# **Dublin City – Connecting all the People**

Dublin City Council is developing a safer, inclusive and sustainable walk-wheel-cycle network.

This will enhance quality of life by improving access, connectivity and sustainable mobility for all, whilst reducing transport-related carbon emissions.

# **Strategy**

### **Dublin City Core Active Travel Network**

Total planned DCC network of 470km in the Greater Dublin Area Cycle Network Plan


Minimum required for a connected city is 310km

#### Of which:

- 10km (high quality) is complete
- 90km will be delivered by Busconnects
- 210km will be delivered by the Active Travel Programme Office

This 210km consists of 80 NTA-funded projects across the network










## **Public Value to the City**

Outcomes - 95% of people coming within 400 metres of the 310km network

# Strategy for the South East Area

Core Network - Christopher K. Manzira, Deputy Director for Active Travel Programme


Minimum network for SE Area to achieve a connected city is 91 km

#### Of which:

- 3 km (high quality) is complete
- 33 km will be delivered by Busconnects
- 55km will be delivered by the Active Travel Programme Office

This 55km consists of 37 projects, all funded by the National Transport Authority










### **Public Value to the Area**


