sections for which an amending Part 8 application is required.

Pre-Part 8 consultation has taken place with the relevant departments in recent weeks. In addition, consultation with the residents of Coke Oven Cottages has been ongoing since 2020 in order to ensure the design meets their requirements. It is intended to submit the Part 8 application in July or August 2021 with anticipated approval in October or November 2021. Full details and plans for the section between Cross Guns Bridge and Broombridge will be available to the wider public under the Part 8 public consultation process.

At present, it is planned that construction works will commence on the scheme in November or December 2021.

A decision to remove or replace the historic paving materials should form part of an overall public realm plan for (details supplied), rather than simply removing the setts (cobbles) and their replacement with tarmac.

- Installation of a ramp on Avondale Road to the south of the Dublin Bikes Station.
- Introduction of additional signage including yield signs and bollards on Avondale Road to the north and south of the Dublin Bikes Station.
- Removal of 5 bikes stands to reduce the length of the Dublin Bikes Station.
- Installation of entry treatment ramp on Great Western Square at the Great Western Square / Monck Place junction.
- Installation of entry treatment ramps on Monck Place at the Monck Place / Phibsborough Road junction.
- Installation of buildout with planting on the southern side of Monck Place at the Monck Place / Phibsborough Road junction.

 approval to proceed to construction.
- The likely impact of the project on the Central Area during the construction phase:

 Traffic restrictions will be implemented through the project route during a majority of the construction stage. The contractor is required to maintain a minimum of three lanes of traffic through the project corridor. It is possible that general traffic may be diverted away from the works area for a period of time. When these diversions are in place, inbound and outbound routes for buses, taxis, cyclists and footpath users will be maintained through the area, and local access will be facilitated at all times. The contractor when appointed, will be required to submit a detailed works programme and detailed temporary traffic management plans.
