Docklands Forum Volunteer Day

The 12th Docklands Volunteer Day was held on Friday 13th May. The event returned with a post covid bang as record numbers turned out north and south of the Liffey. Over 150 people participated in the event during the day.

Teams gathered at the Convention Centre Dublin (CCD) on North Wall Quay for Breakfast, safety talk and distribution/ collection of equipment supplied by DCC

Team one removed flotsam from the Royal Canal at the Luke Kelly statue.

A second north side team went to the Séan O'Casey Community Centre to clean and weed the back of the centre's playing courts and patio.

And a third north side team removed graffiti and stickers along North Wall Quay and Custom House Quay.





Docklands Cup

The Docklands Cup soccer competition was organised by the Area Office in conjunction with Sherriff YC, Northwall CDP and the Docklands Forum. Eight teams took park in the competition with a team each from DCC, Sherriff YC and NWCDP. The festival has been organised by the Area Office with funding from the NEIC.


The event includes a 9 hour programme of music over two stages. It will also include children's entertainment and a visit by the Sensory Bus.

Super Soul Sunday is back with an even bigger stage and even more choirs in Mountjoy Square, Dublin's North East Inner City Georgian park from 12.30 to 6pm, Sunday 19th June. This outdoor concert is free to all and will feature live performances from some of Ireland's best, upbeat and gospel style choirs. There will also be a performance from the Forget Me Nots choir, an inclusive, fun choir that unites older people and those affected by dementia with caregiver family and friends as part of the festival's Dementia friendly focus this year. Food trucks, children's entertainment, picnic tables & necessary facilities are all available in the park for the festival. This event is organised by the Area Office with funding from the NEIC.



Community Grants 2022

On an annual basis Dublin City Council provides support through once-off local and citywide grants to a range of resident, community, environmental and festival groups throughout the city with a particular emphasis on community development and social inclusion. Due to the impact of COVID 19 this function was disrupted for the years 2020 and 2021.

In order to provide a more user friendly and efficient process an online portal for the local area grants scheme has been developed to allow for an online application process which. Applications for adult Education grants will also be available via the Local Area Community Grants 2022 online portal.

The Tom Clarke Fund will be administered by a paper based application process that will be administered in a similar time frame.
