- ➤ GDA transport strategy consultation open until 17th December all members encouraged to make submissions.
- Requests to repeat the Halloweens cycle in Sandymount (3-4,000 participants families and kids) for Christmas. AGS were a great support at the Halloween Event.

MF suggested bike lights given to Deliveroo cyclists as part of Light up Your Bike campaign.

Michael Ahearn, National Transport Authority

- > GDA draft transport strategy open to consultation
  - Includes extensive section on proposed cycle network. How well does cycle network serves local areas? In some locations it may reduce access.
  - Gradient check adjusted
  - O Supporting documents include Crossings and severances bridges etc. -
  - Re-opening short cuts and filtered permeability dialogue needs to take place - concerns about anti-social behaviour - can design elements retain advantage of shortcuts but prevent antisocial behaviour?
- ➤ Open city runs from 1st 24th December presence of Gardaí in the city for this. First meeting was held before Government announcement about working from home plan is fluid but intention is to go ahead. Decision to be made by NTA on whether late night PT services are required.
- > 5 day stay at home if close contact is a concern for drivers of public transport
- NTA working on National Cycle Manual key issue to get consistency across all documents. Stakeholder consultation ongoing with draft due by the end of the year.
- Michael's role has changed slightly. He is not over standards and cycling manual. Research, sustainability and climate change into new role. He will remain as the NTA representative on this committee for now.
- > Joe Seymour as new head on investment on Active Travel.
- The NTA currently have no legal mechanism to trial things, but it's being looked at. Expect DCC to be a leader trials.

Travel loops for leisure trips and commuting trips are gaining popularity- NTA priorities are changing on leisure trips and further conversation on this would be welcome. This should inform the draft transport strategy.

JH asked if gradients check would take into account the growth in e-bikes and e-scooters. MA: concerns in regards to accidents and fatalities with e-bikes especially for older adults (statistics from the Netherlands). Issues to be resolved. Need for drivers to become more aware of e-bikes on the road.

### Naomi Oldenburg, National Disability Authority

- Mary Tallant is on leave, they are looking for a replacement. Naomi standing in as NDA representative on Walking & Cycling Sub-Committee.
- Reporting on part 3 of the Public Disability Act due to be published in early 2022.
- App development to allow users to rate their experience with transport providers
- > Transport strategy looking at that and linking in with NTA.

### Gary Kearney, PPN

- > Clarification required about the difference between e-bikes and pedalex.
- Research from Vienna showing that e-scooters are replace walking and PT journeys.
- > All presentations circulated should have alt text and maps available in full size.
- ➤ Delighted to hear about lighting up campaign New York brought in regulations for delivery cyclists potential to replicate in Dublin

# Councillor Larry O'Toole

- > Speeds on e-bikes should be limited
- Awareness campaign required for new e-bike users both in terms of cycling and in rules of the road.
