NORTH EAST INNER CITY PROGRAMME OFFICE REPORT

To the Chair and Members of the Central Area Committee

Funding proposals totaling €270,400 was approved by the NEIC Programme Implementation Board at its meeting held on 23rd May 2022 bringing the total approved to €5.6M of the €7.5M 2022 NEIC funding allocation. The full list of 2022 funded projects approved to date are listed under the relevant Sub-Group heading on the attached table **Appendix 1**. The table will be updated on an ongoing basis as further funding proposals are approved. The projects approved at the May Board Meeting are as follows:

Sub-Group 2 – Maximising Educational, Training & Employment Opportunities

Inner City Renewal Group (ICRG) - €15,000

Funding has been approved for the provision of a training bursary for young people to support specific training for young people. The funding is expected to reduce barriers and to enable low-income young people to access innovative and creative education and training programmes, which would not be otherwise available. It will support young people entering the workforce with essential tools and work clothing to enter the labour market.

This is the 5th year applying for the fund. The 4th year has been very successful and in the past year the fund supported young people and facilitated a wide variety of opportunities in a variety of fields including: Social Care, Screen Acting, Advanced Beauty and Design and Technology & Innovation.

Sub - Group 3 - Family Wellbeing

Crosscare - Ballybough After School Services (BASS) & Ballybough Youth Services (BYS) - €110,000

Crosscare manages Ballybough After School Service (BASS) & Ballybough Youth Service (BYS). Crosscare supports several voluntary clubs in the area for example Courtney Place with a full time dedicated volunteer co-ordinator, the volunteers support the work of Ballybough Youth Service by volunteering at family fun days during the summer for the community.

The funding commitment from PIB will continue to provide an afterschool service for 7 - 10 year olds in Ballybough. In BASS, youth workers provide young people with the opportunity to engage in a fun, safe and welcoming environment through developmental, educational

and recreational activities that will help equip young people with the skills to reach their full potential.

Participants are encouraged to transfer over to Ballybough Youth Service once they turn 10 years of age. They explore new experiences by taking part in day trips & activities organised by the service. A committee is developed to ensure young people that are actively involved in the project have a voice in the decision making & development of the project.

Sub Group 4 – Enhancing Community Wellbeing and the Physical Environment

St Laurence O'Toole School Environs - €70,000

Staff from Public Realm, DCC Parks & Landscape Services North Central Area Office and City Architects have developed a proposal for the upgrade of the Environs & extension of play space at St Laurence O'Toole School.

The school has re-opened in its original home at St Laurence St East in April 2022. Funding has been approved to complete a full set of drawings for a proposed new playground & to carry out footpath improvements.

Community Archive Budget Proposal Phase 1- €6,000

A Community Archive for the community of Dublin's North East Inner City is hoped to be developed. Funding has for Phase 1 of this project has been approved. The project aims to begin the process of setting up an Archive of primary and other sources relating to the history of community development in the NEIC and to organise the material so as to be easily accessible for the purposes of review and research.

Phase 1 needs to be completed to the satisfaction of Sub Group 4 prior to the continuation of funding for Phase 2 & Phase 3. The continuation of the project will need to be closely aligned with Dublin City Council Library Service

It is expected the Community Archive outcomes will be of benefit for the whole NEIC community and increase the understanding of the history of the NEIC and the development of pride in the area.

Killarney Court- Refurbishment - €39,811

Killarney Court housing complex was renovated in 2002. This housing complex hosts a community hall which has high volume of usage from the NEIC local community and residents' groups.

The Community Hall needs an upgrade to maximise its usage, this includes replacing the kitchen and flooring, lighting upgrade and the installation of acoustic panels to ensure usage of the hall for all of the NEIC.

On completion of the internal works there will be a launch event to open the facility to the wider community, which the hall manager/ housing officer will work closely with the Clúid Communications Department to promote. A booking option will feature on the Clúid website

with details of the booking system. The hall will also have its own dedicated Facebook & Instagram page to provide information on events to the community.

NEIC Intercultural Development Budget - Total €30,000

The NEIC Intercultural Coordinator role was established following the 'Securing Roots' report which highlighted key challenges in relation to integrating minority ethnic people into local community services in the NEIC.

The current proposal for Intercultural Development in the NEIC includes the further development of the Intercultural Ambassador Programme, the programme was launched in June 2021 and an evaluation to review the programme & to identify If it is assisting in breaking down the barriers to integration in the NEIC is planned.

Funding will be allocated for the development and provision of Intercultural training for service providers and staff members within the NEIC. Funding will also ensure the further development of capacity building for minority ethnic groups & clubs to meet the needs for of the vast numbers of new Irish residing in the NEIC.

Intercultural events and activities will continue in 2022 with NEIC involvement in the NEIC been involved in additional activities including Africa Day in May.

Change 4 Life Programme

The Change 4 Life Programme is currently live with activities for adults 6 days a week. The primary goal of the programme is to activate adults back into physical activity. The programme in the North East Inner City has an inter-agency approach with a large number of local organisations involved in the delivery of activities in the area. Activities such as Ex Well Medical Physical Activity Class, Tai- Chi through to Tapeball Cricket, mini - marathon training and Self Defence Classes are on offer.





Football

A primary school soccer blitz will take place on the 13th June at Stella Maris Football Club. The event is being facilitated by the Football in the Community Officer and SARI.

A host of local organisations partook in the inaugural North Wall Cup which saw a number of Docklands Organisations play a 5 aside football tournament with local community participation. The event was supported by Dublin City Council's Sport and Wellbeing Programme, Recreation Services Community Section; the NEIC, the FAI, North Wall CDP, An Garda Síochana and the Dublin Docklands Business Forum.
