

Motions to the Area Managers
Central Area Committee meeting
13th September 2022

Item 1

Motion in the name of Councillor Joe Costello

That the Central Area request the Area Manager to examine the excellent service provided in Paris by the Local Authority for the free collection of bulky waste with a view to introducing a similar service in Dublin.

Item 2

Motion in the name of Councillor Christy Burke

That the Central Area Committee agrees to thank Brother Kevin for the service he provided to people in need in Dublin for over 50 years. To ask the Lord Mayor to send Brother Kevin a thank you and best wishes letter also.

Item 3

Motion in the name of Councillor Nial Ring

That the Central Area Committee agrees to instruct the Area Manager to provide Councillors and local residents with a detailed report on how the decision was made to unilaterally change the incoming bus lane at North Strand to a full 24 hours, 7 days a week facility, while at the same time removing a motoring lane and preventing local residents from driving towards the city. The foregoing major restrictions and impositions on local residents in North Strand and Ballybough, as well as on private motorists, could have been alleviated/mitigated somewhat by a reduction in the bus lane times to rush hour only. However, for some reason which has been interpreted as a “don't care” attitude of DCC officials, the exact opposite was done and local residents want to know how and why these decisions were made without prior consultation with them.

Item 4

Motion in the name of Councillor Nial Ring

That the Central Area Committee agrees to consult with the residents of Hardwicke Street flats to ensure that an appropriate commemoration takes place in the complex to mark the 100th anniversary of the execution of Rory O'Connor by free state forces in December 2022.

Item 5

Motion in the name of Councillor Nial Ring

That the Central Area agrees to fully support the plans of Na Píobairí Uilleann to construct an extension of their premises at 15 Henrietta Street on the site adjacent to number 15 (where No.16 stood). As proposed by NPU, this extension would bring significant economic, cultural, educational, community and tourist benefits to the street as well as complementing the DCC run Townhouse Museum and the ongoing regeneration and revitalisation of the street.

Item 6

Motion in the name of Councillor Darcy Lonergan

That this Central Area Committee supports a pilot '2gocup'scheme in the Cabra/Glasnevin and Central Area through minor financial contribution and PR.

2GoCup is a deposit return scheme which is already active in Galway /Waterford and Laois through the assistance of other councils. It removes disposable cups from circulation, resulting in a positive impact on the environment, waste reduction and less cost for business.
