Litter Hotline/CRM

In the period 1^{st} January – 27^{th} January 2022, <u>318</u> incidents were reported via Litter Hotline/CRM for the Central Area.

In addition to the CRM incidents, the Public Domain crew carry out inspections of their assigned routes on a daily basis. They will collect any dumped bags/materials which is not reflected on the above figures.

The total tonnage of collected illegally dumped items by our 5 outdoor staff members was:

• **26 tonne** for 4th – 27th January 2022.

For reference, the average tonnage rests in or around 39-40 tonne most months. The reduced number this month is attributable to reduced staff numbers resulting in additional referrals to Waste Management.

Please note, last month an additional 1.21 tonne was collected after the January Area Committee report was submitted.



2021 Stats Review

A system was put in place in May of 2021 to closely record the tonnage the Public Domain crew brings in – in order to monitor productivity. The stats available for before May are not considered to be accurate so have been left off of the yearly analysis.


