Public Realm & Capital Programmes

Dolphin's Barn Interim Measures

New tree planting completed by Parks Service along Dolphin's Barn and entering into the canal. Rehabilitation of the planted areas along Dolphin's Barn Road will take place in coming weeks. Design is ongoing of new street furniture and a planted areas with the expectation to begin installing these schemes later in spring. Elements will include a mix of tree planters, seats, stone cubes.

Coombe Hospital

Transportation will shortly begin installing cycle lane separators to the front of the Hospital entrance to deter illegal parking on the footpaths. It is also proposed to install street furniture to the rear of the footpath to further deter this practice.

Blackpitts Landscaping Proposal

Currently tendering for delivery of this project.

Economic Development

The **Grow D8 Consortium** is a working group looking to improve opportunities for social enterprise in SWIC. One of the consortium's current objectives is to build partnerships with local enterprise centres and private enterprise to create a more supportive ecosystem for social enterprise in the area. This includes opportunities for mentoring and practical supports and trading relationships.

The **Smart D8** smart city district is expanding to partner with ADAPT Research Institute in TCD. ADAPT will take on the currently vacant project manager role for Smart D8 to allow the initiative to complete its initial 2 year programme and extend and develop the initiative beyond 2022. Two Smart D8 pilots are currently active: Civic Dollars, the community currency supporting activity and use of the area's parks; and Heart of the City D8, a heart health programme run with Irish Heart Foundation & Novartis Ireland. Heart of the City is currently undertaking free clinics in the community.

Culture Date With Dublin 8

CDWD8 is a festival funded and supported by the Area Office that encourages locals and visitors to engage with cultural attractions and national institutions based in Dublin 8. The 2022 festival will run on 14th & 15th May. A launch of the festival programme will occur in April. The initiative will also be launching a new Cultural Map of Dublin 8 and a new Attractions Passport.

The Weavers Return

The Liberties Weavers have finally returned to the Timber Yard in Cork Street. After almost two years of Covid restrictions and social distancing the clickety clack of the weavers looms will once again be heard here in the heart of the Liberties and rightly so as this is where the story of the Liberties Weavers began.

It's been four years now since this diverse group of people came together with a view to reviving the ancient craft of weaving. (An initiative of Artist Marja Almqvist, Cathy Scuffil, DCC's Community Staff and CDETB).

Collectively the weavers share a wide range of hand skills including wood turning, sewing, crochet, silversmithing, pottery, knitting and weaving. Throughout the pandemic this group continued their crafting through zoom workshops, they also met for a short spell in an old church in Rathmines but it didn't feel like the right place for a Liberties Weaver. A big Welcome Back!

Native Tree project for the Tenters

Over four hundred fliers have been delivered to homes in the Tenters offering native trees and shrubs to those with suitable gardens.

This is an initiative of the Community Section and the Tenters Centenary Committee. It's a lovely way to mark 100 years of Living in the Fair Brother's Fields Housing Scheme. It will also be most beneficial to local bird life and pollinating insects.



International Women's Day

An International Women's Day event will take place in St Andrews Community Centre Rialto. Afternoon Tea will be served with musical entertainment.

The Dublin City Council Trishaw initiative took place in Rialto Village recently. Service users from St Andrews Day Care Centre were treated to a Trishaw Ride along the banks of the Grand Canal. This brought a smile to lots of faces throughout the Village on the day with shop keepers and pedestrians waving as the Trishaws went past. Training for volunteer Trishaw Pilots will take place on 29th 30th 31st March at the National War Memorial Gardens. Inchicore Village Improvements

Bus Connects proposed Route 7 Liffey Valley to City Centre will through Inchicore Village via Sarsfield Road/ Grattan Crescent and then along Emmet Road. The plan will impact on traffic directional flow, cycle lanes and footpaths. Final preliminary designs are under consideration at the moment, then an update will be released before planning application to An Bord Pleanala. Grattan Crescent Playground Upgrade

The playground at Grattan Crescent Park will be upgraded, this work will be carried out in Spring 2022. DCC Play Officer will engage in a consultation with local schools with regard to the upgrade works.

Liffey Gaels/ East Timor Park Master Plan:

Alastair Ferrar, Cunnane Stratton Reynolds Consultants is carrying out a Master Plan for Liffey Gaels Park on behalf of DCC. Alastair met with local stakeholders in January 2022 and continues designing a Master Plan for the space including access points to the Park.

<u>Grand Canal - Activation and Animation of Grand Canal between Portobello and Kylemore Road:</u>

Irish Leisure Consultants (ILC) have been asked by Dublin City Council and Waterways Ireland to identify the potential recreational Activation and Animation measures along the Grand Canal between Portobello and the Kylemore bridge. They have consulted with local organisations, individuals and agencies regarding the current and potential future recreational use of the canal, and from this are in the process of identifying appropriate approaches and best practice. It is expected that the study will take 4 months to complete

Public Domain

Public domain deep cleaning this month at selected Rialto streets and in Bulfin Estate. The main city routes have been deep cleaned and stickers removed from street furniture. Deep cleaned planned for Merchants Quay. Graffiti removal at following locations: Basin Street, Basin Lane, Cornmarket, Watling Street, CIE Works, Grattan Crescent, Kilmainham Gaol. Dublin City Council is working with IEG on parking enforcement, illegal dumping awareness and enforcement campaign, public realm / street furniture defects and graffiti in Inchicore Village. "Don't Be a Waster a" Dublin City Council campaign launched this month to highlight increasing illegal dumping in the vicinity of Bring Banks. *The public are reminded that any recyclable goods deposited in the vicinity of a Bring Bank will not be recycled and is considered illegal dumping attracting a possible €150 fine.* The Grattan Crescent Bring Bank has been included in the Poster Campaign.

