

# Director of Services Report South Central Area Committee Meeting 15<sup>th</sup> June 2022

## SOUTH WEST INNER CITY ELECTORAL AREA

## **Public Realm & Capital Programmes**

**Francis Street** Environmental Improvement Scheme works continue albeit behind schedule. This delay is attributed to the lack of skilled labour available to the contractor. It is proposed to introduce an additional paving team and begin paving work at the north end of the street in coming weeks to claw back some of the programme. The project will complete in Q4/22.

The provision of a crossing point/s at **Bridgefoot Street** has been referred to the Active Travel Unit given these will tie in with the design of the proposed Grangegorman to Thomas Street cycle route. The median planting scheme on Bridgefoot Street can be amended to facilitate crossings when location and design is agreed.

A series of footpath repairs and relaying was recently completed at **Inchicore** (Emmet Road and Tyrconnell Roads) to maintain the quality of the village. An audit of street furniture has been requested from the Traffic Section with the objective to reduce street clutter.

Work will commence at the end of June on a landscaping scheme for the Cork Street-end of **Donore Avenue**. The scheme will include provision of a seat and a small planted area to the rear of the footpath. The measure should address illegal parking at this location.

Design work is ongoing for a proposed landscaping scheme at **Blackpitts** on foot of a Road Safety Audit. It is hoped to bring a final scheme to tender later this year.

Measures to enhance **Dolphin's Barn** are ongoing including current rehabilitation of planting of the linear parklet. A tender call for new street furniture and a planted area near the Coombe Hospital will be made shortly.

# Tyrone Place D8. Regeneration.

A review of the development options for the regeneration of Tyrone Place is currently being undertaken by Housing Management, the Local Area Office and City Architects. All are cognisant that redevelopment options will need to take into consideration the large social and cost rental housing scheme that is planned for the adjacent site at Emmet Road.

## School Street.

DCC received Stage 1 approval from the DHLGH for the regeneration of School Street and Thomas Court Bawn with a number of queries. These queries have now been replied to and submitted to the D.H.L.G.H. Upon approval, the commencement of the procurement of an integrated design team for the redevelopment project will begin.

## Oliver Bond Regeneration.

DCC have received Stage 1 project approval from the DHLGH for the first phase of the regeneration of Oliver Bond, which is for the redevelopment of Blocks L, M and N. We also received funding for a Community Development Worker to be appointed to the Oliver Bond regeneration project.

DCC City Architects and Housing Regeneration staff are currently reviewing queries received as part of our Stage 1 project approval to seek project budget approval.

# **Dolphin House Regeneration Masterplan Dublin 8.**

The Dolphin House Regeneration Masterplan approved on the 4<sup>th</sup> Feb 2021 by the DH Regeneration Board. DCC will progress the masterplan in conjunction with the Dolphin House Regeneration Board and the Dolphin House Community. Dolphin 1B.

Stage 1 project and funding approval has been received for the construction of approximately 25 new homes.

Design development is progressing and community consultation on the proposals are proposed to take place shortly.

It is anticipated to start the Part 8 process in early Q4 2022



# **Donore Avenue-(former Saint Teresa's Gardens)**

This project will provide for the delivery of approximately 543 homes in a collaboration between Dublin City Council and the Land Development Agency, under a working title 'Donore Project'

28% of the homes provided will be for social housing and 72% for cost rental housing. The breakdown of the social homes include:

41% 1 bed which 50% will be available for Older Person Accommodation

48% 2bed

11% 3 Bed

There is ongoing public consultation with local elected representatives, S.T.G. Regeneration Board and neighbours

A Part 10 planning application is due for lodgement late Q2 2022

# Vincent St West Lighting Upgrade

Upgrade works on street lighting has been completed along Vincent Street West. This follows community request for increased lighting along the road.

# KIN Strategic Planning Process

KIN is over 5 years in existence and reviewing, evaluating and planning for the future. This strategic process will be ongoing for the next few months. As part of this process a booklet is being prepared for circulation to local households outlining the work of KIN, encouraging greater engagement in planning and attending events. Information will be shared on developments, organisations and services in our area.

#### Liffey Gaels/ East Timor Park Master Plan:

Alastair Ferrar, Cunnane Stratton Reynolds Consultant has almost competed a Master Plan for Liffey Gaels Park on behalf of DCC.

# <u>Grand Canal - Activation and Animation of Grand Canal between Portobello and Kylemore</u> Road:

Irish Leisure Consultants (ILC) have been asked by Dublin City Council and Waterways Ireland to identify the potential recreational Activation and Animation measures along the Grand Canal between Portobello and the Kylemore Bridge. They have consulted with local organisations, individuals and agencies regarding the current and potential future recreational use of the canal, and from this are in the process of identifying appropriate approaches and best practice. A draft discussion document will be circulated shortly for public feedback.

