Choice Based Lettings:

Our most recent round of Choice Based Lettings closed on Friday 14th October 2022. Units on offer consisted of two x 2 Bed Units, one at North Williams Street Flats, and one at Crinan Strand. There was a 100 expressions of interest in total for these units. Selections are been finalised and successful applicants will be notified in due course. There will be another round of Choice Based lettings advertised in the coming weeks. Units on offer will be circulated to the members.

CCTV Upgrade:

The first phase of our CCTV upgrade is now completed. CCTV is now centralised in a secure area. James Larkin House, St. Mary's Court, and Summerhill have been added to the centralised system. In total we have 17 sites centralised. The second phase of works will resume in the first quarter of 2023. This will include upgrading of old cameras and a number of sites will be identified for CCTV systems to be installed.



Bonfire Material:

Central Area Housing have been working in conjunction with Waste Management, An Garda Síochána, and other stakeholders in the NEIC in the detection of combustible materials used to build bonfires. Staff have patrolled the streets from the 22nd to 31st October, with Drones deployed on the 21st, and 26th to 28th. A significant amount of materials have been found, a final account of which, will be given in next month's report.

Brendan Behan Court:

The Landscaping of the perimeter hedging and plants of Brendan Behan Court has been completed.







Poole House Apartments, Poplar Row:

A special "showing day" was organized for potential new tenants at Poole House on Saturday 8th October. A Tenants Handbook, specific to the Complex, has been produced in conjunction with the management company, which outlines essential guidelines as well as information on recycling, fire safety, TV & broadband, etc. The property consists of 3x 3 bed, 19 x 2 bed, and 17 x 1 bed units. All units are fully furnished.



Railway Street.

The new development by Circle Housing on Railway Street has commenced. When completed it will provide 40+ apartment and duplex type units.

Sean O Casey/Summerhill

The Area Housing Manager, Project Estate Officer, LCSP, NEIC and our Community development team continue to engage with the residents of Sean O Casey and Summerhill. A recent letter highlighting the concerns in relation to the continuous dumping in the lane ways, incorporating preventive measures and outlining relevant phone numbers was issued to each household. As a result DCC have made a couple of house calls to those allegedly dumping waste into the lane way. The area office in consultation with the residents are working hard to improve the environs of the area and we are currently planning some events for Christmas.

Summer Street North:

A new decorative gate with mesh support has been erected on Summer Street North at the entrance to the community garden. The pathway, leading into the garden, has also been resurfaced.



Tom Clarke House:

The Perimeter Railings against the laneway at Orchard Road have been repaired and painted a dark green in-line with the surrounding environs. The ivy and other overgrowth has also been cut back.

Sean Foster Place

The assigned certifier met with the architects and the rest of the design team on Tuesday 25th October. There are a small number of items to be resolved e.g. some of the doors need to be adjusted where not fully closing and some doors have minor damage like cracked lipping / chipped leaf etc. Some compliance paper work has still to be completed including a new form from SEAI. Contractors have advised their aim to have items completes by Wednesday 2nd November. The assigned Certifier is engaging with Building Control regarding completion.

Dominic Street Lower

There is still no official handover date as yet. Building Control have 21 days from this date to register the building. Substantial completion should be 14th November

Constitution Hill

Housing Maintenance works continue on 16 voids in blocks 2 and 3. Residents and councillors came to view the design proposals for Constitution Hill. Very good feedback was received on the night by all. Members of the design team from Grafton Architects and Colleagues from DCC City Architects and Housing Regeneration were in attendance.

Blackhall Queen Street Complex

A DJ, Music and games will take place in the complex as part of Halloween Night festivities. Flyers to households and posters displayed in the complex were issued advertising events to residents.

Estate Management is liaising with the caretakers & residents regarding the upkeep of the complex.

Hardwicke Street

The painting of the fencing surrounding Hardwicke Street is now complete. A DJ, music and games will take place in the complex as part of Halloween Night festivities. Flyers to households and posters displayed in the complex were issued advertising events to residents. On-going discussions between Estate Management and Residents as issues arise.

Chancery House

Saint Michans House

The Nightmare Realm is taking place in the markets area at present. It has proven a big success in the area and has drawn much attention from visitors. A DJ, Music and games will take place in the complex as part of Halloween Night festivities. Flyers to households and posters displayed in the complex were issued advertising events to residents. Monthly meetings are on-going with members of the residents association to discuss all issues related to the complex.

Drumalee Estate/ Court

Kevin Barry House

Community Development Matters in the Central Area: North Inner City

The Ballybough Pride of Place:

This group has reached a mile stone of eighty clean-ups since they were set up.

The group has been successful in direct interventions as well as highlighting the theme of pride of place amongst other stake holders in the area.

Their clean up on the 22nd October was followed by a Pizza and Coffee lunch for participants.

In November, they will plant Spring bulbs around the area.



Dorset Street Planters:

The planter units on Dorset Street were given a refresh during the month of October with replacement plants installed along the route. The units are services regularly as part of an overall scheme of 60+ units.

The project is funded through the Councillors Discretionary Fund.



Sherrard St Pride of Place:

This group continue to make steady progress. They held a clean-up on Sunday 23rd October.

Twenty people from different cultural backgrounds living in the area attended the "Nightmare Realm" in the fruit and veg market as a reward for their continued efforts and to encourage closer cultural understanding and integration. This outing was an overwhelming success.

The Community Section assisted in the advance planning for the "Nightmare Realm" at the Fruit and Veg Markets. The section distributed six hundred complementary tickets to the local community.

The Big scream Festival @ NEIC

This is probably Dublin's Biggest Halloween Festival. It offers a month long program of arts workshops, online events and competitions that lead up to the main festival programme.

There are celebrations for older adults at Ballybough and Lourdes day care centre including afternoon tea and seniors "Dress up"

The two day Fun fair @ O'Connell's CBS attracted over four thousand five hundred people attended this event. A session for children with sensory needs was provided on both days.

Primary Schools from the North East Inner City took part in the Halloween Cat walk in Mountjoy Square Park on Thursday 27th October. Two hundred children attended this event.