Housing

Cornamona

Works are ongoing, the completion date has been delayed due to Covid restrictions. Delivery of the units is likely to be late Q.2 or early Q.3.

Springvale

Work is advancing, units are due for completion in Q3 after delays due to Covid restrictions.

Canal Bridge Apartments Kylemore Road /Bluebell

The New apartments are due in Q1/early Q2 and will be managed by Respond Housing Association. The apartments will be advertised and let through Choice Base Lettings. The Scheme consists of 12 one Bedrooms units, 32 two Bedroom units and 8 Three Bedroom Units. The name of the scheme is Canal Bridge, Bluebell Avenue, Dublin 12.

Drimnagh

Lissadel Maisonettes

Meetings are continuing with the residents group. A survey was carried out of the sewer system looking for any breakages. A contractor is on site fitting out the remaining voids for allocation.

Davitt House

A number of units have recently been reallocated under the Choice Based Letting Scheme. Work is continuing on the remaining units.

Community Development Report

The Community Development report is divided under three themes; Community Participation, Environment and Social inclusion.



Community Participation

Community Activities Fund (CAF)

The Department of Rural and Community Development, through Dublin City Council and the Dublin City Local Community Development Committee is funding a community activities fund. The aim of the fund is to support nonprofit community based and/or voluntary sector organisations or groups who are seeking support with meeting capital costs and/or operating running costs, excluding salaries.

Applications should demonstrate how their proposal works in partnership with communities to promote social inclusion, tackle poverty and promote participation, empowerment and social change.

A fund of €427,358 is available under this fund.

Cherry Blossoms:

The City Council, working through the Cherry Orchard Response Group, has taken the lead in coordinating a month long series of events that celebrates all that is good in Cherry Orchard. All local community groups, community facilities and services are being encouraged to open their buildings and organise free events during April that showcase their services and encourage residents to get involved. We hope to have over 30 events take place during the month of April.

The Cherry Blossoms Project will be launched by the Lord Mayor on Wednesday March 23rd at 2:00PM in the Equine Centre. The programme of events will be distributed to every house in the area and promoted throughout the area.

Ballyfermot /Cherry Orchard Festival:

The Festival held a very successful public meeting to set up the committee for the 2022 Festival.

The Festival will run from June 24th until July 10th. From this year it will become the Ballyfermot / Cherry Orchard Festival celebrating the entire community. The Council will support the Festival with funding and organising events including: Dog shows, Opera in the Park and Family fun days for Markievicz Park and Cherry Orchard.

Walkinstown Festival

The City Council has established a Walkinstown Festival Committee which is made up of local residents, voluntary groups and sports clubs in Dublin 12. The event will be held over two days during the first weekend of September in various locations. The festival will promote local talent and Dublin City Council's facilities in the area. The next festival meeting will be held in the Walkinstown Library at 18:30 p.m. on Wednesday the 23th of March. The Council will work closely with the committee to ensure the success of the project.

Environment

The City Council continues to support the Environmental Groups in the Area. Key members from 12 Environmental Groups from across the area attended an Environmental Meeting in the Ballyfermot Civic Centre to plan how groups can enhance their efforts and support each other. Items discussed on the night included a presentation from the Blooming Crumlin project, Public Domain Officer and the Bio Diversity Officer.

The Council will promote the "Great Cherry Orchard Clean Up" which will be held on Saturday April 9th and the Team Dublin Clean Up scheduled for April 30th.

Orchard Centre March Report

On Friday 11th March the Cherry Orchard Development Group (CODG) will meet to reassess the Making Cherry Orchard Better Social Plan and bring forward a proposals document to all relevant bodies.

Orchard Community Centre

Centre Usage

The centre is now busier than ever catering for large numbers of the community from new borns to senior citizens.

Ladies Club

This group is now back up and running meeting every Wednesday from 6.30pm to 9.00pm.



New Youth Drama Group

This group is a new addition to the area of Cherry Orchard and had been based in Familibase during covid restrictions. They had been meeting young people on online for the last number of months but have now transitioned to meeting in the centre on Wednesday nights from 7.30pm to 9.00pm. Familibase are funding the group and have organised the Drama Teachers for the group. The centre will promote the group in the area and will help them take in new young people to expand the level of participation. It is hoped that the group continue to expand and put on shows in future.

Dublin Circus Project

This project has been with us since late 2019 and have grown in that time. We have supported them with grant applications as well as promoting the programmes they run and camps they have on during school breaks. They have grown during their time with us and are now well established in the Ballyfermot area as well as Cherry Orchard. They have also run a number of outdoor events in the area and have worked on various festivals run in the area as well as train up some local youth in circus activities.

Saint Ultans School

The centre has developed a strong relationship with the school and a new parent and child group has started on Tuesday afternoons. The group will have support workers from the school available to run after school activities with the children and parents. If successful it is anticipated that this service will grow.

Young Family Group

Our young family group/ Parents & Toddlers has grown since the last lockdown and the group now has over 30 people attending and participating in a number of different programmes. The group has linked in with the Dublin Circus Project for baby fun classes and the group has also had self-defence lessons.

Ballyfermot Adult Learning Together: This group started using the centre in February and organise adult learning courses every Wednesday morning.

Public Domain

The median and traffic islands on the Drimnagh Road were deep cleaned from Eleanora pub to Halfway house junction Sunday 6th March at the request of public domain. Public Domain has contacted the developer of the Blackhorse site at the junction of Tyrconnell Road and the canal regarding graffiti and general site maintenance. A meet and greet between environmental groups and Dublin City Council in the Ballyfermot Civic Centre has been very informative and will hopefully lead to greater collaboration regarding environmental projects and public realm works in the south central area.