# Multicultural Family Fun Event at Richmond Park 25<sup>th</sup> June 2022

DSCP, St Patrick's Athletic FC and DCC Community Development are working with in organising a Multicultural Family Fun Event at Richmond Park 25<sup>th</sup> June 2022 11am to 2pm, KIN is helping plan this event. An invitation to all cultures living in South Dublin is being circulated for a family fun day of events as well as sharing information about resources and events available locally.



# Fairs at Richmond Barracks

KIN, in partnership with DSCP and DCCCC, are organising 4 fairs at Richmond Barracks over the next year. The first fair of 2022 took place 28<sup>th</sup> /29<sup>th</sup> May, with a Recycle/Upcycle/Reuse theme, around 1800 people visited the fair over the weekend. KIN organised workshops and a panel discussion with an educational/ developmental learning aspect as well as encouraging local community engagement. Outreach and workshops in local National Schools took place in advance of the Fair. Planning for the next Fair – a Harvest Fair 24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> September 2022 - is now underway. KIN's emphasis is on workshops with community engagement and development. There will be further fairs for Christmas (November 2022) and a Spring Fair (February 2023).

# Samhain Stage Event, Halloween 2022

KIN and IRCF are beginning to plan for the Halloween community event taking place 31<sup>st</sup> October 2022. This is the first of a trilogy of events, post the successful pilot Samhain Stage event of 2021. Core Values, themes, scale, budget, outreach and different forms of research and development are being considered at present.

# Inchicore Regeneration Consultative Forum – meeting 27<sup>th</sup> June 2022 at 1pm

Phase Three of Emmet Road Public Consultation in Richmond Barracks is completed. The ERD project manager informed the IRCF that this was the last phase of public consultation before the planning application is lodged to An Bord Pleanala. The statutory public consultation as part of the planning process with ABP will follow. See <a href="www.emmetroad.ie">www.emmetroad.ie</a> for information.

#### Outdoor Exhibition/ Website:

Project architect's, Bucholz McEvoy, display of their design proposals at an outdoor exhibition is located on the green across from Richmond Barracks in St. Michael's Estate. This exhibition will evolve over time with new panels installed as the design progresses to completion for planning. The <a href="https://www.emmetroad.ie">www.emmetroad.ie</a> has been updated.

Core Youth Service have recently installed an Art Mural on the west side of the outdoor exhibition panels.

#### **IRCF Subcommittees:**

*Meanwhile Activities and Community Building Subcommittee (MACb)*– MACb.13 due to take place Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> June. This will discuss educational/developmental workshop options for the Harvest Fair at Richmond Barracks 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> May. Proposals with regard to youth meanwhile use of the former St Michael's Estate site was discussed with further work in progress. This is all part of the process to encourage community engagement and meanwhile activities, as well as building community leadership, capacity, and trust through shared experiences/memories.

#### Self Management of Community Facilities

Letter sent to DCC ERD PM and DCC SWIC Area Manager from IRCF and relevant stakeholders addressing next steps with regard to (a) DCC SCA invitation (15th Feb 2022) to consider leading out on management/ governance /future running of community facilities on ERD (b) feedback on Community Hub Concept Design (initial feedback as well as requirements in order to complete feedback).



# **Childcare in Lower Inchicore** – next meeting 16<sup>th</sup> June 2022

The DSCP Early Learning and Care Report, considering future childcare needs in lower Inchicore, will be presented at the DCC SCAC Meeting June 2022. All childcare providers in lower Inchicore area have engaged in the research process. Next steps and review of recommendations underway.

# A reflection on the experience and learning of Regeneration Boards / Forums in Dublin 8, 10 and 12

This event, hosted by stakeholders from Regeneration Boards/Forums and facilitated by CAN, took place 25th May 2022, F2 Centre, Rialto. This closed dialogue event brought together representatives of all stakeholders from 5 regeneration projects in the South Central Area – Dublin City Council tenants, community, residential and enterprise organisations, Dublin City Council senior personnel, elected representatives, statutory representatives from the Gardaí and HSE and Independent Chairs. There were representatives from the Housing SPC in attendance as well.

This is the start of a process. A shared learning event, through dialogue, reflected on the operation and processes of Regeneration Boards/Forums over many years. The outcome from the dialogue will be captured in a report by CAN. This will be circulated once completed. Overall the experience was positive with requests from participants for further engagement.

