NORTH EAST INNER CITY PROGRAMME OFFICE REPORT

To the Chair and Members of the Central Area Committee

Funding proposals totalling €166,727 were approved by the NEIC Programme Implementation Board at its meeting held on 29th June 2022 bringing the total approved to €5.75M of the €7.5M 2022 NEIC funding allocation. The full list of 2022 funded projects approved to date are listed under the relevant Sub-Group heading on the attached table **Appendix 1**. The table will be updated on an ongoing basis as further funding proposals are approved. The projects approved at the June Board Meeting are as follows:

Sub-Group 1 – Enhance policing services in the community to reduce crime

The Bridge Project €2,821.50 (Emerging Needs)

An interagency project The Bridge Project has been awarded funding to run a programme with up to twenty five young people from the NEIC catchment area. This programme aims to work collaboratively with the local schools, Gardaí and Talk About Youth Project, St. Andrews to create a working group between young people aged between 12-17 years of age, who are known to the agencies, and are involved in local feuding. The young people are from both the south and north inner city.

The aim of the project is to reduce the number of planned fights between North & South inner city, to target young people to build respect for each other and their communities & to develop awareness of the dangers associated with feuding.

Sub-Group 2 – Maximising Educational, Training & Employment Opportunities

St Vincent's Infant Boy's School Arts & Wellbeing Room €10,100 (Emerging Needs)

An arts & wellbeing room to be accessed by students, families and staff at St Vincent's Primary School, for primarily arts & wellbeing but can be accessed by families in the local community for various activities. The school have been awarded an Amber Flag for Wellbeing in 2021 and the school hope to promote health & wellness programmes for the benefit of the community.

O'Connell School Art Therapy Room €6,050 (Emerging Needs)

Funding has been awarded to create a dedicated art therapy room for children & families in the NEIC who can work with a qualified art therapist. The room will offer families to engage with art therapy up to three times a week after school free of charge. The space will have additional usage for the school counsellor, school completion programme & Ballybough Youth Service.

Rutland National School National School Nurture Room €5,100 (Emerging Needs)

Funding to fit out the current nurture room has been awarded to Rutland National School to improve the existing resource by improving the school nurture room by adding a sink, a hob & kitchen cabinets.

The expectation will be for 20 children in the school community to be reached daily over four 60 minute sessions. The room has potential to be utilised by all in the community for additional classes including cookery classes.

Gardiner Street Primary School Dual Language Books €10,437.44 (Emerging Needs)

Funding has been approved to purchase a number of dual language books covering many different languages including, Romanian, Polish, Chinese & Ukrainian as spoken by children in Gardiner Street primary school.

The school has experience in running a parent/child lending scheme and has noted an increase in demand for these books. The expectation is for increased parental activity and involvement from parents in their children's schooling.

Mount Carmel Mural and Rooftop Garden €2,700 (Emerging Needs)

A project to transform a roof top space into an urban garden where students can relax and get involved in growing their own vegetables. The garden would create a space for students with special educational needs such as autism to use as a sensory garden.

It may be used as a calming place and as a gentle way to stimulate the senses. This type of environment can become a place where children with autism and other sensory processing disorders feel safe and comfortable in exploring their senses without feeling overwhelmed by them.

Childcare Continuous Professional Development Bursary €39,300

Continuation of a funding to support existing Childcare workers in Community Childcare Projects located in the NEIC, who have a minimum level 6 qualifications to progress to Level 7 or level 8 in Early Childhood Education has been awarded.

This monies will allow individuals to process to the next level thus benefitting themselves & the community in the provision of improved childcare services in the NEIC.

Sub - Group 3 - Family Wellbeing

Refurbishment of Belvedere Youth Facility in Wexford €27,500 (Emerging Needs)

Belvedere Youth Service, Dublin 1, have developed relationship with The Wexford Centre & has explored potential opportunities to open the house for respite purposes for the community of the NEIC, however there may be some initial capital investment to ensure the facility meets health & safety standards in terms of using the house for respite for families.

BYC have recognized families are under severe pressure in relation to an increase in drug intimidation, gang intimidation, poverty, unemployment and mental health related issues. Funding has been awarded to allow both parties to work together to extend a respite service for families in the NEIC.

Sub Group 4 – Enhancing Community Wellbeing and the Physical Environment

Swan Youth Services €2,661.211 (Emerging Needs)

Funding to improve the external area of Spencer Dock premises in North Wall. The outside of the premises requires resurfacing. Improvements to the layout of the area will allow for greater space for young people to play games outside, while also keeping some of our plants so that there is some greenery in the area.

The Cavan Centre €6,491.36 (Emerging Needs)

The Cavan Centre is a residential unit in Cavan, in the surrounds of Lough Sheelin & Mullaghammen Forest.

The service is accessed by various groups in the NEIC at a nominal fee. A contribution of funding of € 6,491.36, was allocated to carry out upgrade works to the interior & exterior of their premises. The work will be carried out by Community Employment participants who are currently employed on site.

Project Worker to assist NEIC Community Arts Coordinator implement the 'Try It Out' Programme €6,000 (Emerging Needs)

The NEIC Community Arts Co-ordinator has developed the Try it Out Programme- an introductory arts programme for schools, after schools, community groups and youth groups in the NEIC. The programme has been delivered over the last 6 months with 28 different programmes to over 300 participant targeting all age groups from 6-60 through the medium of the Arts.

Positive feedback was received by the Community Arts Co-ordinator to the of Try it Out Programme. The administrative workload was top heavy and the co-ordinator was not able to attend all the workshops, this makes it challenging to identify and evaluate all of the programme's many outcomes.

Sub Group 6 – Alignment of Services

The HAY Project Technology Hub €20,000 (Emerging Needs)

Funding to create a state of the art technology digital HUB in the NEIC has been allocated. The digital HUB would enable the service to reach a wider audience and deliver multimedia & technology to all young people regardless of their need. This will enhance their employability skills.

HAY Project Space for 8 to 11 year olds €5,464.00 (Emerging Needs)

A purposely developed space for a chill out zone for 8-11 year olds to allow1;1 social engagement for this age group in a decreased sensory capacity.

A fully functional space that is parent friendly & separate from the young people space.

SWAN Youth Service Proposed Additional Youth Work Provision Summer Activities €13,436.

SWAN Youth Service with additional resources listed below can provide a full day of youth work provision on Saturdays across the months of July and August. This would include an outing for a group of 15 young people and 2 youth workers outside of the area followed by a late evening drop in for secondary aged young people aged 13 years+. The target group would be agreed with CDYSB and identified as needing additional supports and structure during the summer period.
