NORTH EAST INNER CITY PROGRAMME OFFICE REPORT

To the Chair and Members of the Central Area Committee

Funding proposals totaling $\leq 169,771$ were approved by the NEIC Programme Implementation Board at its meeting held on 25th of October 2022 bringing the total approved to $\leq 6.1M$ of the $\leq 7.5M$ 2022 NEIC funding allocation. The full list of 2022 funded projects approved to date are listed under the relevant Sub-Group heading on the attached table Appendix 1. The table will be updated on an ongoing basis as further funding proposals are approved. The projects approved at the October Board Meeting are as follows:

Sub – Group 2 – Maximising Education, Training & Employment Opportunities

JumpAGrade: - €20,000

Funding was agreed for 20 of the 40, JumpAGrade scholarships for children in schools in the NEIC. These scholarships include personal teacher / mentoring and a needs analysis of students to identify areas they are focusing on. The outcomes of the programme are expected to build students confidence and help students improve academically. Each programme is individually tailored with learning plans created based on individual needs. Participating students also gain access to a host of supports and wellbeing programmes

Educational Guidance Proposal 2022-2003: National College of Ireland – Early Learning Initiative - €50,000

Funding has been **agreed** to provide a career guidance support programme for second level students to promote educational engagement in the North East Inner City. The Educational Guidance programme has been developed to raise student's educational and career expectations. To enable students to develop the skills they will need to achieve their educational and career goals, such as teamwork skills, communication, problem-solving skills and research skills. To provide well-designed, high quality, ongoing professional development for teachers in project-based learning, To increase parental/guardian educational capital and promote their on-going involvement in their children's education & to promote educational engagement in the North East Inner City

English Speaking Sessions: National College of Ireland – Early Learning Initiative - €7,000

The ELI through the NCI provide young people who are learning English as an Additional Language (EAL) in the NEIC with additional opportunities to practice and improve their conversational English and thus increase their educational engagement and attainment. The programme is expected to raise student's education and career opportunities.

Afterschool Literacy Programme Proposal 2022-2023: National College of Ireland - Early Learning Initiative - €24,380

Funding has been awarded for an afterschool Literacy Programme to run across schools in the NEIC. The project will provide interventions to support children with literacy or social skills challenges. Its aim is to improve children's' literacy in a fun and Interactive manner through a balanced literacy frame working on the following ideas: writing, text comprehension, phonics, sight vocabulary, independent reading and fluency. A strong emphasis will be placed on parental engagement.

Sub- Group 6 Alignment of Services:

Additional Youth Service Provision - €22,206

Funding has been agreed to support Youth Services in the NEIC (Swan, Belvedere YC, LYCS and Ballybough YS) to enable them to extend their opening hours.

The 4 youth services will provide additional opening hours in their services in evenings and weekends

The Big Scream Launch 2022

The official launch of The Big Scream 2022 was held in Mountjoy Square Park on 27/10/22. Local schools in Fancy Dress were in attendance with some special guests.

The Sensory Bus was on hand for children with additional needs.



The Big Scream has been ongoing since the beginning of October with 31 screams of Halloween with 31 days of competitions, fun & giveaways. Culminating in a 2 day Carnival event in O'Connell's school.

NEIC Intercultural Development Co-Ordinator Report to Central Area Committee November 2022

Intercultural Inclusion Action Planning

Over the past two months, the Intercultural Development Coordinator has focused efforts on a scoping exercise to review current service delivery to minority ethnic people and identify gaps to be addressed in a three year Intercultural Inclusion Action Plan. 188 respondents completed the online surveys, 27 professionals in the area participated in online consultations and 26 community leaders participated in inperson action planning workshops.

The priority areas identified so far are:

- Capacity building for minority ethnic groups and leaders
- Development of Intercultural Training and Competency skills
- Clear information on policies, procedures and legislation
- Addressing racial discrimination
- Issues relating to minority ethnic young people
- Increasing representation of minority ethnic people among staff, community forum and representative bodies



Whether they are being used to sing a small child to sleep, or to remind us of the many commonalities that we share, lullabies provide us with opportunities to communicate and reflect in ways that are unique to ourselves and our culture.

Between December 2022 and March 2023 highly experienced Musician, Creative Practitioner and Early Years Arts specialist, Eamon Sweeney will engage with different cultural communities in the NEIC in a pilot project whose focus will be to work creatively with different cultural communities through music in the sharing and learning of lullabies from different cultures.