## **Public Domain**

19 Three Tiered Planters are in place at Cornmarket, Thomas Street, Dean Street, Sarsfield Road, Kilmainham, Inchicore and Rialto. Intensive Cleaning will take place on Market Street, Bellevue, Crane Street and Sugarhouse Lane over the next two weeks. Public Domain have completed deep clean on Cork Street, Donore Avenue, Margaret Kennedy Road, Eugene Street, Mountbrown, 40 steps to Cameron Square, Braithewaite Street., Pimlico Terrace, Poole Street.and John Street South. Public Domain will be in the SWIC again on Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> June to complete Gray Street, Reginald Street and South Brown Street. Dublin Canvas Project has begun with 8 traffic signal boxes assigned for art work in the City to include: Bridgefoot Street, Dean Street, St.Lukes Avenue, Patrick Street, Dolphins Barn, Emmet Road, Inchicore College, and Bulfin Road. 16 Clean-ups have been supported this month. Graffiti has been removed at Lambe Alley, St Augustine Street, Forbes Lane, Ushers Quay, Back Lane, Hanover Lane, and Vincent Street West.

#### **Sons of Divine Providence**

Council officials are developing a stage 2 application for the scheme while awaiting the feedback from DHLGH in relation to the stage 1 application.

# **Community Allotments**

The Bluebell and Chapelizod allotments are thriving, The City Council has supported the allotments committees by rotavating plots, clearing grass waste and overgrown communal areas. The Bluebell allotments committee is planning a harvest festival at the end of the summer and the Chapelizod committee was awarded a certificate from Technological University Dublin for its collaboration with the staff and students of the college. The Chapelizod Allotment Group plan to hold a series of talks during the summer on supporting bio diversity and pond life.

#### **Walkinstown Planters**

The City Council has delivered and installed twelve blue planters in various locations in Walkinstown. The Community Development Team consulted with the local residents associations and environmental groups to identify the best locations of the planters. The local businesses and residents will maintain the planters.

# **Ballyfermot Main Road**

400 Geraniums will be planted in the blue planters on the main Road to enhance the area with funding from the 2022 Discretionary funds.



# **Cherry Orchard**

# **Dublin Circus Project.**

The DCP are running a 6 week Sensory Circus programme for children with special needs through May & June. Spaces were limited and the programme was booked up within a couple of days. We hope to run more sessions like this as there is clearly a big demand for this type of service. This came about from the success of the young children and parent group discussions around running programmes like this. The Orchard Centre, Tusla and the DCP all worked together to bring about this initiative.

# Afterschool Football Coaching sessions.

These sessions began on the last Tuesday in May and all of the coaches are UEFA qualified and have worked with clubs such as Shamrock Rovers, Bohemians F.C. and St. Kevin's Boys F.C. The sessions are drop in and cost only €2.00 per one hour session and happen every Tuesday from 3.00 to 4.00 pm

# **Disability Action Collective.**

The Smashing Barriers Theatre Group, a disabled arts group, is currently rehearsing for its "What We Thought Was Good For Us" show in the centre every Thursday morning from 11.00 am-1.00 pm and will perform it in the centre at 12.00 pm on Thursday, 30th June.

# **Ballyfermot/Cherry Orchard Sisters Shed.**

This is a new group starting up in mid-June aimed at giving women in the area a meeting point where they can do various courses and make contact with other women to help create a welcoming place for women in the community to come together.

# **Public Domain**

25 Three Tiered Planters are in place at Bluebell, Ballyfermot Shops, Chapelizod Road, Drimnagh Road, Tyrconnell Road/Naas Road, Walkinstown Avenue and Road. The Weed Treatment programme is in progress and a combination of Foamstream & Acetic Acid – (Traffic Islands) is being used with some strimming in areas where spraying is not possible. The programme will take a number of weeks to complete. Strimming will take place at some locations to include Park West Avenue, Ballyfermot Road and Le Fanu Road. Ballyfermot Road shopping precinct intensive clean will take place over the coming weeks. Dublin Canvas Project -Traffic Signal Boxes at the following locations will have art work applied over the Summer: Walkinstown Avenue, Assumption School Walkinstown Green, Chapelizod Road - where Tristan will be portrayed to accompany last years most liked art work of Isolde Chapelizod Village, California Hills Le Fanu Road, St Michaels School Kylemore Road, Bluebell Road/Naas Road and Rafters Road. 22 Clean Ups have been supported by Public Domain this month. Drimnagh Festival Dog Show will take place on Sunday 12th June and will be promoted on South Central facebook page. Registration will take place at 10am Brickfield Park. Ballyfermot Dog Show will take place on Saturday 25th June in the Peoples's Park adjacent to the Ballyfermot Civic Centre with registration at 10am.
