NORTH EAST INNER CITY PROGRAMME OFFICE REPORT

To the Chair and Members of the Central Area Committee

Funding proposals totaling €1,326,852.20 were approved by the NEIC Programme Implementation Board at its meeting held on 7th November 2022 bringing the total approved to €7.5M of the €7.5M 2022 NEIC funding allocation. The full list of 2022 funded projects approved to date are listed under the relevant Sub-Group heading on the attached table Appendix 1. The table will be updated on an ongoing basis as further funding proposals are approved. The projects approved at the November Board Meeting are as follows:

Sub- Group 4 – Enhancing Community Wellbeing & the Physical Environment

Charleville Mall Library - €70,000

Charleville Mall Library is a part of the Dublin City Public Libraries it was built in the early 20th century. The building is wheelchair accessible however it is in need of an upgrade internally.

A programme of works have been agreed to bring the Library up to current standards including the addition of accessible bathrooms on site.

A contribution of funding has been requested form the NEIC Programme Office to assist with making the Library a better space for all and to ensure higher usage of the Library space.

Hill Street Family Resource Centre Application for Planning Permission - €68,285

Hill Street Family Resource Centre is an Intercultural Centre for families and children based in Dublin's North East Inner City.

A request for a contribution towards the Planning Permission Application has been submitted the NEIC Programme.

It is hoped to develop the Hill Street Family Resource Centre into a state of the art Family Resource Centre in Dublin 1.

Hill Street Family Resource Centre Lunar Celebrations 2023 - €50,000.

Hill Street Family Resource Centre host an annual street family celebration for Lunar New Year. A request for a contribution to the 2023 Lunar Festival celebrations has been agreed by PIB. 2023 is the year of the Rabbit and will be celebrated on the 28th of January 2023. Staff and families have commenced the preparations. The event will host an array of family fun activities including Arts & Crafts, Tea Ceremony, Tai Chi, Chinese Cooking & traditional dancing.

North Circular - Movie launch €13,567.20

A contribution of funding is been sought to host a launch of the film North Circular – A Musical Trip Through Inner City Dublin.

Luke McManus a recipient of D-Light's NEIC funded Creative Residency Progamme in 2021 who filmed a documentary called "North Circular" which explored North Circular Road, its inhabitants, its culture, its history and contemporary streetscape.

Diamond Park redevelopment - €325,000

Diamond Park is a 0.7 hectare park was originally developed in 1985 but was later redesigned with the inclusion of a multi-sports pitch, children's play area and table tennis tables. There is a scattering of early mature tree planting within the park and pockets of grass lawn.

A contribution of €325,000 has been approved by the NEIC Taskforce to bring key elements of the new parks design to the project.

Rutland Street School Community HUB - €800,000

A tender process for the construction contract is underway. The Programme Implementation Board have been requested to make a contribution of €800,000 to bring the new community HUB to fruition. This flagship project will facilitate local youth and community services, community crèche, community garden, Dublin City Council Area Office enterprise space and more.

A Global Village Festival was organised by the North-East Inner City Intercultural Ambassadors on Sunday 20th of November 2022.

The festival was a successful culmination of cultural performances from around the globe. Comunidade Capoeira Ireland opened the event showcasing a live act of the Brazilian martial arts dance.

The event was introduced by Cllr Donna Cooney, the audience was left stunned by beautiful Irish music performed by Ceoltoiri Chluain Tarbh.

From the Irish incantation, viewers received a musical passion from Locanda, a Latin gypsy jazz band, Irish singer Ruby Moss and Flamenco harpist Pilar Paradela.

Further wonders of the first set include Nigerian spoken word artist Elizabeth Zion charming with her trilingual masterpiece "From Nylon We Become Gold" depicting the emotional journey of an immigrant coming to Ireland, and Venezuelan Roots inspiring us with their beautiful national costumes and dance.

The second set started off with Hill Street FRC Intercultural Community Theatre Group, who interpreted the migrant's journey into Irish society as a short theatre piece. The Parnell Band, originally from Turkey, got the audience up on their feet for an energetic jazz song.

Following the jazz, Cantonese in Ireland showed us the wonders of the Cantonese language with their singing. Brazilica introduced us to a lesser-known side of Brazilian music: relaxing Bossa Nova. Momma Needs Art came all the way from Cork to wow with an inspiring vocal and spoken piece.

Finally, Go Dance for Change lead the way to an intercultural break with finger food from some of the countries represented in the performances.

After a delicious tasting, Alma Boliviana wowed the crowd with their Bolivian folklore dance, which lead to Ethereal Danza Collective's lovely contemporary dance piece. Romane Chaja impressed the audience with their singing and dancing representing the Polish Roma community.

Greek musician and songwriter lordanis Sidiropoulus shared a traditional Sardinian piece and a self-written soulful Greek song before supporting Daniel Kamenyezi's spoken word performance with instrumental

bliss. Daniel's piece incorporated his Congolese heritage in a beautiful poem on his journey to Ireland. Finally, the evening was closed by Patrick Stefan whose song filled us with great joy and yearning for the travels that inspire his music. All in all, it was a magical event that brought the community together and introduced us to cultural gems we would not have encountered otherwise.

The feedback has been equally amazing from both artists and audience alike. The message below, received from one of the performing artists says it all!

Good morning Intercultural Ambassadors: This is a message I wanted to send directly after the night but I am sending it today as the feeling of the event is still alive in me. It is my absolute honour and pleasure to see you all and play for you, this is really where I belong and please accept my emotional feelings for all the effort you put into keeping the arts and human expression alive. It is not only that I am privileged to be a part of this and to know personally many of you nice people, but is what I truly and soulfully received from you that night which is rare.

Thank you for giving expression and soul a chance, and thank you for bringing all these acts and making an exceptional night. Thank you for all the kind words I received and all the moving feedback. I hope Ireland will continue to support such initiatives that give character, value and colour to our communities.
