## Public Domain/Environmental Services Unit Report

### Litter Hotline/CRM

In the period  $1^{st} - 29^{th}$  April 2022, incidents were reported via Litter Hotline/CRM for the Central Area.

In addition to the CRM incidents, the Public Domain crew carry out inspections of their assigned routes on a daily basis. Collecting any dumped bags/materials which is not reflected on the above figures.

The total tonnage of collected illegally dumped items by our 5 outdoor staff members was:

• **31.68 tonne** for 1<sup>th</sup> – 31<sup>st</sup> April 2022. Total Tonnage for 2022: **134.4 tonne** 



### **Overtime**

Four Public Domain Staff members worked Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> April to tackle the anticipated illegal dumping after Good Friday. Approx. <u>5</u> tonne was removed from the Central area. This does not include any waste removed by Waste Management.

Overtime is scheduled for Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> May also due to Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> May being a bank holiday also.



### Community Clean-ups

Community Clean up equipment was distributed to <u>8</u> Community Groups / individuals between 1<sup>st</sup>–29<sup>th</sup> April. Requests for the removal of bags from community clean ups were handled by Waste Management and Public Domain staff.

### National Spring Clean

Public Domain staff have been busy delivering materials to groups and individuals who have signed up for this year's An Taisce National Spring Clean. Spring cleans are encouraged to take place over the month of May. 39 individuals signed up to take part with equipment being delivered. The Team Dublin Clean Up day takes place this Saturday, 30<sup>th</sup> April.

### **Dublin Canvas**

Callout for Submissions on Dublin Canvas for Summer 2022 is now live. 15 Locations have been chosen within the Central Area. The painting will begin in early summer.

### Weeding Program 2022

### **Foamstream**

Road maintenance have allocated the Central Area with the same 46km of roads to be treated with foam stream (23km per office). This represents just under 25% of roads under



our remit. This will strictly be linier concrete/asphalt roads as paving is considerably more expensive. A list of streets has been issued to the contractor and can be distributed to councillors if required.

### Trial

A trail of a new strimmer type weed removal will be commencing imminently. The Central Area have allocated two blocks (15km) to be included. The findings of the trial will be assessed to establish if it is more cost effective resulting in additional coverage.

- Cabra: Ashington/Kinvara/Glendhu block.
- NIC: East Wall

### Additional 10k

Road maintenance have also provided €10k to be spent by the Area Office at our discretion. This could be additional foamstream (approx. 10 kilometres), direct overtime for scutching or depending on the outcome of the trial, the new strimming option. Councillors will be updated on this at a later date. We would hope that the streets included in this will be in response to Councillor and public representations.

Both Foamstream and the trial will commence in the Central area in early May.
