
Community Development Matters in the Central Area:

North Inner City Area:

Wolfe Tone Place

New planters and trees have been installed at Wolfe Tone Place. The Community Section is working with local residents to ensure that the plants are maintained. East Wall Men's Shed are constructing two additional planters to complete this project.
