

Proposed Extinguishment of the Public Right of Way over the laneway known as Strong's Court, off Findlater Place, Dublin 1.

Proposal

A request to have the public right of way extinguished over the laneway know as Strong's Court off Findlater Place, Dublin 1 has been made. The reason for this extinguishment is to eliminate anti-social behaviour and dumping in the laneway. The extent of this proposed extinguishment is shown on the attached Drawing No R.M 37690.

The Central Area Committee, at its meeting on the 14th September 2021, agreed to initiate the statutory procedure to extinguish the public right of way over this laneway under the provisions of Section 73 of the Roads Act 1993.

Statutory

By public advertisement on the 1st October 2021, representations or objections were invited by the 12th November 2021. The site notice at this location was erected on the 1st October 2021.

No objections were received.

Service Check

A service check has been carried out and no service provider will need to alter the current services on or under the referred section of Strong's Court. Accessibilities arrangements, for such service providers, shall be made through the Central Area Office or those private customers that are engaged with that service provider(s).

Recommendation

I recommend that the extinguishment of the public right of way over the area shown on Drawing No. RM 37690 be approved by the City Council.

Resolution:

That We, the Lord Mayor and Members of Dublin City Council, being the Roads Authority for the City of Dublin and being of the opinion that the Public Right of Way over the laneway known as Strong's Court, off Findlater Place, Dublin 1 as shown on the attached Drawing RM 37690 is no longer required for public use, extinguish the public right of way in accordance with Section 73 of the Roads Act 1993.
